

OHIO COLLABORATIVE POLICY

“The Ohio Collaborative, a 12-person panel of law enforcement experts and community leaders from throughout the state, established Ohio’s first state law enforcement standards on August 28, 2015. These standards will hold everyone accountable and instill a greater confidence with the public. The Collaborative works closely with partners, including the community and law enforcement agencies, to implement new standards. All law enforcement agencies are expected to meet or exceed these standards as they develop policies and procedures to meet new expectations.”

The Ohio Collaborative Policy consists of six groups. Each group contains policies to which each agency must show compliance by submitting supporting documents. In 2023, The Beachwood Police Department has obtained full certification in Group 5. Additionally, The Ohio Collaborative has added group 6, to which we are currently working towards certification. The Beachwood Police Department will maintain our certification by submitting supportive documents to show continued compliance, each year.

DISPATCH

The Beachwood Dispatch Center is responsible for processing all 911 and non-emergency calls, as well as radio communications for police, fire, and emergency medical services for the communities of Beachwood and Pepper Pike.

In total, the dispatch center received 62,630 incoming calls, 10,835 of which were 911 calls. Over 99% of all incoming calls were answered within 10 seconds.

Throughout 2023, dispatch staff members participated in active shooter training and several large events hosted within the city requiring increased security.

In April, an additional dispatch position was approved by the city to assist with reduction of overtime and overall dispatch operations.

In September, our agency transitioned from Emergency Callworks to Motorola Vesta as a part of a county-wide update to call-taking software.

In November, Dispatcher Josette Renken joined the Beachwood Dispatch team. She previously dispatched in the State of Washington as well as Antarctica.

In December, three additional Lead Dispatcher positions were created to assist with overseeing day-to-day operations within the dispatch center. This dispatch center will now have a total of four Lead Dispatchers with one being assigned to each of the four shifts under the current schedule. Dispatchers Erika Westbroks, Carrie Dearden, and Lindsay Grisafio will begin their new assignments in early 2024 along with Dispatcher Joseph who currently holds the position.

CRASH ACTIVITY

In 2023 there were six hundred seventy-four (674) motor vehicle crashes reported to the Beachwood Police Department. One hundred forty-nine (149), occurred on private property. These crashes usually involve minor damage to the vehicles and were self-reported by the participants. There were thirty (30) crashes that occurred on public roadways where the parties involved went to the police station and filled out the crash report themselves, with no further police involvement. These crashes are usually of a minor nature and the individuals involved did not report the incident to the police at the time of occurrence. At a later time, for insurance or other reasons, a report was eventually filed.

Due to the limited enforcement options and the limited input to the design features of private property, statistics from private property are not used in the following comparison statistics. The crashes that occurred on the public roadways and were self-reported are not included in the comparisons as there is no official verification as to the validity of the report.

There was a total of five hundred twenty-five (525) roadway crashes investigated by the Beachwood Police Department in 2023. Of the five hundred twenty-five (525) roadway crashes one hundred twenty-four (124) involved personal injury.

FATAL CRASHES

There were zero (0) fatal crashes in 2023.

CAUSATIVE FACTORS AND ENFORCEMENT

When looking at causative factors, failure to maintain an assured clear distance ahead was listed as the causative factor in two hundred forty-nine (249) crashes. In many cases, speed can be directly attributed to this type of crash. However, the continuing trend is an increase in cell phone use, i.e. calling, texting, e-mailing etc. and it is believed that many crashes are directly related to distracted driving and or failure to maintain full time and attention to the operation of a motor vehicle.

Failure to Yield was listed as the causative factor on sixty-three (63) crash reports. The State of Ohio (OH-1) crash report does not differentiate between the various "failure to yield" violations.

A review of our enforcement activity revealed the following:

- 34 citations issued for Failure to Yield while turning left
- 75 citations issued for Failure to Yield when changing lanes
- 2 citations issued for Failure to Yield to an emergency vehicle

Improper lane change was listed as the causative factor on seventy-four (74) reports.
Reasonable control was listed as the causative factor on thirty-nine (39) reports.
Red light violation was listed as the causative factor on twenty-six (26) reports.
Improper backing was listed as the causative factor on sixty-one (61) reports.

TRAFFIC COMPLAINTS

The Beachwood Police Department receives some type of traffic complaint or concern from a motorist almost every day. The complaints range from suspected intoxicated drivers to a simple complaint of debris in the roadway.

When a traffic complaint is received our response is normally one of a few options. If the complaint is about a missing traffic sign or malfunctioning traffic signal, the traffic bureau will coordinate the adjustment, replacement or repair. Many times, the complainant simply has a question that may need to be answered.

If the complaint involves motorists not obeying some type of traffic law, a police unit is dispatched and the complaint is also reviewed by the traffic bureau for further police response. After review, a special attention notice may be posted, and officers direct their discretionary enforcement time to the problem area.

In 2023, the police department received four hundred twenty-five (425) traffic complaints (as defined above) called into our dispatch center. The number of complaints does not necessarily reflect the true total, as there are times where calls are directed to the traffic bureau, individuals speak directly to officers on the road, or complaints are sometimes relayed by other means such as e-mail.

Applicable complaints were posted in a "traffic special attention" file and via e-mail where all personnel can access, including those in patrol cars. In response, officers either give the area special attention by frequently patrolling the area (the most common response), or they may set up on a traffic detail targeting the violation(s) that are the subject of the complaint for lengthier periods of time. In 2023, officers logged eighty-two (82) traffic details for various violations such as: speed, reckless operation, O.V.I., stop signs, and red-light violations

O.V.I. ARRESTS AND ENFORCEMENT

In 2023 the Beachwood Police Department made thirty-five (35) arrests for persons who were Operating a Vehicle while Under the Influence of Alcohol and /or Drugs (O.V.I.). Twenty (20) of the arrested were male violators and fifteen (15) were female violators.

Twenty-one (21) of the arrested persons submitted to a breath sample with the average Blood Alcohol Content (B.A.C.) level being .170 which is over twice the legal limit of .08. The highest reading was .297, which is over three (3) times the legal limit. Fourteen (14) people refused to provide a sample as required by law.

Eight (8) of the violators had at least one (1) prior conviction. Four (4) of the violators had at least two (2) prior convictions. There were four (4) traffic crash related O.V.I.'s in 2023.

