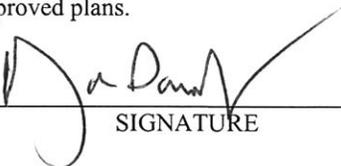

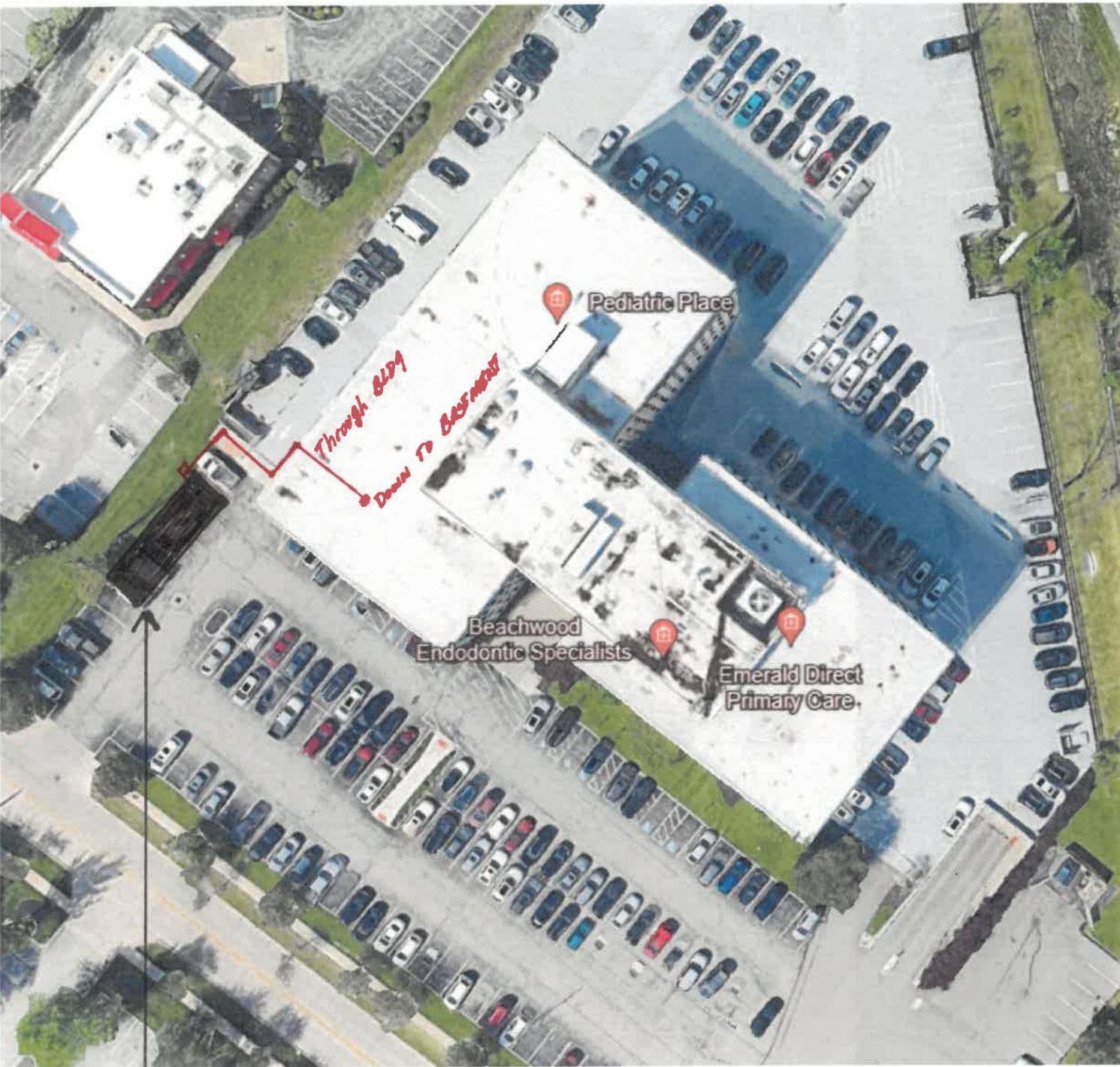

TRAILER LOCATION











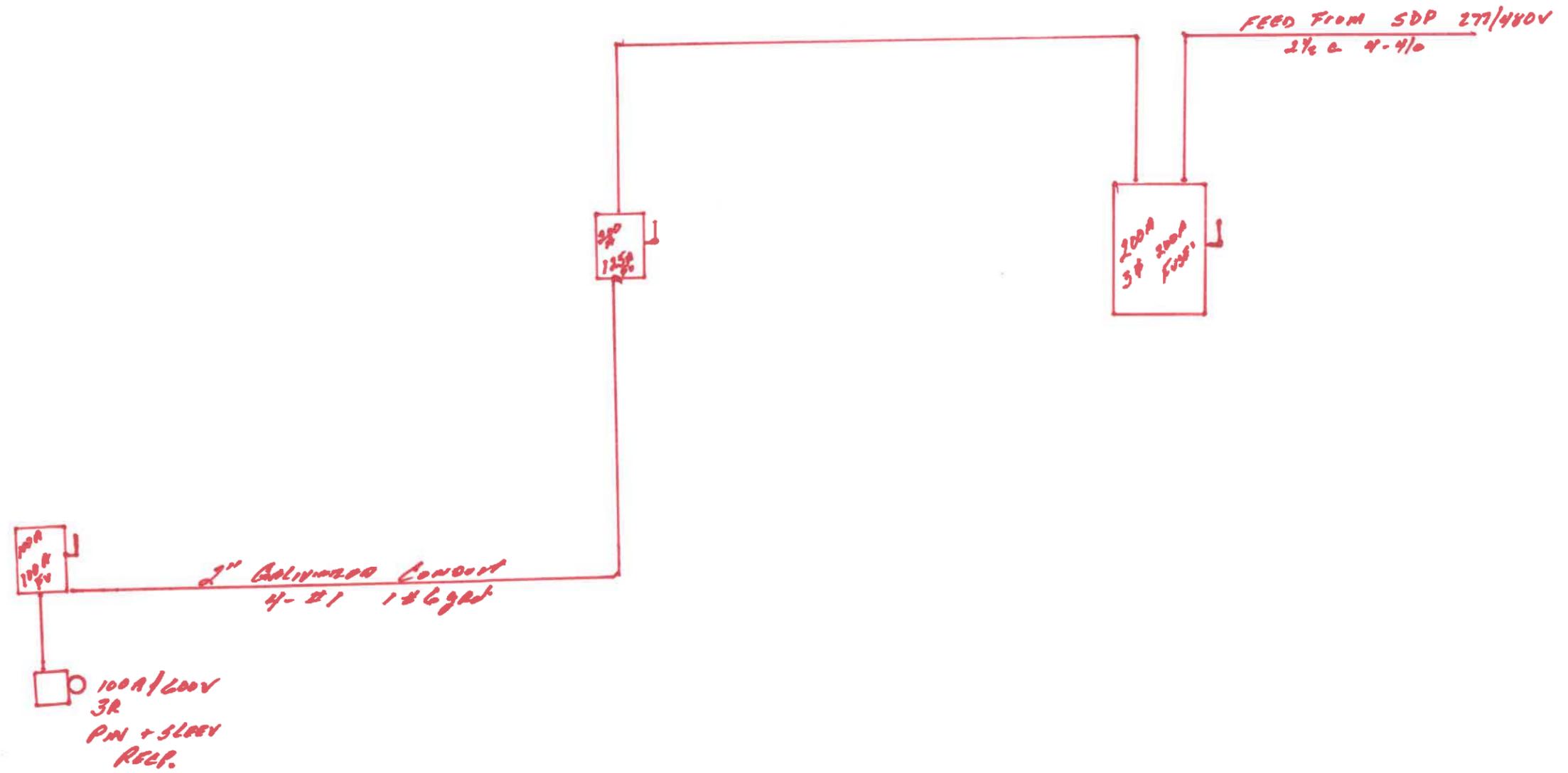

Temporary Mobile MRI Unit**



This request is for approval to temporarily place a mobile MRI unit on the property. The subject site is zoned U-9 Motor Service District. Professional medical offices are a permitted use in the U-9 District. The mobile MRI unit has already been placed on the site. There are two access drives to the office building off of Orange Place. The MRI unit has been placed adjacent to the southern access drive. The facility is being powered by an electrical feed from the office building. That feed uses the truck restrictor to cross the driveway and the cables then run along the ground. Patients using the MRI unit would have to cross the main access drive. The path between the mobile MRI unit and the building is not protected. The placement of the MRI unit temporarily eliminates seven (7) parking spaces. The applicant has not provided a specific time frame for use of the temporary facility.

