

AN ORDINANCE ACCEPTING A CERTAIN BID FROM TRI MOR CONSTRUCTION COMPANY FOR THE 2010 RICHMOND ROAD WIDENING AND SOUTH WOODLAND RESURFACING PROJECT

WHEREAS, the City advertised and received bids for the 2010 Richmond Road Widening and South Woodland Resurfacing Project; and

WHEREAS, as part of the Project, the Maltz Museum of Jewish Heritage has requested and the City has agreed to include a left turn into and out of Richmond Road as part of the Project; and

WHEREAS, the Maltz Museum of Jewish Heritage's portion of the Project is known as the Museum Scope of Work; and

WHEREAS, the Museum Scope of Work is contingent upon the approval and execution of the Agreement between the City of Beachwood and the Maltz Museum of Jewish Heritage and a deposit of One Hundred Seventy-Five Thousand Dollars (\$175,000.00).

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Beachwood, County of Cuyahoga, and State of Ohio:

Section 1: Upon recommendation of the Staff Engineer, as set forth in his Memorandum to the Mayor dated April 14, 2010, which is attached hereto, the bid of Tri Mor Construction Company is found to be the lowest and best bid received for the 2010 Richmond Road Widening and South Woodland Resurfacing Project in the amount of Nine Hundred Thirty-Six Thousand Four Hundred and One Dollars and No/Cents (\$936,401.00), and the Mayor is therefore authorized to enter into a contract on behalf of the City of Beachwood with said company. The Maltz Museum Scope of Work is contingent upon the approval and execution of the Agreement between the City of Beachwood and the Maltz Museum of Jewish Heritage providing that the Museum will pay for the Museum Scope of Work, in an amount not to exceed Two Hundred Thousand Dollars and No/Cents (\$200,000.00), and a deposit by the Museum of One Hundred Seventy-Five Thousand Dollars (\$175,000.00).

Section 2: It is found and determined that all formal actions and deliberations of Council and its committees, relating to the passage of this legislation that resulted in formal action were in meetings open to the public where required by Chapter 105, Codified Ordinances of the City.

Section 3: This Ordinance is hereby declared an urgent measure which is immediately necessary for the public peace, health or safety or the efficient operation of the City; and for the further reason that it is necessary to approve this contract at the earliest time in order that the City's streets can be promptly improved and maintained as safe for persons and property.

WHEREFORE, this Ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest date permitted by law.