Over the last several years, results from the O.V.I. analysis were distributed to the patrol division for O.V.I. details, specifically targeting areas and times where statistically we've made the most arrests. This allows for more concentrated enforcement as opposed to regular patrol where officers patrol all areas and respond to calls.

OVERALL TRAFFIC ENFORCEMENT

Officers made approximately 2,940 traffic stops in 2023 that resulted in one of the following dispositions: citation issued, written warning, verbal warning, or arrest. There were five hundred thirty-four (534) speeding citations issued, one hundred eighty-six (186) assured clear distance ahead citations, eighty-eight (88) red light citations, three hundred ninety-eight (398) vehicle registration violations, one hundred five (105) stop sign violations, and two hundred sixty-seven (267) motorists were cited for driving under suspension. Three (3) citations were issued for violating the "Use of Electronic Communications Device While Driving" ordinance. Officers issued approximately two thousand (2,000) citations, and gave approximately one thousand four hundred two (1,402) verbal or written warnings.

Overall, our traffic enforcement program is on target with our intentions to direct our focus on specific problem areas but not at the expense of other areas. We will maintain our consistent level of enforcement along our major streets and highways. We will continue to direct our discretionary enforcement time to the areas where complaints have been received.

When reviewing the traffic details that are logged in areas where we get complaints, often times the officer spends 20-30 minutes and documents "no violations observed." The fact that a marked police cruiser / S.U.V. was in the area is a deterrent to the violations that result in complaints, but yields less enforcement. The use of police motorcycles can help that cause.

Traffic Signals

The task of monitoring and maintaining the four traffic signal systems and forty (42) traffic signals owned by the City of Beachwood is handled by GPD Group which is a private company consisting of architects, engineers and planners with expertise in traffic issues. All traffic signals are connected to a central operating software system known as Centrac. Officers also observe the traffic systems while on patrol to make sure that the signals are working properly. While officers do not repair the traffic signals, they are usually the first to discover there is a problem with a traffic signal. When a hardware problem is detected the Beachwood Police

Department contacts Signal Service Company located in Warrensville Heights, OH. Signal Service Company responded to one hundred two (102) repair calls for the City of Beachwood in 2023.

TOWED VEHICLES

In 2023, the traffic bureau managed the vehicle towing operations for the department. This operation includes overseeing the towing and impounding of vehicles seized during the routine performance of police duties and the disposal of all unclaimed vehicles in accordance with state law. Complete records of all vehicles towed and their disposition are maintained.

In 2023 the Beachwood Police Department contracted with three tow companies to provide towing services. The companies were Interstate Towing, Mooney's Towing, and Rich's Towing. Police dispatchers used a rotation system to ensure that each company received an equitable share of the police tows. Exceptions to this rotation are if a tow company either cannot respond at the time requested or cannot respond with specific requested equipment such as a flatbed or a tow dolly. Tow companies were authorized to charge \$135 for a standard tow (additional fees for oversized vehicles, extra labor, i.e. use of a dolly, winch-outs, etc.) and \$25 per day for storage.

In 2023 there were five hundred eighty-one (581) vehicles towed, this included fifty-five (55) private tows. Private tows are those that the police have called for at the request of the driver, but no police action was taken.

Fifty-eight (58) vehicles were unclaimed, scrapped or salvaged in 2023 with numerous other vehicles still being processed to be disposed of in accordance with Ohio law.

INVESTIGATIONS

Detective Bureau

The Beachwood Police Department Detective Bureau consists of four full time detectives as well as a detective supervisor. However, due to manpower, one of the detectives was assigned to a community policing initiative at Beachwood Place Mall and worked primarily late afternoon/evening hours. One of the detectives was assigned to the Drug Enforcement Administration (DEA).

The Beachwood Police Department Detective Bureau spent the majority of 2023 completing fraud, sexual assaults and other investigations that require extensive follow-up. The Detective Bureau also spent a considerable amount of time conducting background investigations for new police applicants, dispatchers and part-time police officers.

The SPEAR (Specialized Patrol Enforcement and Response) unit was put on hold for most of the calendar year due to the lack of manpower. In the fall, the unit was staffed with a sergeant and a patrol officer. The sergeant in charge of the unit would also oversee the COHatch community policing initiative at Beachwood Place Mall and was able to utilize those officers when needed. This unit supervisor worked directly with the detective bureau to identify areas of concern. The unit was established to take a proactive response to not only deter crime but to quickly respond and react to anyone violating the law. This unit was frequently deployed at Beachwood Place which allowed the officers assigned to the patrol division to be available to respond to other calls for service as well as actively patrol the city.

The detective bureau manpower will see a decrease in the upcoming year due to a recent retirement.

Internal Affairs

In 2023, there were five incidents determined to be internal affairs complaints. Out of the five complaints, two were determined to be unfounded and handled according to Beachwood Police Department protocol.

Of the complaints that were sustained, one complaint involved a police officer not taking the time to verify video footage before falsely accusing a driver of a serious traffic violation. The officer received a written reprimand. Another complaint involved a police officer that arrived and worked part of the shift while having alcohol in their system. The officer was given 104 hours of suspension after returning from rehabilitation. The last complaint involved a police officer that called an Ohio State Highway Patrol Post while intoxicated. The officer proceeded to ask questions about the OSP pursuit policy due to the officer pursuing a vehicle earlier in the week. This officer was given a 24 hour of suspension.

TRAINING

The following report contains training that took place both at the Beachwood Police Department as well as outside of the department in 2023. In addition to the listed training above, the Beachwood Police Department also has officers that are members of the Eastside Departments Group Enforcement (EDGE) teams including Mobile Field Force, SWAT, Crisis Negotiators, Accident Investigation Unit and Bomb Squad. The SWAT team trains 16 hours every month plus one full week per year. The other teams mentioned above train eight hours per month. These teams/units service seven municipalities. The Beachwood Police Department also has a member of the Hillcrest Fire Investigation Team. This team meets several times a year for internal training. The team services thirteen municipalities.

CRISIS INTERVENTION

The City of Beachwood is located in the southeast corner of Cuyahoga County Ohio. The city has a residential population of 14,040 residents (2020 Census) while attracting 100,000 people daily to work, shop, and visit within its 5.2 square mile area. The Beachwood Police Department was staffed by 48 full time sworn police officers, 7 part-time officers, and 15 dispatchers who answered a total of 31,980 calls for service in 2023. Officers recorded 334 crisis intervention incidents.