The Commission has permitted temporary mobile MRI units on at least two other occasions. In each case the unit was placed immediately adjacent to the building and a protected walkway was provided for patients to safely travel between the building and the MRI unit. In each case a time limit was established for the temporary arrangement.

I am not opposed to the concept of placing a temporary MRI unit on the subject site or to temporarily eliminating seven (7) parking spaces. I am, however, not comfortable with the chosen location. There are places on the site where parking is located immediately adjacent to the building. Placing the MRI unit in one of those locations would be a much safer arrangement. The patient path could be protected and patients would not have to cross one of the two main access drives to the site to

get to the MRI. Such a location would also permit the electrical feed to be handled in a safer manner.

It is my recommendation that this request be tabled and the applicant directed to return with a plan that places the mobile MRI unit in a safer and more acceptable location that better provides for patient access and better handles the power arrangements. The applicant should also provide the Commission with some indication of the time frame for this temporary arrangement.

This request is for preliminary and final site plan approval to convert the first floor of the existing building to a child day care facility. The subject site is in the U-8 Industrial and Office Mixed-Use District. Child day care facilities are a permitted use in the U-8 District subject to compliance with Section 1155.02. The applicant is proposing to eliminate approximately 30 parking spaces in order to create the outdoor play area required for child day care facilities. The site plan indicates that the new outdoor play areas will be fenced and there are details for the various play equipment.

Section 1155.02 provides that child day care facilities can only be on the first floor of a multistory building. The proposed plan complies with that requirement. The elimination of the parking spaces is not an issue since the parking requirement for child day care centers is less for office space. The required parking for the second-floor office space and the day care facility is 53 spaces. The proposed site plan provides for 59 parking spaces.

It is recommended that the Commission grant both preliminary and final site plan approval for the Primrose School of Beachwood child day care facility subject to the applicant's continued compliance with the provisions of Section 1155.02.

