

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING AN AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE CITY OF BEACHWOOD AND THE MALTZ MUSEUM OF JEWISH HERITAGE FOR THE MALTZ MUSEUM SCOPE OF WORK AS PART OF THE WIDENING OF RICHMOND ROAD AND THE SOUTH WOODLAND RESURFACING PROJECT

WHEREAS, the City is proceeding with a construction project to reconfigure the intersection of Richmond and South Woodland Roads; and

WHEREAS, in consideration for the City's agreement to include a left turn into and out of the Maltz Museum from Richmond Road as part of the City's Widening and Resurfacing Project, the entire cost of which is estimated at Three Hundred One Thousand, One Hundred Seventeen Dollars and Thirty-Seven Cents (\$301,117.37), the Museum has agreed to contribute an amount not to exceed Two Hundred Thousand Dollars and No/Cents (\$200,000.00) toward that portion of the Widening and Resurfacing Project that impacts the Museum ("Museum Scope of Work"), including design and construction costs, provided that such payment ensures that the Museum Scope of Work will be completed as part of the Widening and Resurfacing Project.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Beachwood, County of Cuyahoga and State of Ohio, that:

Section 1. The Mayor is authorized to enter into the attached Agreement on behalf of the City with The Maltz Museum of Jewish Heritage to include a left turn into and out of Richmond Road, known as the Museum Scope of Work, to be a part of the City's Widening and Resurfacing Project. The Maltz Museum will contribute an amount not to exceed Two Hundred Thousand Dollars and No/Cents (\$200,000.00) towards the cost of the Museum Scope of Work. The City acknowledges and agrees that the Museum has deposited with the City the sum of One Hundred Seventy-Five Thousand Dollars (\$175,000.00) toward the cost of the Museum Scope of Work.

Section 2. It is found and determined that all formal actions and deliberations of Council and its committees, relating to the passage of this legislation, that resulted in formal action, were in meetings open to the public where required by Chapter 105, Codified Ordinances of the City.

Section 3. This Ordinance is hereby declared to be an urgent measure immediately necessary for the public peace, health or safety or the efficient operation of the City; and to further provide for improvements to Richmond and South Woodland Roads.

WHEREFORE, this Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after the earliest date permitted by law.