The Crisis Intervention Team (CIT) program is a community partnership of law enforcement, mental health and addiction professionals, individuals who live with mental illness and/or addictive disorders, their families and other partners whose goal is to improve community responses to mental health crisis. The CIT model, known as the “Memphis Model”, was developed in 1988 and has spread throughout the United States and several nations worldwide.

The Beachwood Police Department was introduced to CIT in 2004 when members of the Hostage Negotiator Team were sent to CIT training. Currently, all officers have attended a 40-hour Crisis Intervention team training course offered through the ADAMHS Board of Cuyahoga County. Experienced CIT officers attended an 8-hour refresher course. Dispatch personnel have been trained through a similar program offered specific to their duties. Additional training included QPR: Question, Persuade, Refer training for response to suicidal individuals

RANGE

The yearly inspection of the Beachwood Police shooting range was completed during the month of January 2024 for the previous year. Listed below are the results.

Range Facility and Equipment: The range was professionally cleaned in January of 2023. The range's targeting system continues to be inoperable due to the system being so antiquated. The renovated ventilation and HVAC system has been functioning perfectly. Much of the clutter in the range has been cleared out. The range and range vault have been organized so that items can be found and used much easier.

Qualification Records: The qualification records are all current. For 2023, all of the signed qualification records were entered digitally and are now stored on the Department Drive. There are no longer paper copies of the qualification sheets. All weapon receipts and records were also digitally scanned and stored on the Department Drive. The only records with paper copies are the yearly Firearm Use of Force Test and signed Range Rules. These are kept in a file cabinet in the range. For the first time, the Advanced Firearm Proficiency Qualification was completed in November and December of 2023. All eligible officers successfully qualified.

Ammunition: An inventory was taken of the different types of ammunition needed by the Department. An ammunition order was placed earlier in the year, and most of that order had arrived by the end of 2023. The range has enough ammunition currently for training and duty, but another order will need to be made in 2024 to keep the supply up.

Expendable Supplies: There is currently a sufficient supply of targets, cleaning supplies, protective equipment, and shooting supplies in the range. Additional, necessary cleaning and safety supplies were ordered in 2023. Some of these items were lead-removal hand wipes and better hearing protection for all range officers. These newer items will help to mitigate the risks of lead exposure and hearing loss for the range officers that deal with these issues more than others. The 80% reduced OPOTA targets were also ordered for the first time in 2023. Another order of expendable supplies will be made in 2024.

Non-Issued Weapons: All of the non-issued duty weapons are accounted for. Extra, unassigned duty handguns are properly secured in the range vault. There were enough handguns and lights to accommodate additional officers hired in 2023. There are enough holsters stored for any new right or left-handed officers. SWAT rifles are stored along with less lethal shotguns in a designated and secure area. We currently have two lethal shotguns that are deployed for patrol use. The two 9mm training rifles are stored in the safe in the range. Two additional patrol rifles were ordered and received in 2023.

Confiscated or Donated Weapons: The supply of confiscated or donated weapons was traded in during 2023 in order to purchase two additional patrol rifles and the necessary accessories. Also, as part of this trade were multiple rifles and shotguns that belonged to the department but were obsolete and unused. This allowed us to not only have been able to purchase and accessorize the two additional patrol rifles but also gives us a credit for future orders.

Goals for 2024: Regular checks and cleaning of the patrol rifles need to happen more often. Additional handgun training will also happen quarterly. The current SWAT rifles are past their useful life and will need to be replaced in the near future. SWAT rifle replacements are handled by the EDGE SWAT Team. Alternative less lethal guns will be researched to replace our aging less lethal shotguns. The range will be professionally cleaned in March of 2024.

CANINE

K9 Kai conducted (1) patrol deployment and (4) narcotics searches with no seizures. K9 Kai participated in (2) community relations events and assisted the Beachwood City Schools with (2) narcotics detection sweeps at the Beachwood High School. Ptl Gray and K9 Kai attended Safety Town at Fairmount Elementary and provided a demonstration for the students.

K9 Jorik conducted (23) explosive detection searches, (5) community relation deployments and (0) patrol related deployments. K9 Jorik assisted on several high profile security details in response to threats made towards schools, synagogues and other local institutions.

In March, the K9 Unit completed their annual recertification through the Ohio Peace Officer Training Academy and the North American Police Work Dog Association. The K9 Unit maintained advanced training practices throughout the year by working with K9 units of nearby local and federal agencies. The K9 Unit continues to be an invaluable asset to the police department and the community.

PATROL

USE OF FORCE

Beachwood Police Department personnel were involved in three (3) reportable use of force incidents during 2023. The force employed was for the defense of themselves or others, to control subjects, to affect custodial arrests, and to carry out their lawful duties. When considering the countless interactions officers have with the public in varied contexts, this number is low. Agency policy defines force as *the application of physical techniques or tactics, chemical agents, or weapons to another person. It is not a use of force when a person allows him/herself to be searched, escorted, handcuffed, or restrained.* Officers are entrusted to use that amount and duration of force that reasonably appears necessary given the facts and circumstances perceived by the officer(s) at the time of the incident to accomplish their law enforcement purpose. Personnel are expected to attempt to de-escalate situations prior to deploying force options whenever possible, however, nothing in the agency's force policy requires an officer to retreat nor to be exposed to potential physical injury prior to applying reasonable force. In the event a force deployment is believed to be excessive or unreasonable, agency personnel bear the responsibility and duty to intercede and report their observations to a supervisor.

The definition of a "reportable force" incident by department policy is one *in which an on-duty department employee, or off-duty employee whose occupation is a factor, uses any deadly force, any less-lethal control device, or any physical force (including canine deployment):*

- *To compel a person to comply with the employee's directions, or efforts to gain control;*
- *To prevent escape or overcome resistance by a suspect during an arrest or detention;*
- *To defend any person from an aggressive action by a suspect*

When that force employed results in the injury, reported injury, or suspected injury of another person.

Reportable force exceptions:

- The use of a firm grip or "control holds" to control only, which does not result in injury or the appearance of injury (e.g. the use of a grip to control the suspect's hands while searching or handcuffing); or
- That force needed to overcome the passive resistance due to physical disability or intoxication that does not result in injury or the appearance of injury (e.g. lifting an intoxicated person to a standing position)

Deadly force as defined by agency policy is that force which is *reasonably anticipated and intended to create a substantial likelihood of causing death or very serious injury.*

There were no instances in which officer(s) deployed deadly force in 2023. In all cases, more than one officer was present during the application of force.