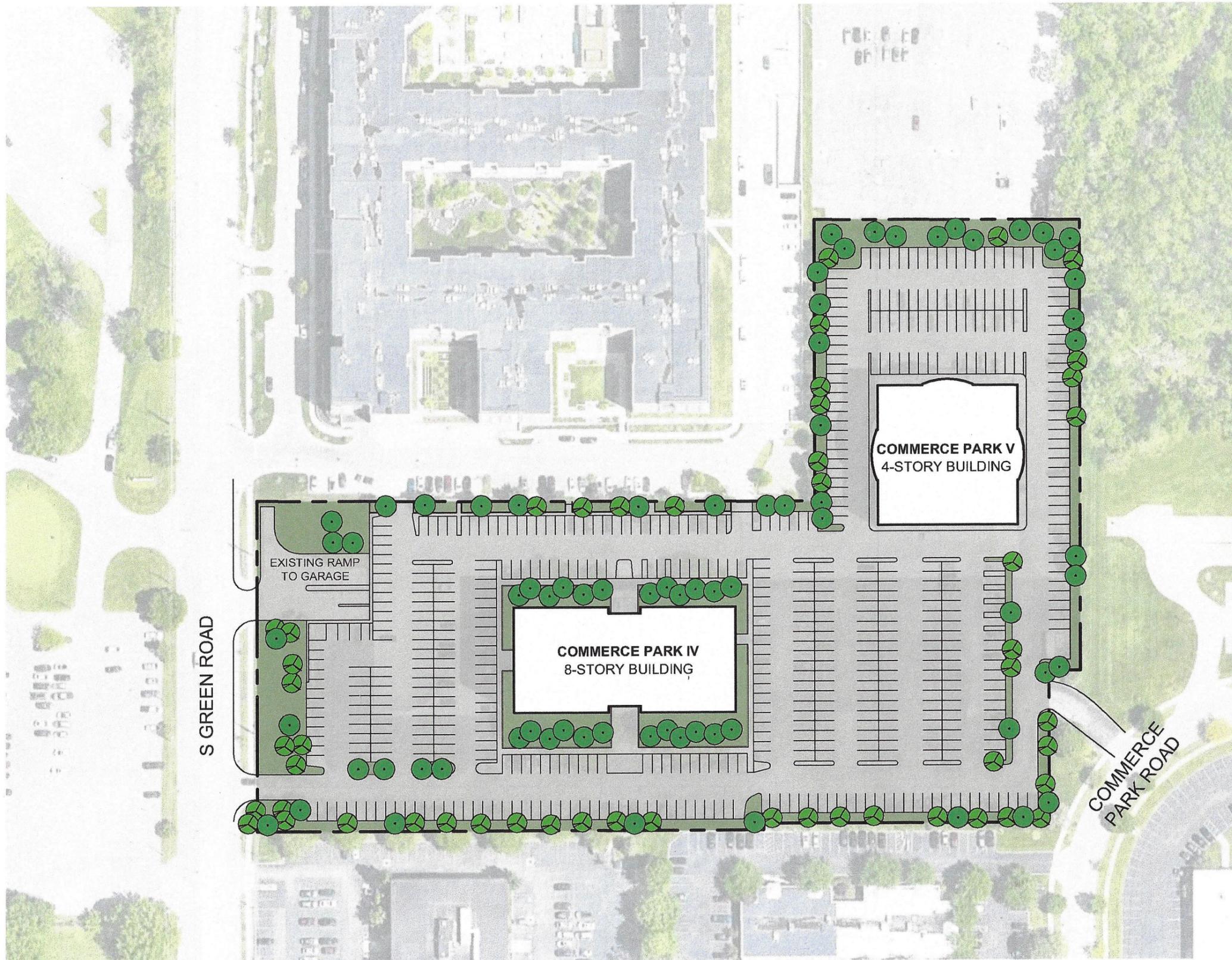

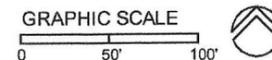

Dear Chairman Zabell and Members of the Planning and Zoning Commission:

Please accept this letter as part of Beachwood Office LLC's variance application regarding its proposed redevelopment of the property located at 23250 Chagrin Boulevard. The property is approximately 3.583 acres containing a four (4) story commercial office building. The Applicant previously proposed and was granted a conditional use permit by this Commission, which was confirmed by City Council, for use of the building for residential purposes above the first floor. See Beachwood Ordinance 2023-145, a copy of which is enclosed with this letter. At this time, the Applicant is proposing and requesting a variance to use the first floor of Building V specifically for ADA accessible residential units. In total, with the use of the first floor, Building V would include approximately 50 residential units, split relatively evenly between the floors.

This property, as you know, is being redeveloped along with neighboring Commerce Park Building IV which is an eight (8) story commercial office building. Many if not all of the residential amenities, such as a pool, exercise facility, dog park and pickle ball courts, for Commerce Park IV and Commerce Park V will be shared. Those uses being considered for the first floor of Commerce Park IV include the following: a restaurant, co-working space, and office uses. Therefore, taken together between the two properties, there will be a combination of mixed uses which are consistent with the purposes and intent behind the City's U-7A zoning classification.

Commerce Park IV will have approximately 20,000 square feet per floor dedicated to residential purposes and 20,000 square feet dedicated to nonresidential purposes on the first floor. If this variance is granted, Commerce Park V will have 15,000 square feet per floor dedicated to residential purposes with approximately 25% of those residential units specifically designed to be ADA accessible on the first floor of the building.

Overall, as previously represented to this Commission the investment in these buildings will exceed \$50+ million dollars. This investment will result in additional real estate taxes paid to



the school district and the City. In addition, for those residents that choose to live and work in the City, additional income taxes will be generated for the City.

Chapter 1159 of Beachwood’s Codified Ordinances, “Determinations and Variances” sets out the framework for determinations on variance applications to the City’s Planning & Zoning Commission. Further, the provisions distinguish between area and use variances. The request herein, in the undersigned’s opinion, would be appropriately classified as an area variance. However, the following analysis will address the factors for an area variance and a use variance:

Area variances typically address space and dimensional requirements. In this instance, the zoning code allows for a conditional use permit to permit residential above the first floor. This sets forth a space and/or dimensional requirement. As such, the practical difficulty factors to consider when addressing an area variance under the City’s Code at BCO 1159.04 are the same as those announced by the Ohio Supreme Court.

Although the City’s Code does enumerate the standards for the consideration of practical difficulties, we note the historic precedent of Ohio case law dating back to two Supreme Court cases whose purpose was to assist boards and commission in this regard:

First, *Kisil v. Sandusky* (1984), 12 Ohio St.3d 30 drew the distinction between use and area variances.

“A property owner encounters ‘practical difficulties’ whenever an area zoning requirement (e.g., frontage, setback, height) unreasonably deprives him of a permitted use of his property. The key to this standard is whether the area zoning requirement, as applied to the property owner in question, is reasonable. The practical difficulty standard differs from the unnecessary hardship standard normally applied in use variance cases, because no single factor controls in a determination of practical difficulties. A property owner is not denied the opportunity to establish practical difficulties, for example, simply because he purchased the property with the knowledge of the zoning restrictions.”

In effect, the considerations for area variances focus upon compatibility with the zoning classification of the property.

About two years after the *Kisil* decision, the Ohio Supreme Court listed seven factors that it believed would more objectively guide officials in evaluating such practical difficulties. From *Duncan v. Middlefield* (1986), 23 Ohio St.3d 83, the list of seven factors is as follows:

- (1) Whether the property in question will yield a reasonable return or whether there can be any beneficial use of the property without the variance; (See BCO 1159.04(a)). *Given the current state of the office market in the City and nationally, the best use of this four (4) floors building is entirely for residential purposes.*

- (2) Whether the variance is substantial; (See BCO 1159.04(b)). *The variance if approved will provide an additional 15,000 square feet (approximately) of residential space in the building, bringing the total residential square footage to approximately 60,000 square feet. Given the size of this building the variance is not substantial. For comparison purposes, The Vue apartments, located directly to the west of Commerce Park Building V, on over 8 acres of land, includes 348 residential units totaling over 400,000 square feet.*
- (3) Whether the essential character of the neighborhood would be substantially altered or whether adjoining properties would suffer a substantial detriment as a result of the variance; (See BCO 1159.04(c)). *Adding approximately twelve (12) first floor ADA accessible units to Commerce Park Building V will have virtually no obvious or appreciable impact on the neighborhood or adjoining properties.*
- (4) Whether the variance would adversely affect the delivery of governmental services (i.e., water, sewer, garbage); (See BCO 1159.04(d)). *The variance will add approximately twelve (12) residential units to this building which should have no appreciable impact on the delivery of governmental services in the City.*
- (5) Whether the property owner purchased the property with knowledge of the zoning restriction; (See BCO 1159.04(e)). *This request is being made after further review of the development of this site, along with neighboring Commerce Park Building IV.*
- (6) Whether the property owner's predicament feasibly can be obviated through some method other than a variance; and (See BCO 1159.04(f)). *Taken alone, the commercial viability to redevelop Commerce Park V for entirely residential purposes, and specifically the first floor for ADA accessible units, cannot be obviated with commercial uses on the first floor.*
- (7) Whether the spirit and intent behind the zoning requirement would be observed and substantial justice done by granting the variance. (See BCO 1159.04(g)). *The overall spirit and intent behind any zoning code, including but not limited to the City of Beachwood, is to promote the highest and best uses of property, while also maintaining compatibility of uses. To foster redevelopment of the subject property, this variance is being requested and will promote the spirit and intent being the City's zoning code.*