Physical injuries to agency personnel and subjects were minor when reported, and consisted mainly of scrapes, bruises, and aggravations of prior, existing injuries. All incidents reviewed were determined to be justified uses of force that adhered substantially with agency policy and procedure while also meeting the legal standard of objective reasonableness.

The following are brief descriptions of the incidents that qualified as reviewable uses of force by agency personnel and the circumstances surrounding them.

01/27/2023

Report #23-003696

At 2151 hours, officers responded to the Residence Inn Hotel for a reported disturbance that was quickly determined to be a case of felony domestic violence. The arrested male, who was initially cooperative, escalated his behavior while being escorted to the transporting police vehicle. The subject had to be physically forced into the prisoner compartment of the cruiser. Once confined within the vehicle, he escaped from his seatbelt, turned to his side, and attempted to kick out the window of the police car. Officers re-engaged the subject and applied a hobble restraint to control his feet during transport. Upon arrival at the city jail, the male's behavior continued to deteriorate. Due to his actions and verbal statements to officers, the subject was placed on mental health protocol and twice had to be placed into a jail restraint chair due to squaring off with police and corrections officers. The male was later transported to Ahuja Hospital for a psychiatric evaluation.

05/15/2023

Report #23-019311

At 2030 hours, officers were dispatched to the parking lot of the Pavilion Shopping Mall to assist the parents of a juvenile female refusing to enter her mother's vehicle to be transported for an evaluation by medical professionals after allegedly consuming excessive amounts of over-the-counter medications. Officers placed the female into handcuffs to restrict and control her movements after thwarting her attempt to leave the scene on foot as they awaited the arrival of paramedics. The female responded by spitting at officers and attempting to kick them connecting with one officer's leg above his knee. The female was escorted to the ground to prevent any additional injury from her kicks as well as to apply a spit hood to prevent any contamination to first responders. Upon the arrival of Beachwood Fire personnel, the female was transported under police guard to a local hospital for further evaluation and treatment.

07/25/2023

Report #23-030120

At 1537 hours, officers responded to Giant Eagle for a reported shoplifting incident. The adult female detained for the offense attempted to flee after being advised that she would be placed under arrest. She broke free of the grasp of the arresting officer, then pushed through the loss prevention agent who was attempting to block her from exiting the store. As she entered the outer lobby to evade arrest, the female was confronted by the backup officer who was entering the supermarket. That officer grabbed the fleeing suspect and performed a controlled takedown with both the officer and subject ending up on the floor. The female was quickly handcuffed, turned over and placed in an upright, seated recovery position. She was then escorted outside to await the arrival of paramedics who were summoned to the scene to evaluate any potential injuries from her resistance. She refused to be evaluated by paramedics.

VEHICLE PURSUITS

There were (5) incidents in 2023 that met the criteria for a vehicle pursuit and subsequent review. A vehicle pursuit is defined by the current agency policy as: *an event involving one or more peace officers attempting to apprehend a suspect who is trying to avoid arrest while operating a motor vehicle by using high speed or other evasive tactics, such as disregarding traffic warning signs, stop signs, red lights, driving off a roadway, turning suddenly or driving in a legal manner but willfully failing to yield to an officer's signal to stop.* All the vehicle pursuits were evaluated for policy compliance and training value.

01/20/2023

Report #23-002601

At approximately 0211 hours, officers responded to the area of Cedar Road westbound for a report of a solo Parma Police unit in pursuit of a fleeing violator. The reason for the pursuit was not known. The fleeing violator never actually entered city limits; it continued westbound on Cedar Road on the Lyndhurst and South Euclid portions of the adjoining roadway prior to entering the city of University Heights. One officer sought permission and was authorized by a shift supervisor to engage the pursuit and render backup as needed to what was eventually determined to be a two-officer Parma Police unit. The subject vehicle's location was no longer known by the time this agency's officer arrived at the Warrensville Center Road intersection where he located the Parma Police unit. Further attempts to locate the fleeing vehicle by both agencies ceased at that time.

05/18/23

Report #23-019807

At approximately 2346 hours, a Lyndhurst Police unit was reported to be in pursuit of a stolen vehicle associated with a burglary heading southbound on Richmond Road entering city limits. The Lyndhurst unit reportedly ended their pursuit. A Beachwood officer intercepted the vehicle at the Fairmount intersection and attempted to initiate a traffic stop again. The stolen vehicle fled; officers pursued. The vehicle eventually turned into the parking garage of a Cleveland Clinic building located on Science Park Drive and the driver fled from it on foot. The driver was subsequently apprehended near the intersection of Richmond & South Woodland Roads.

07/26/2023

Report #23-030216

At 0205 hours, an officer on routine patrol observed a speeding motorist on Cedar Road heading eastbound. As the officer attempted to catch up to the motorist to conduct a traffic stop, the vehicle proceeded through a red traffic signal at the Richmond Road intersection and continued. The officer pursued, but the vehicle entered I-271 southbound with the driver showing no intent to slow or stop. The officer self-terminated the pursuit of the vehicle shortly after entering I-271 southbound. The vehicle was later determined to be a stolen vehicle and the operator was not identified.

07/30/2023

Report #23-030818

At approximately 0105 hours, an officer attempted a traffic stop of a motor vehicle on Cedar Road at the Legacy Village driveway. The vehicle failed to yield and continued to drive through the parking lot of the shopping center with the officer in pursuit. The driver eventually stopped at the entrance to the Hyatt Place Hotel where he quickly exited the vehicle. He then attempted to enter the lobby of the hotel while ignoring the orders of the officer to remain with the vehicle. The motorist was apprehended and subsequently arrested for operating a vehicle under the influence.

At 0604 hours, an officer attempted to stop a motorist clocked at 120 mph on I-271 southbound. The officer pursued the violator south from Cedar Road, then followed onto 480 westbound to conduct a traffic stop. The motorist fled and began to drive even more evasively and recklessly once the officer approached from behind. The officer self-terminated his attempt to stop the vehicle.

BIAS-BASED POLICING

A fundamental right guaranteed by the constitutions of both this state and nation is equal protection under the law. Along with this right to equal protection is the fundamental right to be free from unreasonable searches and seizures by governmental agents. Citizens are free to move about in public places without police interference so long as they obey the law. All citizens are equally entitled to be free from the depredations of criminals, and to drive and walk our public ways safe from the actions of reckless and careless drivers.

This agency is charged with protecting these fundamental rights and delivering the same law enforcement service for all, regardless of race, ethnicity, national origin, religion, sex, sexual orientation, gender identity or expression, economic status, age, cultural group, disability, or affiliation with any non-criminal group.

The purpose of the bias-based policing policy is to strictly prohibit bias-based policing tactics as well as to affirm the agency's commitment to policing that is fair and objective. The policy outlines responsibilities for agency members, supervisory personnel, and the administration. Nothing in the policy is intended to prohibit personnel from considering protected characteristics in combination with other credible information in furtherance of their legitimate law enforcement objectives.

Officers are required to utilize body worn cameras and police cruiser dash cameras to document law enforcement encounters in the performance of their official duties. This provides transparency and protects officers and the agency from baseless allegations.

It is the policy of this department to patrol in a proactive manner and to aggressively investigate suspicious persons and circumstances. Officers are expected to enforce criminal and motor vehicle laws using well-reasoned discretion while insisting that citizens will only be detained when there exists at a minimum, reasonable articulable suspicion that an offense has been, is being, or will be committed. Officers, as community caretakers, are also entrusted to investigate circumstances that would lead them to believe that a person is in distress or need of aid. Members of the Beachwood Police Department receive training in various topics related to their patrol and enforcement tactics. The need to respect the rights of all citizens to be free from unreasonable government intrusion is paramount. Patrol shift supervisors are required to monitor the enforcement activity of their subordinates to ensure that officers are conducting themselves within the guidelines of this policy and applicable law.

The following aspects of officer activity are tracked and examined to ensure that the policies of the agency are being adhered to:

1. Motor vehicle stops resulting in citations
2. Motor vehicle stops resulting in warnings
3. Citizen complaints of illegal profiling

Beachwood officers conducted 2,940 traffic stops in 2023. Nearly 2,000 traffic citations were issued, and approximately 1,400 warnings, both written and verbal in nature, were provided due to officers' encounters with the public which included routine patrol, special attention enforcement details stemming from citizen complaints, traffic crash investigations, as well as various other situations that resulted from officers investigating suspicious and/or criminal behaviors. Of those citations issued, 42.32% were issued to individuals identified as being white, 52.53% as being African American, 1.88% as being Asian, and 3.27% being of other races or their race was not known or reported. Fifty-one percent (51%) of citations were issued to males and 49% were issued to females. As for the warnings provided, 41.87% were given to individuals identified as being white, 50.36% as being African American, 2.21% as being Asian, and 5.56% being of other races or their race was not known or reported. Again, approximately 51% of warnings were given to males and 49% were given to females.

The agency received no substantiated complaints of racial profiling in 2023.

MAYOR'S COURT REPORT

Beachwood Mayor's Court processes and hears all uncontested non-serious misdemeanor offenses. If a case is contested, the case is then transferred to the Shaker Heights Municipal Court in Shaker Heights, Ohio. All felony or serious offenses are automatically processed by either Cuyahoga County Common Pleas Court, in the case of a felony, or Shaker Heights Municipal Court, in the case of a serious offense.

In 2023, 1,617 traffic and 8 criminal cases were filed with the Beachwood Mayor's Court. A total of 227 parking violations were filed with the court.

In 2023, Mayor's Court transferred 66 contested cases to Shaker Heights Municipal Court. There were 790 cases filed directly with Cuyahoga County Common Pleas Court, Cuyahoga County Prosecutor's Office, Cuyahoga County Juvenile Court, or Shaker Heights Municipal Court.

JAIL FACILITY

In 2023, 565 people were processed into the Beachwood City Jail, 350 males and 215 females. We housed 32 inmates for the City of Pepper Pike, who contracts with the City of Beachwood for jail services. We did not house any time servers in 2023. We housed 1 prisoner for a short time for Hunting Valley Police Department as mutual aid request.

Beachwood officers booked 532 people into the jail. Thefts and related crimes account for the majority of these arrests followed by outstanding warrants. Beachwood officers also arrested 68 juveniles that were processed into juvenile booking. At the request of the Cuyahoga County Juvenile Detention Center, 4 juveniles were transported to their facility to be held. Juvenile arrests decreased by 10 from 2022 (-14%) and adult arrests decreased by 100 from 2022 (-15%). The total numbers of arrests were similar in 2022 and 2021, which are significantly down from years prior to 2020. This is contributed to the continued Covid-19 Pandemic and recent changes to arrest and court policies, including driving under suspension.

The Cuyahoga County Sheriff's Department continues to house time servers sentenced under the Ohio Revised Code. As a result of this, the number of time servers being housed in the Beachwood City Jail has remained relatively low since 2017.

In 2023, 32 people were housed for the City of Pepper Pike, which resulted in the revenue of \$3,540.00 to the City of Beachwood. The housing of prisoners for other cities, with a contract or by mutual aid, will continue to be monitored to ensure the daily operations of the jail are not affected.

The jail was inspected in 2023 by the State of Ohio, Bureau of Adult Detention, and found to be in full compliance with all of the applicable state jail standards.

The primary stated goal for the Beachwood City Jail is to maintain a facility that is safe, secure, in good repair and in compliance with state standards. As noted above, the State of Ohio, Bureau of Adult Detention, found the jail to be in full compliance. In addition, the fire department and county health officials inspected the jail and found no deficiencies. The jail was inspected weekly by staff for security concerns and monthly for any health, safety and sanitation concerns. No staff members or inmates sustained injuries from incidents within the facility keeping us on track to achieve and maintain our stated goals.

SPECIALTY UNITS

Police Mountain Bike Unit

The Beachwood Police Department mountain bicycle unit was staffed again as a part time specialist assignment for the 2023 calendar year. The unit is voluntary with members being selected who have expressed a desire and willingness to take part. All officers in the unit have maintained and are expected to maintain a level of physical fitness which will allow them to continue to participate in the unit.

One of the biggest advantages to having a bicycle patrol unit within the city is the ability those officers deployed on bikes have to make personal contact with our citizens. Bicycle Unit Officers are deployed at every city special event which takes place during weather allowable to ride bikes. Officers are able to converse with citizens, go over safety tips with children, and answer any questions or concerns which may be brought to them. Being visible and around citizens in normal everyday activities lends itself to a better relationship between the community and police department.

The bicycle unit operates at any and all times of the day, any day of the week, with the only limitation in deployment being inclement weather. As such, the unit typically has no operations November through March. When operating, the unit is highly effective in developing valuable contacts with businesses, religious institutions, schools, and citizens. These developed contacts can prove to be mutually beneficial throughout the year. There are three bikes in perfect working order and one trailer hitch mount to fit the current police SUV models.

The bicycle unit is also capable of patrolling areas which are not accessible by car, such as city park trails, playgrounds, and locations without road access. The bike unit is also more capable of stealth patrol given their quiet nature. These traits are vital when patrolling targeted crime areas at night such as apartment and hotel parking lots. While deployed on a bike, officers are relied upon to contribute to the daily calls for service within reason.

This unit has proven very beneficial as a means to positively interact with the community and to deter criminal behavior in targeted areas. In the next year, the mountain bike unit will continue to provide this valuable service to the city.

EDGE SWAT

The EDGE SWAT TEAM is a multi-jurisdictional team comprised of eight cities: Beachwood, Shaker Heights, Euclid, Cleveland Heights, South Euclid, University Heights, Pepper Pike, and Bratenahl. The team currently consists of approximately 30 Operators, 10 SWAT Medics, 4 SWAT Canines, 4 Marksman/Observers, and additional bomb techs and negotiators.

EDGE SWAT TEAM Leadership

Commander Mike Janson (EPD), Assistant Commander Dave Carpenter (EPD), Assistant Commander Josh Schultz (EPD). There are multiple Team Leaders including: Mike O'Conner (SEPD), Steve Wilson (SEPD), Matt Lewis (SHPD), and Marc Imbrogno (UHPD).

EDGE SWAT ACTIVITY

In 2023 the EDGE SWAT TEAM participated in a total of 72 search and arrest warrants. Of these, 26 warrants were executed for narcotics-related offenses. Additionally, 41 warrants were conducted for robbery, homicide, and aggravated assault cases.

ADDITIONS AND UPDATES

As was requested on the previous end of year report, the spotlight was fixed on the Beachwood Bearcat. In 2023, EDGE SWAT also ordered a new armored vehicle which is expected to be deployed in 2024. The team maintains training on advanced tactics such as explosive breaching and hostage rescue techniques to be ready for all types of situations which our team may encounter.

2024 PROPOSALS

As was proposed in 2023, it would be beneficial to add an "in vehicle" radio in the Beachwood Bearcat which works with current portable radios. Also, we should move forward with the replacement of the two issued LWRC M6 rifles and suppressors, which were issued in 2016 and switch to the Daniel Defense model. The information on replacements has been forwarded to EDGE SWAT.

Field Training Officers

The Beachwood Police Department Field Training Officer Program trained three new lateral transfer officers from the end of January to the beginning of May in 2023. Their probationary period was completed on January 30, 2024. All three officers completed their probationary period. One entry level officer started their training in December of 2023. The program incorporated seven Field Training Officers. The program utilized the traditional four phases of field training with a two week orientation to start the probationary officers' career at the Beachwood Police Department. The entire program is expanded over approximately twelve weeks.

New in 2023

The program's training curriculum was adjusted from the CLEA policies to the Lexipol policies. The resources and tests had to be changed to reflect the Lexipol policies. Resources were reviewed for accuracy. The program had the probationary officers complete an anonymous evaluation on each FTO, but that was replaced with a new evaluation questionnaire and an in-person interview.

Challenges

During the training program, outside training was recommended for individual trainees, but local resources for training were limited. In-person training is preferred, but due to limited local training, on-demand online training was employed in the subject of report writing. Keeping up with the supervisor reviews during the midpoint of each phase is a challenge with multiple trainees. The FTO coordinator had to utilize phone interviews with trainees due conflicting work schedules. The Lexipol policy numbering system is not permanent and the numbering system changes if a policy is removed. The policy numbers are used as the guide for resources to cover in the training curriculum, so they will need to be reviewed regularly for accuracy. The curriculum had to be adjusted at the end of 2023 due to a policy removal.

Future Improvements

An attempt will be made to provide senior FTOs an updated FTO refresher. Training will be sought, but limited local training and conflicts with potential manpower will make scheduling training for the FTOs challenging. All FTOs get the mandatory CPT training which keeps them up to date on legal training and other important law enforcement subjects.

Conclusion

The program's streamlined training curriculum continues to make it easy for FTOs to know what resources need to be covered. Outside training when available, appears to be a nice supplement to the knowledge and training our Beachwood FTOs are providing.

Recruitment

For the 2023 year, the Beachwood Police Department utilized the National Testing Network database to assist in the recruiting process. This allowed both Lateral and Entry Level candidates to upload their application into a portal, select their written examination dates, and locations, all for the convenience of the applicant.

For the Entry Level Patrol Officer position, the application window was open from January 12, 2024 until February 14, 2024. The short window allowed me to look into different avenues of recruiting, outside of police academies. I sent emails to the contacts for Criminology, Criminal Justice, or equivalent major to the following Universities:

Cleveland State University
Case Western Reserve University

I received correspondence from John Carroll University and Kent State University.

I sent the job posting to the following Police Academies:

Kent State University Police Academy

A total of 17 Lateral Transfer applicants took our test. Of those, 3 failed the National Testing Network examination. A total of 5 progressed onto the background investigations.

A total of 21 candidates completed the requirements for the National Testing Network test for Entry Level Patrol Officer in early 2024. The hiring numbers for both tests is currently pending.

A recommendation to improve the applicant numbers for Entry Level Patrol Officers would be a longer application window for the Entry Level Patrol Officer position. This would allow me to include a few interested Beachwood Patrolmen to assist in visiting Police Academies and/or Universities to recruit in person. The recommendation for the National Testing Network from the previous report was taken into consideration and acted on. The rolling lateral list has been used and should allow for continual lateral applicants. I believe these decisions will assist both the candidate and the department in recruiting for the foreseeable future.

SCHOOLS

This report will explain what The City of Beachwood Police Department and associated school officers have accomplished in the Beachwood City School System. The report will address areas and issues that the officers are currently working to improve, and any recommendations.

Background and Beginning of the Program

The agreement was made between the city and the School Board for police officers to work in the Beachwood City Schools. This took effect on August 1, 2015, and was renewed November, 2020, expired in June 2023, and currently are in negotiations for the new contract. Officer CJ Piro served as Director of Security from the start of this program until February 2023. Officer Colton Pekarski was named Director of Security starting in April 2023. This agreement places officers in all 5 of the Beachwood City Schools including Beachwood High School, Beachwood Middle School, Hilltop Elementary, Bryden Elementary, and Fairmount Elementary. All of the officers assigned to the schools have worked and rotated throughout all of the schools. This was done so that all of the officers would be familiar with the layout and daily operation of all of the school district's buildings. Once familiarity was established, it was agreed that officers would be assigned to one building. By assigning an officer to a building this allowed the officer to specifically know the daily operation of a building and its occupants. While on duty, school officers provide safety and protection to students, staff, and school buildings. They are involved in student and staff arrival and dismissal from school, patrol grounds, lock/unlock doors, and watch security cameras, and monitor daily school activities such as lunch, recess, hallway activity during class switches.

Fairmount School / B.O.E.

Officers Assigned to the Building: Officer Welch and Officer Duffy until September 2023. Because of manpower issues no officers were solely assigned to Fairmount School from September 2023 until current. However, school officers would volunteer to cover Fairmount for the majority of school days.

Police officer's basic daily tasks:

- Officers check doors and premises. Monitor the Apollo before care program.
- Officers monitor student arrival to school.
- Officers patrol school grounds Monitor recess, specifically when students are out of the building. Be stationed in a visible area to monitor and be seen by visitors, students and staff entering the buildings.
- Officers will monitor the two early student dismissal times.
- Officers will monitor afternoon student dismissal.

Summary:

Fairmount Elementary has only Preschool age students and houses the board offices for school executive staff. Since officers have been assigned at the Fairmont School Building, the situation has been very positive. Parents and students that we interact with have nothing but praise for police officers being at the schools. Officers have done well proactively recognizing areas of concern and addressing those issues. Preschool staff are very cognizant of building security and are quick to report anything that is out of place. Staff and Officers complete all of the State mandated school safety drills on time. The areas of concern at Fairmount Elementary is that they need more cameras. In addition, there are safety concerns with a public city sidewalk going through the playground area from Deptford Drive to the city aquatic center. In addition, this playground area is not fenced in. However, the preschool will move to Bryden when the new school is built in January 2026 so there will no longer be students at Fairmount Elementary. Officers and staff understand these concerns with the playground and the students are always supervised. There have been manpower issues therefore currently there are no officers permanently assigned to Fairmount Elementary because Fairmount Elementary has the least amount of students. When there is more staffing for school officers then there will be officers assigned to Fairmount Elementary until the students officially move to Bryden Elementary.

Bryden School

Police officer basic daily timeline:

- Officers check the doors and premises.
- Officers monitor students' arrival to school. Officers assist with traffic control patrol school grounds
Building walk through / check that doors are locked. After the walk through, officers position themselves by the front door to monitor any visitors.
- Make periodic checks of outdoor areas during snack breaks. Students will be outside pretty much all morning, depending on the weather.
- Officers are outside monitoring for recesses.
- Officers monitor lunch periods. Random checks through the school. Officers are stationed in a visible area to monitor and be seen by visitors, students and staff entering the buildings.
- Assist with car rider dismissal in parking lot. Direct cars to open spaces. Parents park and walk into the gym for child pickup.

Summary:

Bryden Elementary School has kindergarten, 1st grade, and 2nd grade students. Since officers have been assigned at Bryden Elementary many positive changes have been made. Bryden Elementary is in need of more, higher definition, security cameras as well as a more workable entry point for visitor/staff interaction. However, there are plans to build a new Bryden Elementary that is scheduled to be completed in January of 2026. In the meantime, officers are aware of the shortcomings and are focusing their attention on them. Staff and Officers at Bryden Elementary complete all of the State mandated school safety drills on time.

Hilltop School

Police officer's basic daily timeline:

- Begin shift.
- Officers check the doors and premises.
- Officers will monitor student arrival at school. Assist with traffic control.
- Patrol school grounds, check doors, be stationed in a visible area to monitor and be seen by visitors, students and staff entering the buildings.
- Monitor recess, specifically when students are out of the building.
- Be stationed in a visible area to monitor and be seen by visitors, students and staff entering the buildings.
- Officers will monitor afternoon student dismissal.

Summary:

Hilltop Elementary School has grades three, four, and five. Since officers have been assigned to Hilltop Elementary many positive changes have been made. The addition of officers has greatly improved the safety of students, staff, and visitors attending Hilltop. Hilltop Elementary is in need of more, higher definition security cameras. Similar to Bryden Elementary, Hilltop Elementary is in need of a more workable entry point for visitors/staff interaction. However, there are plans to build a new Hilltop Elementary School that is scheduled to be completed in January of 2026. Again, officers are aware of the shortcomings and are focusing attention on them. Staff and Officers at Hilltop Elementary complete all of the State mandated school safety drills on time. Hilltop Elementary has safety concerns, because of the baseball fields, and setting of the park-like playground, draws a lot of after hour visitors and some visitors during the day. Hilltop Elementary created a dedicated office space for school officers.

Middle School

Police officer's basic daily timeline:

- Begin Shift
- Officers will primarily monitor building entry, students, staff, and school bus arrival.
- Officers are in the hallways in between each period. Officers patrol inside and outside. Monitor times when students would be outside of the building for gym class. Officers are stationed in a visible area to monitor and be seen by visitors, students and staff entering the buildings.
- Monitor lunches, be inside the lunchroom.
- Traffic control. Monitor student dismissal.

Summary:

Beachwood Middle School has grades sixth, seventh, and eighth. Since officers have been assigned to the Middle School many positive changes have been made. Out of all of the buildings in the district, the Middle School has the most security cameras, per building size. In addition, Beachwood Schools has purchased more cameras to be installed at the Middle School. Also, there have been more key fobs installed, allowing for easier access for all officers to enter different areas of the Middle School. The Middle School recently created a dedicated office space only for school officers. Beachwood Schools have purchased audible alarms to be installed on doors labeled "emergency fire exit only" so we can ensure that no student do not leave out these doors or let any unwanted visitors inside. The Middle School completes all of the State mandated school safety drills on time.

High School

Police officer's basic daily timeline:

- Begin shift.
- Officers will primarily monitor building entry, students, staff, and school bus arrival. Assist with flow of traffic in parking lot.
- Patrol school grounds. Check doors. Officers are stationed in a visible area to monitor and be seen by visitors, students and staff entering the buildings.
- Monitor lunchroom.
- Patrol school grounds. Check doors. Be stationed in a visible area to monitor and be seen by visitors, students and staff entering the buildings.
- Officers monitor afternoon student dismissal.

Summary:

Beachwood High School has grades ninth, tenth, eleventh, and twelfth. The High School is an extremely busy building and it hosts 3 different Excel Tecc programs bringing in students from 11 different school districts. These are vocational and learning opportunities. The school restaurant (The Bistro) runs from mid-October until late April and is open to the public on Wednesday, Thursday and Friday. The high school Principal, Mr. Chase and Assistant Principal, Ms. Erkins, have previous experience working with a Police Officer in the schools. They have a very good understanding of when and how to involve the police. They consistently inform me of any issues. They handle all of the school matters without police interaction, but will not hesitate to involve the police when needed. The High School is on schedule with all of the school safety drills. Since beginning work at the high school, tighter security procedures were instituted. The staff has responded well to officers in the building. Many evening sporting events have an officer detailed to provide security. In addition, there have been ID badges that have been implemented. More cameras have been installed inside the High School. In addition, there are more key fob access points installed at the High School for easier access for officers to respond.

Closing

Officers have helped to make the Beachwood City Schools a safer place and every building is more secure. I worked with Beachwood School's administration to implement a school safety sheet in every classroom that explains lockdown procedures to make sure all staff and students are on the same page. The schools started to implement ID badge key fobs for the High School with the plan to implement ID badge fobs at all the other schools as well. There has been new trauma kits installed in various places throughout the schools. A school safety folder was created for dispatchers and officers to have access to that has for each school the directory of staff, floor plans, evacuation plans, school safety plans, lockdown procedures, and more. Officers are required to do tours at all the schools to be completed by the end of the 2023-2024 school year to become more familiar with them. There has been a large increase in officers from patrol being present inside the buildings during the school day and in the evenings for after school events. The more patrol officers are with the layout and operation of the schools the safer they will be.

Police officer led safety discussions brought security, drilling, planning, and preparation to the forefront of everyone's mind. Security drills have went well in all of the schools. Officers have done classroom and safety presentations at all of the schools. The majority of the entire police department have received active shooter training either at the Middle School or High School. There are plans to do annual active shooter drills with the police department in the Beachwood Schools. Another improvement from the previous school year, the district has purchased additional security cameras. While most of the buildings had some of the same shortcomings relating to cameras, the purchase of new cameras demonstrates that the district takes safety and security seriously and are taking steps to remediate those issues. All of the principals have mutual goals and are extremely easy to work with. Every building's administration has open lines of communication with the police officers. They provide feedback and ideas when implementing new security measures.

In 2023, Beachwood Police completed 40 incident reports at school district buildings. There were 22 incident reports at Beachwood High School, 9 incident reports at Beachwood Middle School, 5 incident reports at Hilltop Elementary School, 4 incident reports at Fairmount Elementary School, and 3 incident reports at Bryden Elementary School. The number of incident reports have increased over the past year because the police department is documenting more incidents. Having officers detailed to the schools and increasing the frequency officers from patrol have entered the schools has improved the relationship between the community and the police department. In each of the school buildings you will observe, you would frequently see interaction between the students and the officers assigned to the buildings. At all of the schools, officers will be seen in the cafeteria during a portion of the lunch periods and often students will often ask the officers to join them for lunch. In the elementary schools, officers will be outside when students are on recess. While working sporting events it is not uncommon to see students from all of the schools introducing officers to their parents.

Dr. Hardis supports Beachwood School Officers working with officers from other school districts. The agreement to have officers detailed to the Beachwood City Schools is working well, and officers look forward to continuing to protect and serve in the district.

COMMUNITY RELATIONS

The Beachwood Police department and the City of Beachwood pride itself on its engagement with the residential and business communities. During 2023 the Beachwood police department has proactively collaborated with apartment complexes, medical institutions, banking institutions, and nursing care/independent living facilities. Any business interested in working with the Beachwood police department on any concerning matter can speak with the department's business liaison officer, Lt. Kevin Owens.

The Beachwood police department has ongoing collaborative relationships with apartment complexes in the city. These facilities include, The Vantage, The Vue, The Hiatus, R.H. Myers, Stone Gardens, Wiggins Place, The Village community, Ahuja Hospital, the UH Beachwood Medical Center, and Beachwood Place Mall. Going into 2024 the Beachwood police have received interest from the Goddard School on Green Road, the Cleveland Clinic Rehabilitation facility on Science Park, and University Hospitals Rehabilitation facility on Harvard Road. In addition to active shooter simulation training these facilities also benefit from ALICE training. ALICE is a national critical incident preparedness training course. ALICE is an acronym for Alert, Inform, Lockdown, Counter, and Evacuate. The Beachwood police department has officers trained as teachers of this program that can bring ALICE training to facilities in the city upon request.

Officers provided safety talks in the past to several communities within the city, specifically, the nursing & independent living facilities at R. H. Myers apartments, Stone Gardens, Wiggins Place, and the gated community of The Village. Residents and personnel of the apartment and business communities can request such a speaking engagement to address any concerns.

Officers provide safety and police response meetings with the banks in the city. The Beachwood police work to meet with each bank annually. The conversation focuses on safety within the bank upon a police response. A police response can be generated from a call for service to police by bank personnel, a bank customer, or accidentally, from a false alarm, due to a medical matter, or an actual critical incident. Our engagement with the banks in these meetings foster a cooperative partnership with the bank personnel's reaction to the police response. Any financial institution can schedule such a meeting upon request.

The University Hospital Beachwood Medical Center has met with Lt. Owens to discuss the unique nature of emergency response to a critical incident at a medical facility providing ongoing 24/7 patient care. In 2023, the first active shooter simulated training took place at the University Hospital Beachwood Medical Center that combined a slow-walked police response mixed with the facility policy to a critical incident followed by a debriefing with those involved. It was informative and is expected to be repeated in 2024. Upon request, the Beachwood police are happy to provide this level of mutual training for facilities within the city.

Beachwood Place continues to benefit from the license plate reader cameras surrounding the mall at various locations. The mall also continues to receive police visibility from the staffed mini-station on the upper level food court area of the mall. The Beachwood police are proud to be part of the safety and comfort of the Beachwood Place Mall customers' shopping experience.

All of these collaborative relationships proactively combine to bring greater safety to the community and those who live, work, and visit Beachwood. We look forward to cultivating these relationships under the direction of Chief McLaughlin into the future in 2024.