Duncan v. Middlefield, supra, syllabus.

It is important to point out that the Court did not rank these factors and noted that maybe only one or a few might apply, depending on individual cases. These factors are similar to the factors set forth within the City's Code.

The City's Code adds five (5) additional factors, which may be considered and are as follows (all of which are substantially addressed in the above analysis):

- (h) Whether granting of the variance will be contrary to the general purpose, intent, and objective of the specific Use District.
- (i) Whether the variance requested arises from a condition or circumstance which is unique to the subject site and which is not generally shared by other properties in the same zoning district or general vicinity.
- (j) Whether the practical difficulty is created by the Code and not by any action or actions of the property owner or the applicant.
- (k) Whether the variance desired will adversely affect the public health, safety, or general welfare.
- (l) Whether the variance requested is the minimum variance necessary to afford relief to the property owner.

If considered a request for a use variance, BCO 1159.05 sets out the factors for consideration in determining if unnecessary hardship exists to support the granting of a variance. Although they are similar in many respects to the area variance factors, these factors focus more on economic viability of the use without the variance.

- a) Whether uses permitted in the district may be reasonably established on the property and whether the permitted uses are economically viable on the property in question without the variance. *When looking at the economies and efficiencies that can be achieved with the redevelopment of Commerce Park IV and Commerce Park V, full development and build out of both buildings is the goal. In order to do so, usage of Commerce Park V as fully residential is necessary to make the redevelopment economically viable.*
- b) Whether the variance is the minimum variance necessary to afford relief to the property owner. *The variance being requested solely applies to the first floor of the building.*
- c) Whether the essential character of the neighborhood will be substantially altered or adjoining properties will suffer interference with their proper future development and rights as a result of the variance. *Adding approximately twelve (12) first floor ADA accessible units to Commerce Park Building V will have virtually no obvious or appreciable impact on the neighborhood or adjoining properties and not interfere with any future development rights.*
- d) Whether the variance requested arises from an exceptional condition or circumstance which is unique to the subject site and which is not generally shared by other properties in the same zoning district or general vicinity. *The subject*

property is unique in the sense that it is a smaller office building in this area and only contains four (4) floors.

- e) Whether the hardship condition was created by actions of the applicant. *The existing conditions have been created by the downfall of the office market in the City and nationwide.*
- f) Whether the spirit and intent of the Code will be observed and substantial justice done by granting the variance. *The overall spirit and intent behind any zoning code, including but not limited to the City of Beachwood, is to promote the highest and best uses of property, while also maintaining compatibility of uses. To foster redevelopment of the subject property, the variance is being requested and will promote the spirit and intent being the City's zoning code.*
- g) Whether the use requested is similar in character to the permitted uses in the subject district. *The neighboring property to the west is entirely multifamily residential.*
- h) Whether the subject property is adequate to meet the needs and requirements of the proposed use. *If this variance is granted the property's full potential in today's market will be achieved, while adding more residential options for Beachwood residents to choose to age in place.*

Whether analyzed under a practical difficulty standard or an unnecessary hardship the same conclusion should be reached that the factors weigh in favor of granting the requested variance.

Representatives of the Applicant will be able to explain the requested variance and how it related to the site plan in greater detail at the time of the required review meeting; however, we believe that if the variance is granted it will benefit redevelopment in Commerce Park and be another five star amenity that the City of Beachwood can offer to current and new residents.

Hopefully, this overview offers good insight for the City's consideration of the proposed variances being requested. We look forward to presenting this information in person to the City's Planning & Zoning Commission, at which time the information mentioned herein can be more fully discussed in detail.

WHEREAS, Beachwood Office LLC has requested that the Planning and Zoning Commission recommend to City Council the approval of the Preliminary Site Plan and a Conditional Use Permit to allow multi-family residential apartments above the first floor of the building located at 23250 Chagrin Boulevard, Beachwood, Ohio; and

WHEREAS, the Planning and Zoning Commission, on December 7, 2023, reviewed the request and recommended that City Council approve the Preliminary Site Plan and grant the Conditional Use Permit subject to certain conditions, stipulations, and requirements; and

WHEREAS, Council: (a) sought to encourage mixed use, including residential use, in the U-7A General Office Building District where the subject property is located by Council's adoption of Ordinance No. 2018-84 which amended the City's Planning and Zoning Code by adding Section 1111.02(i)(10) that allows "Multi-Family Dwellings above the first floor with a Conditional Use Permit" in the U-7A General Office Building District; (b) finds that economic conditions have adversely impacted continued use of the subject property for office purposes and, therefore, support its use for multi-family dwellings; (d) finds that the location of the subject property on Green Road across from Highlands Golf Course makes the subject property well located for use for multi-family dwellings rather than office purposes; and (e) finds that the location of the subject property adjacent to property located in a U-3C Zoning District which permits multi-family dwellings.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Beachwood, County of Cuyahoga and State of Ohio, that:

Section 1: Council accepts the recommendation of the Planning and Zoning Commission made on December 7, 2023, in P & Z Case No. 2023-22 and grants a Preliminary Site Plan approval and a Conditional Use Permit to Beachwood Office LLC to allow multi-family residential apartments above the first floor of the building located at 23250 Chagrin Boulevard, Beachwood, Ohio, subject to compliance with the conditions, stipulations, and requirements recommended by the Planning and Zoning Commission which shall include the following:

- A. Submission of building elevation drawings satisfactory to the Planning and Zoning Commission depicting the architectural treatment of the conversion with the final site development plan.
- B. The applicant shall adequately address all of the safety concerns to the satisfaction of the Fire Department and City Engineer prior to submission of the final site development plan.
- C. The applicant shall provide evidence that the parking garage meets appropriate structural standards prior to submission of the final site development plan.

D. Submission of a complete final site development plan package that includes evidence of compliance with the minimum parking requirements.

Section 2: The Building Commissioner is directed to include the conditions, stipulations, and requirements listed in Section 1 of this Ordinance in any conditional use permit and certificate of occupancy issued for 23250 Chagrin Boulevard. The failure to comply with any one or more of the conditions, stipulations, or requirements listed in Section 1 of this Ordinance and/or any other provision of the Zoning Code shall be deemed to be a violation of the Planning and Zoning Code and the Building Commissioner and any other City official are authorized to take any action that may be necessary to enforce the conditions, stipulations and requirements.

Section 3: It is found and determined that all formal actions and deliberations of Council and its committees relating to the passage of this legislation that resulted in formal action were in meetings open to the public as required by Chapter 105 of the Codified Ordinances of the City.

Section 4: This Ordinance is declared to be an urgent measure necessary for the public peace, health, or safety or the efficient operation of the City, and for the further reason of the immediate necessity of granting a Conditional Use Permit to permit Beachwood Office LLC to construct multi-family residential apartments above the first floor of the building located at 23250 Chagrin Boulevard and to permit continued planning and design of the project and the timely construction of the project as permitted; wherefore; this Ordinance shall be in full force and effect immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor.

WHEREFORE, this Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after the earliest date permitted by law.

Use Variance**

This request is for a variance to utilize a portion of the first floor of Commerce Park Building V for residential dwelling units. The subject site is zoned U-7A General Office Building District. The Commission and Council approved a Conditional Use Permit to convert the upper floors of the existing four-story building to multi-family dwellings subject to multiple conditions. The applicant is now seeking approval to utilize the first floor of the building for residential purposes.

The intent of the Code provision to permit residential uses above the first floor was to allow for mixed-use developments in the U-7A District. The limitation with regard to using the first floor for dwelling units was specifically to maintain the non-residential character at street level. This request is, in my professional opinion, a use variance and not an area variance. It is specifically a request to place a use (multi-family dwellings) in a location where they are not permitted (the first floor of a building in the U-7A District). I do not see how that request can be characterized as anything other than a use variance. Therefore, the standards of Section 1159.05 would apply and the standard is not practical difficulty, but “unnecessary hardship”.

I have the following concerns regarding application of those standards to this request:

1. There is no evidence presented, other than an unsupported statement that the office market is weak, that the first floor of the building cannot be used for any of the permitted uses in the U-7A District. To the contrary, the City is experiencing a reasonable demand for space, and the other properties located in the U-7A District appear to be able to function effectively and attract tenants in compliance with the U-7A District regulations.

2. The intent of mixed-use and no residential use on the first floor of buildings is to preserve some of the non-residential character and not change this portion of the City into a residential neighborhood. There is nothing mixed-use about a building that is 100% residential.
3. There is absolutely nothing about this request that “*arises from an exceptional condition or circumstance which is unique to the subject site and which is not generally shared by other properties in the same zoning district or general vicinity.*” Every three- and four-story office building on the south side of Chagrin Boulevard, which are all zoned U-7A General Office Building District, shares exactly the same conditions and circumstances as the subject site. There is nothing that sets the subject site apart. Allowing 100% residential use of all of those buildings would devastate the City’s economic base.
4. Making the subject building completely residential is in no way consistent with the spirit and intent of the Zoning Code. The site is zoned U-7A General Office District, not multi-family residential. The intent of the Code provision is to provide for mixed-use developments within a building. There is no mixed-use in the building if it is 100% residential.
5. The proposed use would not be “*similar in character to the permitted uses in the subject district.*” Instead, it would a departure from the very essence of the district. This variance, if approved, would be tantamount to a rezoning of the property to multi-family residential.

The applicant makes reference to providing ADA accessible dwelling units and to the amount of money to be expended on the proposed project, but those are extraneous matters that do not relate to the zoning issue before the Commission as to whether an unnecessary hardship exists.

I do not see how the Commission can “*determine by clear and convincing evidence that an unnecessary hardship exists*” as required by Section 1159.05. The City has provided reasonable relief for this applicant by approving their initial request for a Conditional Use Permit for multi-family dwellings above the first floor subject to compliance with certain stipulations. This subsequent request to allow dwellings on the first floor is tantamount to a rezoning in disguise and is essentially a request not to have to comply with the provisions of the U-7A District.

It is my professional recommendation that the Commission deny this application.

As the final step to complete the City's program to update the U-5 Public and Institutional District, I am requesting legislation to rezone four (4) parcels of land that are developed with institutional uses from their current U-1 Single Family Residential District classification to U-5 Public and Institutional District. Three (3) of those properties and their respective uses are operating under use variances granted in 1998 which contain standards that are substantially more restrictive than the current U-5 Public and Institutional District regulations. There is no reason those three institutional uses should be placed at an operational disadvantage compared to all of the other institutional uses in the City. The use on the fourth property is currently designated a non-conforming use in the U-1 Single Family Residential District. That status makes special approvals necessary for any changes, even very minor changes, to their use or facilities. The non-conforming status also places the property at some risk for rebuilding in the event of a catastrophe.

In order to address those issues, and to achieve the City's intent that all institutional uses are classified in the U-5 Public and Institutional District; I am requesting that legislation be prepared and introduced at the February 5th City Council meeting to rezone the following parcels from U-1 Single Family Residential District to U-5 Public and Institutional District:
