

OHIO COLLABORATIVE POLICY

“The Ohio Collaborative, a 12-person panel of law enforcement experts and community leaders from throughout the state established Ohio's first state law enforcement standards on August 28, 2015. These standards will hold everyone accountable and instill a greater confidence with the public. The Collaborative works closely with partners, including the community and law enforcement agencies, to implement new standards. All law enforcement agencies are expected to meet or exceed these standards as they develop policies and procedures to meet new expectations.”

The Ohio Collaborative Policy now consists of seven groups. Each group contains policies that each agency must show and maintain compliance by submitting supporting documents. In 2024, The Beachwood Police Department maintained full compliance in groups one through five and has earned their provisional certificate in groups six and seven. The Beachwood Police Department will continue to maintain our certification and earn any new certificates as they become available.

DISPATCH

The Beachwood Dispatch Center is responsible for processing all 911 and non-emergency calls, as well as radio communications for police, fire, and emergency medical services for the communities of Beachwood and Pepper Pike.

In total, the dispatch center received 63,490 incoming calls, 11,601 of which were 911 calls. 100% of calls received by the dispatch center, including 911 calls and non-emergency calls, were answered within 15 seconds.

In February 2024, Dispatcher Libby Downey joined the Beachwood Dispatch team.

Erika Westbroks, Carrie Dearden and Lindsay Grisafo transitioned into their new roles as Lead Dispatchers in March, joining Lead Dispatcher Emily Joseph in overseeing dispatch operations.

In September, Lead Dispatcher Carrie Dearden along with Dispatchers Lindsay Nelson and Gina Chintella attended the IXII Advanced Communications Training Officer course.

Throughout the year, Lead Dispatcher Erika Westbroks attended three recruitment events at Cuyahoga Community College to provide potential recruits with information about a career at our dispatch center.

In October, Lead Dispatchers Emily Joseph and Lindsay Grisafo attended the Northeast Ohio Amber Alert Conference to receive training on the issuance of Amber Alerts and support for families of missing children.

Members of the dispatch team assisted with operations for several community events throughout the year, including February Freeze and the Beachwood Blackout Solar Eclipse Watch Party.

TRAFFIC

CRASH ACTIVITY

In 2024 there were seven hundred fifteen (715) motor vehicle accidents reported to the Beachwood Police Department. One hundred sixty-seven (167), occurred on private property. These accidents usually involve minor damage to the vehicles and were self-reported by the participants. There were sixteen (16) accidents that occurred on public roadways where the parties involved went to the police station and filled out the accident report themselves, with no further police involvement. These accidents are usually of a minor nature and the individuals involved did not report the crash to the police at the time of occurrence.

Due to the limited enforcement options and the limited input to the design features of private property, statistics from private property are not used in the following comparison statistics. The accidents that occurred on public roadways and were self-reported are not included in the comparisons as there is no official verification as to the validity of the report.

There was a total of five hundred forty-eight (548) street accidents investigated by the Beachwood Police Department in 2024. Of the five hundred forty-eight (548) street accidents one hundred fifty-three (153) involved personal injury.

FATAL CRASHES

There were three (3) fatal traffic crashes in 2024.

CAUSATIVE FACTORS AND ENFORCEMENT

When looking at causative factors, failure to maintain an assured clear distance ahead was listed as the causative factor in two hundred fifty (250) crashes. In many cases, speed can be directly attributed to this type of crash. However, the continuing trend is an increase in cell phone use, i.e., calling, texting, e-mailing etc. and many crashes are related to distracted driving and or failure to provide full time and attention to the operation of a motor vehicle.

Failure to Yield was listed as the causative factor in sixty-five (65) crash reports. The State of Ohio (OH-1) crash report does not differentiate between the various "failure to yield" violations.

A review of our enforcement activity revealed the following:

- Thirty-four citations issued for Failure to Yield while turning left.
- Seventy-five citations issued for Failure to Yield when changing lanes.

Improper lane change was listed as the causative factor on eighty-nine (89) reports.
Reasonable control was listed as the causative factor in sixty-three (63) reports.
Red light violation was listed as the causative factor on seventeen (17) reports.
Improper backing was listed as the causative factor on sixty-nine (69) reports.

TRAFFIC COMPLAINTS

The Beachwood Police Department receives some type of traffic complaint or concern from a motorist almost every day. The complaints range from suspected intoxicated drivers to a simple complaint of debris in the roadway.

When a traffic complaint is received our response is normally one of a few options. If the complaint is about a missing traffic sign or malfunctioning traffic signal, the traffic bureau will coordinate the adjustment, replacement, or repair. Many times, the complainant simply has a question that may need to be answered.

If the complaint involves motorists not obeying some type of traffic law, a police unit is dispatched, and the complaint is also reviewed by the traffic bureau for further police response. After review, a special attention notice is usually posted, and officers direct their discretionary enforcement time to the problem area.

In 2024, the police department received three hundred fifty-nine (359) traffic complaints called into our dispatch center. The number of complaints does not necessarily reflect the true total, as there are times when calls are directed to the traffic bureau, individuals speak directly to officers on the road, or complaints are sometimes relayed by other means such as email.

Applicable complaints are posted on a “traffic special attention” board in roll call and via email. In response, officers either give the area special attention by frequently patrolling the area (the most common response), or they may set up on a traffic detail targeting the violation(s) that are the subject of the complaint for lengthier periods of time. In 2024, officers logged ninety (90) traffic details for various violations such as: speed, reckless operation, O.V.I., stop signs, and red-light violations.

O.V.I. ARRESTS AND ENFORCEMENT

In 2024 the Beachwood Police Department made twenty-two (22) arrests for persons who were Operating a Vehicle while Under the Influence of Alcohol and /or Drugs (O.V.I.). Thirteen (13) of the arrested were male violators and nine (9) were female violators.

Twelve (12) of the arrested people submitted to a breath sample with the average Blood Alcohol Content (B.A.C.) level being .176 which is over twice the legal limit of .08. The highest reading was .346, which is over four (4) times the legal limit. Ten (10) people refused to provide a sample as required by law.

Two (2) of the violators had at least one (1) prior conviction. Three (3) of the violators had at least two (2) prior convictions. There were four (4) traffic crash related O.V.I.'s in 2024.

OVERALL TRAFFIC ENFORCEMENT

Officers made approximately 2,160 traffic stops in 2024 that resulted in one of the following dispositions: citation issued, written warning, verbal warning, or arrest. There were four hundred seventeen (417) speeding citations issued, one hundred ninety-five (195) assured clear distance ahead citations, one hundred twenty (120) red light citations, four hundred thirty-two (432) vehicle registration violations, eighty-one (81) stop sign violations, and two hundred thirty-six (236) motorists were cited for driving under suspension. Three (3) citations were issued for violating the "Use of Electronic Communications Device While Driving" ordinance. Officers issued approximately one thousand thirty-three (1,033) citations and gave approximately one thousand thirty-seven (1,037) verbal or written warnings.

Overall, our traffic enforcement program is on target with our intentions to direct our focus on specific problem areas but not at the expense of other areas. We should maintain our consistent level of enforcement along our major streets and highways. We will continue to direct our discretionary enforcement time to the areas where complaints have been received.

When reviewing the traffic details that are logged in areas where we get complaints, often the officer spends 20-30 minutes and records that "no violations observed." The fact that a marked police cruiser / S.U.V. is in the area is a deterrent to the violations that result in complaints, but yield less enforcement. The use of police motorcycles can help that cause.

Traffic Signals

GPD Group is contracted to monitor the four traffic signal systems and forty (42) traffic signals owned by the City of Beachwood.

The monitoring of traffic signals is maintained by GPD Group which is a private company consisting of architects, engineers, and planners with expertise in traffic issues. All traffic signals are connected to a central operating software system known as Centracs. Officers also observe the traffic systems while on patrol to make sure that the signals are working properly.

While officers do not repair the traffic signals, they are often the first to discover there is a problem with a traffic signal. When a hardware problem is detected the Beachwood Police Department contacts Signal Service Company located in Warrensville Heights, OH. Signal Service Company responded to ninety-one (91) repair calls for the City of Beachwood in 2024.

TOWED VEHICLES

In 2024, the traffic bureau managed the Beachwood Police Department vehicle towing operation. This assignment includes overseeing the towing and impounding of vehicles seized during the routine performance of police duties and the disposal of all unclaimed vehicles in accordance with state law. Complete records of all vehicles towed, and their disposition are maintained.

In 2024 the Beachwood Police Department contracted with three tow companies to provide towing services. The companies were Interstate Towing, Mooney's Towing, and Rich's Towing. Police dispatchers used a rotation system to ensure that each company received an equitable share of the police tows. Exceptions to this rotation are if a tow company either cannot respond at the time requested or cannot respond with specific requested equipment such as a flatbed or a tow dolly. Towing companies were authorized to charge \$135 for a standard tow (additional fees for oversized vehicles, extra labor, i.e. use of a dolly, winch-outs, etc.) and \$25 per day for storage.

In 2024 there were five hundred thirty-eight (538) vehicles towed, this included forty-six (46) private tows. Private tows are those that the police may have called for at the request of the driver, but no further police action was taken.

Twenty-five (25) vehicles were unclaimed and scrapped or salvaged in 2024 with thirty-seven (37) vehicles currently being processed for disposal in accordance with Ohio law.

INVESTIGATIONS

The Beachwood Police Detective Bureau consists of three full-time detectives as well as a detective supervisor. One of the detectives was assigned full time to the Drug Enforcement Administration (DEA).

The detective bureau spent the majority of 2024 completing fraud, sexual assaults, robberies and other investigations that require extensive follow-up. The year concluded with the detective bureau filing charges with the Cuyahoga County Common Pleas court on 92 adults. Additionally, charges for 66 juveniles were also sent for review to the Cuyahoga County Juvenile Court.

Throughout the year, the detective bureau completed numerous background investigations for new police officer candidates and dispatcher positions, reflecting active recruitment efforts within the department. Although the police candidate background investigations are very time consuming, they are crucial for ensuring the integrity and suitability of candidates for law enforcement roles.

The S.P.E.A.R. (Specialized Patrol Enforcement and Response) unit collaborated directly with the detective bureau to identify areas of concern. The unit was established to take a proactive response not only to deter crime but to quickly respond and react to anyone violating the law. This unit was frequently deployed at Beachwood Place which allowed the officers assigned to the patrol division to be available to respond to other calls for service as well as actively patrol the city. Over the course of the year, the S.P.E.A.R. unit responded to 172 incidents and arrested 126 individuals. Of those arrests, forty-five of those individuals were arrested for felony crimes or warrants. The S.P.E.A.R. unit was able to utilize the two officers assigned to the Beachwood Place Field Office to assist with investigations as well as providing additional manpower when needed.

Overall, the Beachwood Police Detective Bureau has investigated various crimes and has also provided guidance and assistance to the uniform patrol officers who often manage fewer complex investigations as part of their routine duties. This structure helps in streamlining the investigation process, ensuring that both immediate response and in-depth investigations are managed efficiently.

TRAINING

The following report contains training that took place both at the Beachwood Police Department as well as at other facilities in 2024. The training at the department was conducted by certified Beachwood Police Department Instructors in Firearms, Taser, Pepper Ball, Pepper Gel Oleoresin Capsicum, A.L.I.C.E. (Alert, Lockdown, Inform, Counter, and Evacuate), Rescue Task Force, Subject Control, Emergency Vehicle Operations, First Aid /AED/CPR, and Standardized Field Sobriety Test's. In addition to the training listed above, the Beachwood Police Department also has officers that are members of the Eastside Departments Enforcement Group (EDGE) teams including Mobile Field Force, SWAT, Crisis Negotiators, Small Unmanned Aircraft System (DRONE) Unit, Accident Investigation Unit and Bomb Squad. The SWAT team trains 16 hours every month plus one full week per year. The other teams mentioned train eight hours per month. These teams/units serve seven municipalities. The Beachwood Police Department also has a member assigned to the Hillcrest Fire Investigation Team. This team meets several times a year for internal training. The Hillcrest Fire Investigation Team serves thirteen municipalities.

CRISIS INTERVENTION

The City of Beachwood is in the southeast corner of Cuyahoga County, Ohio. The city has a residential population of 14,040 residents (2020 Census) while attracting 100,000 people daily to work, shop, and visit within its 5.2 square mile area. The Beachwood Police Department was staffed by forty-seven full time sworn police officers, nine part-time officers, and fifteen dispatchers. Officers recorded 355 crisis intervention incidents.

The Crisis Intervention Team (CIT) program is a community partnership of law enforcement, mental health and addiction professionals, individuals who live with mental illness and/or addictive disorders, their families, and other partners whose goal is to improve community responses to mental health crisis. The CIT model, known as the “Memphis Model,” was developed in 1988 and has spread throughout the United States and several nations worldwide.

The Beachwood Police Department was introduced to CIT in 2004 when members of the Hostage Negotiator Team were sent to CIT training. Currently, all but one full-time officer has attended a 40-hour Crisis Intervention team training course. The training is provided by the ADAMHS Board of Cuyahoga County. An 8-hour refresher course was provided for officers who had the 40-hour training session to refresh knowledge and skills associated with identifying and responding to individuals in crisis. Dispatch personnel have been trained through a similar program offered specific to their duties. Additional training included: Understanding Autism Key Considerations for Crisis Response including the deployment of response backpacks to assist with these incidents.


Throughout 2024, Beachwood Police Department engaged with others to assist with the partnership to provide improved services. Recognition for participation and assistance to grow our program includes the following:

The total number of CIT incidents over the past three years of reporting has increased slightly. The initial year of reporting was for 2022 when we recorded 232 individual incidents. We experienced a slight increase of eleven additional incidents reported in 2023. The total number of incidents increased again in 2024 up to a total of 355 incidents. A CIT incident is defined as a call for service where an officer responds to assist an individual with a known diagnosis of mental illness, developmental disabilities or exhibits common traits associated with these categories. Additional issues may coexist including substance abuse and homelessness.

Officers utilize tools including active listening and de-escalation techniques to effectively assist individuals experiencing crisis. Additional actions may include providing the individual with contacts for resources which include private or governmental agencies to address:

- Psychiatric evaluation and medication management
- Individual and group counseling
- Mental health and substance use assessments.
- Withdrawal Management
- Substance use disorders.
- Peer support
- Enrollment in benefit programs (Disability and Medicare)
- Shelter and housing




Total CIT Incidents (Annually)




2022 Demographics

RANGE

The yearly inspection of the Beachwood Police shooting range was completed during the month of January 2025 for the previous year.

The range was professionally cleaned in March of 2024. The Service Department painted the range walls shortly after the cleaning. The range's targeting system continues to be inoperable due to the system being so antiquated. The ventilation and HVAC system have been functioning with no issues.

All personnel qualified with their duty handguns and rifles during 2024. The qualification records are all current and are stored digitally on the department server. For 2024, all the Firearm Use of Force Tests and signed Range Rules were scanned and are now digitally stored on the department server. The Advanced Firearm Proficiency Qualification was completed in November and December of 2024.

An inventory was taken of the several types of ammunition needed by the Department. The range has enough ammunition currently for training and duty, but another order will need to be made in 2025 to keep up the supply. During 2024, the purchase and management of the training Simunition guns was taken over by the Rangemaster. There is a supply of Simunition marking rounds and blanks in the range, but more will need to be ordered in 2025. Two new Glock Simunition handguns were purchased.

There is currently a sufficient supply of targets, cleaning supplies, protective equipment, and shooting supplies in the range. Another order for expendable supplies will be made in 2025.

All non-issued duty weapons are accounted for. Additional handguns and lights will need to be ordered to accommodate any newly hired officers in 2025. However, the current duty handguns are going to be traded in for the GLOCK G45 MOS model in 2025, and there will then be sufficient handguns for new hires. There are enough holsters stored for any new right- or left-handed officers. In 2024, the less-lethal shotguns were removed from service since the department has other, safer less-lethal options available to officers.

The supply of confiscated or donated weapons was inventoried near the end of 2024.

Duty handgun and rifle proficiency training should increase. All firearms instructors will complete a red dot instructor course so they can adequately train officers wishing to use a red dot sight on their department-issued handguns. Plans are in development to allow for a successful rollout of the red dot sight program once the new handguns are received. The current SWAT rifles are past their useful life and should be replaced. The SWAT rifles are supplied and maintained by the EDGE SWAT team and the replacement of the rifles is determined by the EDGE SWAT team leadership. Alternative less lethal guns will be researched in 2025 to see if they are worth considering for purchase and deployment.

CANINE

In 2024, K9 Jorik was deployed twenty-one times. K9 Jorik had fourteen explosive detection deployments and seven patrol deployments including one physical arrest involving an adult male arrested for criminal trespass. K9 Jorik assisted the EDGE Bomb Squad with a bomb threat at a private elementary school in Euclid. K9 Jorik found no live explosives in 2024. K9 Jorik had zero arrests or apprehensions with a bite in 2024. K9 Jorik participated in several community relations events throughout Beachwood including February Freeze, the 2024 Eclipse at Beachwood High School, Juneteenth at the Beachwood Aquatic Center, two large scale events at the Jewish Federation of Cleveland, Safety Town hosted by Beachwood City Schools, National Night Out and Beachwood Fall Fest. K9 Jorik interacted with residents of all ages and provided a positive connection between the police department and the community. In September of 2024, K9 Jorik turned 7 years old and continues to maintain good health and enthusiasm for his work. K9 Jorik visited the veterinarian one time in 2024 for his annual physical. K9 Jorik continues to be a strong asset for the city. K9 Jorik attended twenty-two training engagements and participated in seventeen detection training exercises and seventy-four patrol related exercises.

K9 Kai was deployed in two patrol incidents prior to his retirement in August of 2024. One during a building search of a residence for a domestic violence suspect. A second during the arrest of a group of suspects related to a stolen vehicle investigation. K9 Kai had zero arrests or apprehensions with a bite. During K9 Kai's career, he was responsible for the seizure of 17.8kg of illegal narcotics as well as over \$141,000 in currency related to narcotics investigations. He was also utilized several times to search for narcotics in the Beachwood City Schools as well and as appeared at multiple community events.

The K9 Unit trains on the first and third Tuesday of each month with several other teams from neighboring agencies. K9 Jorik attended twenty-two training days and participated in seventeen detection training exercises and seventy-four patrol related training exercises.

PATROL

USE OF FORCE

Beachwood Police Department personnel engaged in five (5) reportable use of force incidents during 2024. The force employed was for the defense of themselves or others, to control subjects, to affect custodial arrests, and to perform their lawful duties. When considering the thousands of interactions officers have with the public in varied contexts, this number is quite low. Agency policy defines force as *the application of physical techniques or tactics, chemical agents, or weapons to another person. It is not a use of force when a person allows him/herself to be searched, escorted, handcuffed, or restrained.* Officers are entrusted to use that amount and duration of force that appears reasonably necessary given the facts and circumstances perceived by the officer(s) at the time of the incident to accomplish their law enforcement purpose. Personnel are expected to attempt to de-escalate situations prior to deploying force options whenever possible, however, nothing in the agency's force policy requires an officer to retreat nor to be exposed to potential physical injury prior to applying reasonable force. In the event a force deployment is believed to be excessive or unreasonable, agency personnel bear the responsibility and duty to intercede to mitigate the situation and report their observations to a supervisor.

The definition of a "reportable force" incident by department policy is one *in which an on-duty department employee, or off-duty employee whose occupation is a factor, uses any deadly force, any less-lethal control device, or any physical force (including canine deployment):*

- *To compel a person to comply with the employee's directions, or efforts to gain control.*
- *To prevent escape or overcome resistance by a suspect during an arrest or detention.*
- *To defend any person from aggressive action by a suspect*

When that force employed results in the injury, reported injury, or suspected injury of another person.

Reportable force exceptions:

- The use of a firm grip or "control holds" to control only, which does not result in injury or the appearance of injury (e.g., the use of a grip to control the suspect's hands while searching or handcuffing); or
- That force needed to overcome passive resistance due to physical disability or intoxication that does not result in injury or the appearance of injury (e.g., lifting an intoxicated person to a standing position)

Deadly force as defined by agency policy is that force which is *reasonably anticipated and intended to create a substantial likelihood of causing death or very serious injury.*

There were no instances in which officers deployed deadly force in 2024.

In all but one case, more than one officer was present during the application of force. Two (2) complaints of excessive force were made, both were unsubstantiated after being investigated.

Physical injuries to agency personnel and subjects were minor when reported, and consisted of scrapes, bruises, and aggravations of prior, existing injuries. All incidents reviewed were determined to be justified uses of force that adhered substantially with agency policy and procedure while also meeting the legal standard of objective reasonableness. The following are brief descriptions of the incidents that qualified as reviewable uses of force by agency personnel and the circumstances surrounding them.

04/08/2024

Report #24-

013926

At 1815 hours, officers converged upon the area of Richmond Road and Chagrin Boulevard where a vehicle that had previously fled was abandoned in traffic by multiple occupants who fled on foot. During the officers' attempts to locate and apprehend the individuals, a subject emerged from a wooded area where she was hiding and again ran through a gas station parking lot. An officer gave chase, caught up to the female, grabbed her by the arm, and escorted her to the pavement where she was handcuffed and arrested. The subject complained of shoulder and head pain and was transported to a local emergency room under guard.

06/04/2024

Report #24-

022701

At 2310 hours, officers were dispatched to a residential home in the 2800 block of Richmond Road for a domestic disturbance. A female reported that her husband was holding her at gunpoint and threatening to harm her. Upon arrival, officers were confronted with the subject in the front yard of the home. He was between the officers and his alleged victim. Visibly unarmed, but seemingly intoxicated, the male continued to advance toward the primary officer ignoring commands to stop and get on the ground. The officer pushed the offender off to create space, and then with the assistance of a second officer, began to struggle with the subject to gain control of his movements and place him under arrest. The subject was taken to ground where the struggle continued until a third officer deployed his Conducted Electrical Weapon (Taser) upon the male after which time officers were able to secure him in handcuffs and bring the incident under control. The male was conveyed to a local emergency room for evaluation and treatment.

06/30/2024

Report #24-026453

At 1055 hours, officers responded to IR-271 southbound near Fairmount Boulevard after dispatch received multiple reports of a physical altercation occurring inside a moving vehicle between a male and female prior to the vehicle driving off the roadway. Upon the arrival of the (2) officer unit, the primary officer engaged the male half of the altercation at the passenger window. Despite clear, lawful commands for the subject to show his hands and exit the vehicle, the subject refused to comply, continually reaching into a bag within the vehicle. The officer tried to control the subject's movements and attempted to remove him from the vehicle. The violator continued to struggle against those attempts. The situation deteriorated quickly as the officer attempted to gain control of the subject at the passenger door. Once outside the vehicle, the subject continued to resist the officer and was taken to the ground in the berm of the interstate where he was subsequently handcuffed. The male was transported to a local emergency room for evaluation of an alleged back injury received during his resistance to being arrested.

09/25/2024

Report #24-038460

At 1921 hours, officers responded to a residential home on East Baintree Road for a domestic disturbance. While on-scene, they developed probable cause to arrest a male subject. The male was intoxicated and belligerent with officers using profanity upon them throughout the incident. When they attempted to place him into the prisoner compartment of the transporting police vehicle, he attempted to spit upon an officer. Officers then controlled the male's head to maintain the direction of his face and mouth away from officers as they placed a spit hood upon him. The subject then refused to sit in the police vehicle and officers were forced to push and pull him into the prisoner compartment. At the jail, the subject refused further evaluation or treatment after allowing a corrections officer to clean and bandage an abrasion received during his arrest.

11/11/2024

Report #24-04152

At 1444 hours, officers responded to Michael's craft store within the Pavilion Shopping Mall for reports of a female acting erratically trying to cover store patrons with a blanket. Within moments of the arrival of the initial officer, it was apparent that the female was either suffering from a mental health crisis, was under the influence of a narcotic, or both. When the officer attempted to handcuff the female to control her movements, she lowered herself to the floor and broke the grasp the officer had upon her arm. A ground struggle ensued as the officer tried to control the female until additional officers arrived on-scene to assist. A hobble restraint was placed upon the subject to control her thrashing legs and a spit hood was placed to absorb the spittle that was streaming from her mouth as she screamed and thrashed in her agitated state. The subject was conveyed to a local emergency room for further evaluation and sustained no physical injuries. The initial responding officer suffered minor injuries.

VEHICLE PURSUITS

There were two (2) incidents in 2024 that met the criteria of a vehicle pursuit spurring a required administrative review. A vehicle pursuit is defined by the current agency policy as: *an event involving one or more peace officers attempting to apprehend a suspect who is trying to avoid arrest while operating a motor vehicle by using high speed or other evasive tactics, such as disregarding traffic warning signs, stop signs, red lights, driving off a roadway, turning suddenly or driving in a legal manner but willfully failing to yield to an officer's signal to stop.* All vehicle pursuits are evaluated for policy compliance and training value.

04/08/2024

Report #24-013926

At approximately 1639 hours, an officer attempted to conduct a traffic stop of a vehicle driving on (2) flat tires on Richmond Road. The motorist failed to yield, and the officer continued his pursuit of the violator, eventually receiving backup from one additional officer. The subject vehicle struck another vehicle near the intersection of South Woodland Road and continued southbound. North of the Chagrin Boulevard intersection, the vehicle became disabled, and the occupants abandoned it in traffic, then fled on foot. All the vehicle occupants were apprehended in the surrounding area. Further investigation determined that the vehicle was stolen earlier in the day from a surrounding community.

09/15/2024

Report #24-037167

At approximately 1335 hours, an officer attempted to conduct a traffic stop of a motor vehicle operating on multiple flat tires on Chagrin Boulevard. The motorist failed to yield to the officer's signal to stop and continued with no regard for the motor vehicle laws. Officers continued to monitor the direction of the vehicle, and it subsequently became disabled on Richmond Road near Shaker Boulevard where the motorist was arrested without further incident.

Police supervisors are tasked with reviewing all incidents in which a motorist fails to yield to an officer's signal to stop. There were multiple instances throughout the year in which offenders of the traffic code and non-violent misdemeanor offenders were not pursued or initial attempts to stop them were quickly abandoned by officers employing sound discretion in compliance with the agency's pursuit policy.

BIAS-BASED POLICING

A fundamental right guaranteed by the constitutions of both this state and nation is equal protection under the law. Along with this right to equal protection is the fundamental right to be free from unreasonable searches and seizures by governmental agents. Citizens are free to move about in public places without police interference so long as they obey the law. All citizens are equally entitled to be free from the depredations of criminals, and to traverse the public right of ways safe from the actions of reckless and careless drivers.

This agency is charged with protecting these fundamental rights and delivering the same law enforcement service for all, regardless of race, ethnicity, national origin, religion, sex, sexual orientation, gender identity or expression, economic status, age, cultural group, disability, or affiliation with any non-criminal group.

The purpose of the bias-based policing policy is to strictly prohibit bias-based policing tactics as well as to affirm the agency's commitment to policing that is fair and objective. The policy outlines responsibilities for agency members, supervisory personnel, and the administration. Nothing in the policy is intended to prohibit personnel from considering protected characteristics in combination with other credible information in furtherance of their legitimate law enforcement objectives.

Officers are required to utilize body worn cameras and police cruiser dash cameras to document law enforcement encounters in the performance of their official duties. This provides transparency and protects officers and the agency from baseless allegations.

It is the policy of this department to patrol in a proactive manner and to aggressively investigate suspicious people and circumstances. Officers are expected to enforce criminal and motor vehicle laws using well-reasoned discretion while insisting that citizens will only be detained when there exists at a minimum, reasonable articulable suspicion that an offense has been, is being, or will be committed. Officers, as community caretakers, are also entrusted to investigate circumstances that would lead them to believe that a person is in distress or in need of aid. Members of the Beachwood Police Department receive training in several topics related to their patrol and enforcement tactics. The need to respect the rights of all citizens to be free from unreasonable government intrusion is paramount. Patrol shift supervisors are required to monitor the enforcement activity of their subordinates to ensure that officers are conducting themselves within the guidelines of this policy and applicable law. Routine reviews of body worn and cruiser camera images from officers is one notable way to conduct such oversight. Additionally, the following aspects of officer activity are tracked and examined to ensure that the policies of the agency are being adhered to:

1. Motor vehicle stops resulting in citations.
2. Motor vehicle stops resulting in warnings.
3. Citizen complaints of illegal profiling

Beachwood Police officers conducted 2,160 traffic stops in 2024 for assorted reasons including observations of traffic offenses, responses to traffic complaints, investigations of criminal conduct in which the suspect(s) was within a vehicle, as well as other detentions based upon probable cause or reasonable suspicion. As a result of those encounters as well as investigations of motor vehicle accidents, approximately 1,650 traffic citations were issued to violators charging 2,000 violations of the traffic code. Just over 1,000 warnings, both written and verbal in nature, were also provided. Of those citations issued, 44.73% were issued to individuals identified as being white, 50.27% as being African American, 2.04% as being Asian, and 2.96% being of other races or their race was not known or reported. Just over half (approximately 53%) of citations were issued to males with the remainder (47%) issued to females. As for the warnings provided, 44.78% were given to individuals identified as being white, 47.94% as being African American, 1.67% as being Asian, and 5.61% being of other races or their race was not known or reported. Approximately 54% of warnings were given to males and 46% were given to females.

The agency received no substantiated complaints of racial profiling in 2024.

MAYOR'S COURT REPORT

Beachwood Mayor's Court processes and hears all uncontested non-serious misdemeanor offenses. If a case is contested, the case is then transferred to the Shaker Heights Municipal Court in Shaker Heights, Ohio. All felony or serious offenses are automatically processed by either Cuyahoga County Common Pleas Court, in the case of a felony, or Shaker Heights Municipal Court, in the case of a serious offense.

In 2024, 1,324 traffic and nine criminal cases were filed with the Beachwood Mayor's Court. A total of 388 parking violations were filed with the court.

In 2024, Mayor's Court transferred forty-one contested cases to Shaker Heights Municipal Court. There were 651 cases filed directly with Cuyahoga County Common Pleas Court, Cuyahoga County Prosecutor's Office, Cuyahoga County Juvenile Court, or Shaker Heights Municipal Court.

JAIL FACILITY

In 2024, 494 people were processed into the Beachwood City Jail; 316 of them were males and 178 were females. We housed fifty-three inmates for the City of Pepper Pike, who contract with the City of Beachwood for jail services. We housed two males for a brief time for Shaker Heights PD as mutual aid.

Of those people arrested by Beachwood Police officers, 176 of them were for outstanding warrants that were served by this department. Eighty-three of them were arrested for theft-related offenses. Other charges, such as OVI and Domestic Violence were also filed. Beachwood officers arrested forty-eight juveniles that were processed through juvenile booking. At the request of the Cuyahoga County Juvenile Detention Center, five juveniles were transported to their facility to be held.

Adult arrests decreased by seventy-one people from 2023 and juvenile arrests decreased by twenty people from 2023. This downward trend in the number of arrests and their length of stay in our facility is attributed to bond reform, changes in court procedures, and changes in department arrest policies. The Cuyahoga County Sheriff's Department continues to house time servers sentenced under the Ohio Revised Code. As a result, the number of time servers being housed in the Beachwood City Jail has remained extremely low since 2017.

In 2024, 53 people were housed for the City of Pepper Pike. The revenue generated totaled \$5,840.00 paid to the City of Beachwood. We housed one male for Pepper Pike for four days as a time server. The housing of prisoners for other cities, by contract or by mutual aid, will be monitored to ensure that daily operations of the jail are not affected.

The Jail was inspected in 2024 by the State of Ohio Bureau of Adult Detention and found to be in full compliance with all the applicable state jail standards for 12 day holding facilities. The primary goal of the Beachwood City Jail is to maintain a facility that is safe, secure, in good repair, and in compliance with state standards. The Beachwood Fire Department, as well as county health officials, inspected the jail and found no deficiencies. The jail was also inspected weekly by staff for security concerns. A monthly check was conducted for any health, safety, and sanitation concerns.

No staff members or inmates sustained injuries from incidents within the facility in 2024, keeping the department on track to achieve the stated goals in 2025.

SPECIALTY UNITS

Police Mountain Bike Unit

The police mountain bicycle unit was staffed part time in 2024, with general months of use being limited by weather to April through October. The principal areas of use for the bicycle unit were schools, City Parks, residential neighborhoods, apartment complexes, and religious institution campuses. The bicycle unit was also deployed for community events such as Race for the Place, Juneteenth, and visits to elementary schools to provide young students with an up-close experience with an officer and his bike. These contacts with children resulted in them learning officers are there to help them and teach them safety.

The unit served as an excellent tool toward building positive community relations. Two primary areas in which the bicycle unit accomplished this were through close personal contact with the members of the community, and enhanced patrol techniques which were directed at accomplishing the goal of an improved community through directed action.

As the officer's rode in the community and were deployed at attended events, they became more approachable and created a more positive image. Citizens are more at ease and more willing to engage with the bike officers riding through their neighborhood or at their special events than they would with an officer in a car.

The neighborhood patrols proactively deterred crime with the visual presence of officers slowly touring the areas on bikes. The increased time spent in a location on a slow-moving bike as opposed to a car can be much more effective in deterring crime and providing a public perception that the neighborhood is a safer place.

The bicycle unit promoted a feeling of goodwill and safety between the community and the police department. It allows personal attention and builds friendly relationships with residents, patrons, business owners, and tourists of the city.

There are three fully operable mountain bikes in the unit, with one rear mounting bike rack which fits every cruiser in the fleet. Officers in the unit participated in test rides and did research for the expected addition of E Bikes in 2025 being added to the unit. Once the E Bikes are added, each member of the unit will attend an eight-hour training course specifically designed for riding police patrol E Bikes. Additional transports racks will be added after the E Bikes are obtained.

E.D.G.E. SWAT

The EDGE SWAT Team is a multi-jurisdictional team comprised of members from eight (8) communities, including: Beachwood, Bratenahl, Cleveland Heights, Euclid, Pepper Pike, Shaker Heights, South Euclid, and University Heights. Currently, the team consists of 25 SWAT Officers, 8 Tactical Medics, and 3 Tactical Canines. The EDGE SWAT Team is currently led by Team Commander Dave Carpenter of the Euclid Police Department, Assistant Team Commander Josh Schultz of the Euclid Police Department, and Training Coordinator/Senior Team Leader Marc Imbrogno of the University Heights Police Department.

Staffing: This past year brought the departure of six officers from our team, most of which were unexpected. This dropped our staff to a level that required an increased workload for the remaining officers. The remaining thirty-six officers filled the voids to ensure that missions were being safely and successfully completed. The SWAT Team is expecting to add 10-14 SWAT Officers, 2-3 Tactical Medics, and a Tactical Canine. Bratenahl is adding their first SWAT Officer to the SWAT Team. Cleveland Heights is expected to add 2 SWAT Officers and their first Tactical Medic. Euclid is expected to add 2-4 SWAT Officers. Shaker Heights is expected to add 2 SWAT Officers and their first Tactical Medic. South Euclid is expected to add 2 SWAT Officers and a Tactical Canine. University Heights is expected to add 2 SWAT Officers and their first Tactical Medic.

Operational Highlights: In 2024, EDGE SWAT continued its mission of excellence in law enforcement and tactical operations. With a commitment to professionalism, teamwork, and community safety, our team successfully executed sixty-two (62) high-risk operations. Through dedication and collaborative efforts with other agencies, the team has upheld our standards of service and made significant contributions to public safety. While the majority of SWAT deployments were to serve high-risk search and arrest warrants connected to drug trafficking (23) or offenses of violence (24), ten (10) deployments were responses to armed, barricaded subjects exhibiting a propensity for violence. These numbers reflect a decrease in operational tempo, but a 200% rise in barricaded subjects from 2023. In 2024, thirteen (13) operations were related to homicides, including the resolution and subsequent services for the murder of Euclid Police Officer Jacob Derbin on May 11, 2024.

EDGE SWAT continues to have good working relationships with the Cleveland Police SWAT Team, the Cuyahoga County Sheriff's Department SWAT team, Ohio State Highway Patrol SWAT, WEB SWAT, FBI, DEA, USMS, and ATF. Numerous operations were served on behalf of or in conjunction with these units. The EDGE SWAT Team also continues to provide security for high-risk events, such as religious extremist threats associated with the Jewish Federation of Cleveland. The EDGE SWAT team is looking forward to 2025 to continue to grow and build upon the accomplishments of 2024 while integrating a large contingent of the next generation SWAT officers. EDGE SWAT will continue to train and remain mission ready to serve our communities with dignity and respect.

Beachwood Operators completed numerous additional training courses besides the two monthly trainings and annual week-long training (as prescribed by NTOA standards). Ptl. Spelman attended the Ohio Tactical Officer's Association Training in June. Attending general session lectures and Critical Incident Debriefings (which several counted toward annual Ohio CPT hours), Less Lethal Impact Instructor, Red Dot Pistols for Law Enforcement, and RDS (Red Dot Sight) Pistol for Law Enforcement courses. Ptl. Bertone attended and completed a weeklong counter sniper course to advance his skillset and be able to deploy as a Team Sniper on operations.

It would be beneficial to have a MARCS radio added to the Beachwood Bearcat in the future.

Field Training Officers

The Beachwood Police Department Field Training Officer Program trained one entry level officer who started the program in January 2024. The entry level officer obtained solo patrol status in April of 2024 and completed the probationary period in July of 2024. The program also trained two lateral transfer officers, and they started the program in June of 2024. One of the lateral transfer officers resigned during phase 1 of the program. The second officer obtained solo patrol status in September of 2024. The lateral transfer officer is currently in a one-year probationary period with a projected end date of June 3rd, 2025. The program incorporated five Field Training Officers for 2024. We have an additional two officers trained as field training officers, and they could be utilized in the future. The program utilized a modified San Jose Model with four phases of field training with a two-week orientation to start the probationary officers' career at the Beachwood Police Department. The field training portion of the program is approximately twelve weeks.

In May and June of 2024, I met with all seven FTOs individually and we discussed ways to improve the program. The check list for the training curriculum was modified to include an indicator marker (****) marking a topic as a critical topic. Those critical topics are to be covered in more detail and more time is expected to be spent on training these topics. An officer recently in the FTO program suggested more mock scenario training for DUS and OVI incidents. They also suggested more repetition on important topics. Suggestions were made to FTOs on how to incorporate scenario-based OVI and DUS training. All seven FTOs received 24 hours of Continuing Professional Training. FTOs and trainees found typos/errors in the training curriculum and those typos/errors were corrected for the future curriculum.

During the training program, the midpoint phase supervisor review and end-of-phase review were difficult to complete when the trainee was on the opposite shift of the FTO supervisor. The FTO supervisor had to speak with the FTO and the trainee over the phone. The meeting did occur, but face-to-face contact is a preferred method for these reviews. A challenge with lateral transfers is getting them enough repetitions with our critical policies and procedures, so they do not revert to their old department policies and procedures.

Assigning an assistant FTO supervisor would be beneficial, so the assistant could help complete the midpoint reviews and end-of-phase reviews with a face-to-face meeting with the FTO and trainee, when the FTO Supervisor is not available. FTOs suggested the department purchase a Blue to Gold Search and Seizure Survival Guide for Ohio and a Bullet Proof Report Writing guide, so FTOs could use these resources when training in search and seizure and report writing. An emphasis needs to be placed on scenario-based training for critical topics that are not experienced at a high volume during real calls to service. The training also needs to be done with a high volume of repetitions.

An entry level officer is projected to start the FTO program in July 2025. Additional lateral transfer officers are also projected to start the FTO program in 2025. A group or individual meetings with the FTOs will be completed before the new lateral transfer officers start the FTO program. The formal training curriculum with specific resources to cover for each topic continues to bring consistency and accountability to the program.

Recruitment

For the year 2024, the Beachwood Police Department continued its utilization of the National Testing Network (NTN) database to assist in the recruiting process for both Lateral and Entry Level candidates. The Part-Time School Resource Officer (SRO) position received applications that were sent directly to the department, without the use of NTN.

For the Entry Level Patrol Officer position, the application window was open from January 12, 2024, until February 14, 2024. The Lateral Transfer position, the active application window was from October 3, 2024, until November 2024. The Part-Time SRO position was posted on January 23, 2024, and remains open.

To assist with recruitment in the Lateral Transfer position and Part-Time SRO position, Sgt. Reyna and Ptl. Pekarski attended the Law Enforcement Job Fair at the Cuyahoga Community College Western Campus (Tri-C) on July 27, 2024. The job fair yielded very few prospective candidates. Information was exchanged with a few interested individuals, but the job fair did not have a successful turnout at Tri-C.

In total, one Entry Level candidate has been provided with a conditional job offer and will be attending the Ohio State Highway Patrol Academy in 2025. Two Lateral Transfer candidates were provided with a conditional job offer. Two Part-Time SROs were hired by Beachwood PD in 2024.

A recommendation to improve recruiting would be to allow both qualified Entry Level and Lateral Transfer candidates the opportunity to ride along with a Beachwood Police Officer. The guidelines for a ride along would be best specified in departmental policy. Another recommendation would be further inclusion of the recruiting officer(s) of Beachwood PD with Beachwood's Civil Service Commission. This would improve communication between applicants and Beachwood PD and potentially increase the numbers of applicants who appropriately complete their application packet.

SCHOOLS

The City of Beachwood and Beachwood City School District began a shared services agreement in August 2015, this was renewed in November 2020 and March 2024. This agreement places officers in all five of the Beachwood City Schools during the school day including Beachwood High School (grades 9-12), Beachwood Middle School (grades 6-8), Hilltop Elementary (grades 3-5), Bryden Elementary (grades K-2), and Fairmount Elementary (Pre-K). This agreement also provides officers for various school events. The structure of this agreement has one full-time officer assigned at the school district as Director of Security, Colton Pekarski. The Director of Security then oversees the part-time School Officers. When fully staffed, there are eight part-time School Officers. During 2024, hired two new part-time School Officers, Officer Randy Bialosky and Officer Scott Safenovitz to become fully staffed.

All officers assigned to the schools have rotated through various buildings to ensure familiarity with the layout and daily operations across the district. This rotation allowed officers to become well-acquainted with each school's environment. Once this familiarity was established, it was determined that assigning officers to specific buildings would further enhance their effectiveness. By having an officer designated to a particular building, they could gain in-depth knowledge of its daily operations and the individuals within it.

While on duty, school officers are responsible for ensuring the safety and security of students, staff, and school facilities. Their duties include overseeing student and staff arrivals and dismissals, patrolling school grounds, locking and unlocking doors, monitoring security cameras, and supervising daily activities such as lunch, recess, and hallway transitions between classes.

Goals of the Director of Security and part-time School Officers are to assist the schools in matters of security as requested; use best efforts to ensure safe and secure school facilities; promote a safe and positive learning environment; maintain uniformed police officer presence in the schools during all school days and at other requested school events; foster a security services program that builds positive relationships between law enforcement, school staff, and the students; decrease the number of youth formally referred to the juvenile justice system; respond to security situations or crises at the school's facilities and sites using the appropriate escalation of force level up to and including armed response by following established law enforcement protocol; anticipate a wide spectrum of potential emergency situations; serve as the school's liaison to local, state and federal law enforcement agencies; assist in developing, maintaining, and implementing the school safety and school crisis plans including emergency response components, visitor registration and identification procedures, student and personnel identification procedures, building surveillance systems, building safety systems, building lighting and signage.

All Beachwood School staff undergo annual safety training, which includes instruction on the ALICE protocol. In addition, Beachwood High School and Middle School students also participate in safety training to enhance preparedness. Beachwood parents were invited to attend a safety online seminar hosted by the Director of Security that could address safety concerns in schools. The school safety folder, accessible to all Beachwood police officers and dispatchers, is regularly updated to reflect the latest protocols and procedures. Officers assigned to patrol have completed tours of each school to become familiar with the buildings and their operations. There has been a continued increase in the presence of patrol officers in the schools, who are actively encouraged to visit schools and participate in school events to enhance their familiarity with the environment and strengthen community relations. Furthermore, many police department personnel have received annual active threat training in the schools, conducted either at the Beachwood Middle School or Beachwood High School, to ensure a well-coordinated response in the event of an emergency.

Recent improvements to the schools include the issuance of photo ID badges to all staff members, the installation of additional security cameras, and the creation of more key fob access points across all schools in the district. Each school now has lock boxes installed on the exterior, accessible to officers for enhanced security and accessibility. Beachwood High School has enhanced its security measures by installing a new alarm system and adding audible alarms on all emergency exits. Further enhancements include the implementation of clearer signage outlining the rules for sports facilities, along with updated signage throughout the district. The 911 system across the school district has been repaired to ensure that all school phones are routed to Beachwood Dispatch, with the displayed location of each school for improved response coordination. The Middle School has also received a new fire alarm system to further improve safety. We have acquired new encrypted radios integrated with a new school radio repeater system and are in the process of obtaining additional units. We are currently in the process of developing updated maps of the floorplans for both Fairmount Elementary and Beachwood Middle School. Additionally, the school district is actively progressing with the construction of completely new buildings for Hilltop Elementary and Bryden Elementary schools, with an anticipated completion date in early 2026.

In 2024, Beachwood Police completed thirty-two incident reports at school district buildings. There were sixteen incident reports at Beachwood High School, 8 incident reports at Hilltop Elementary, 4 incident reports at Beachwood Middle School, 2 incident reports at Bryden Elementary, and 2 incident reports at Fairmount Elementary. Not all incident reports were related to crimes; some were filed for documentation purposes. The presence of officers stationed at the schools, combined with a higher frequency of patrol officers entering the school buildings, has fostered stronger community-police relationships. Throughout the schools, there is frequent interaction between students and the officers assigned to the buildings. Officers maintain a regular presence in school cafeterias during lunch periods, where students often invite them to share a meal. In elementary schools, officers are typically stationed outdoors during recess, providing further opportunities for positive interaction. The initiative to assign officers to

Beachwood City Schools has been successful, and officers remain committed to continuing their efforts to protect and serve the district.

COMMUNITY RELATIONS

The Beachwood Police Department remains committed to fostering strong relationships with the community through proactive education and engagement. In 2024, our officers conducted a series of public safety presentations aimed at enhancing crime prevention awareness and preparedness among residents and businesses. Below is a summary of key community engagement activities undertaken by our officers throughout the year.

Community Education & Crime Prevention Initiatives

Bank Alarm Presentation – Middlefield Bank

On December 13, 2024, Officer Screngi led a Bank Alarm Response and Security Awareness presentation for the staff of Middlefield Bank. The session focused on proper alarm procedures, employee safety protocols, and best practices for responding to potential security threats. Employees received practical guidance on recognizing suspicious behaviors and implementing immediate safety measures in the event of an emergency.

Strategical Crime Prevention for Individuals – Beachwood Recreation Department

On June 16, 2024, Sergeant Calvey conducted a specialized seminar titled "Strategical Crime Prevention for Individuals," hosted at the Beachwood Recreation Department. This session provided attendees with practical crime prevention strategies, personal safety awareness techniques, and guidance on situational preparedness. The goal was to equip participants with the knowledge necessary to reduce their vulnerability to crime while promoting a culture of safety within the community.

Crime Prevention Class – The Village Clubhouse

On July 16, 2024, Sergeant Calvey also led a Crime Prevention Awareness class for residents of The Village at their clubhouse. This session was tailored to address safety concerns specific to residential communities, including home security measures, fraud prevention, and strategies for maintaining a secure neighborhood environment. Residents engaged in discussions and received resources to enhance their personal and property safety.

Community Presence & Safety Resources

Police Mini Station at Beachwood Place Mall

The Beachwood Police Department Field Office at Beachwood Place Mall continues to serve as a vital hub for community engagement, crime deterrence, and public safety. Officers assigned to the field office maintain a visible presence within the mall, responding to incidents, assisting patrons, and working closely with mall security to ensure a safe shopping environment. The office plays a significant role in preventing theft, de-escalating conflicts, and providing law enforcement assistance to business owners and visitors.

Throughout 2024, officers at the foiled office conducted regular foot patrols, engaged with shoppers and employees, and worked proactively to address safety concerns. The Beachwood Police Department remains dedicated to maintaining this critical resource to enhance security at one of the city's most frequented commercial areas.

Emergency Preparedness: AED Deployment & Maintenance

The Beachwood Police Department is committed to lifesaving emergency response through the utilization of 12 Automatic External Defibrillators (AEDs). These AEDs are essential tools for responding to cardiac emergencies in the field and are strategically deployed in police vehicles on patrol.

2024 AED Status Report

- **Total AEDs:** twelve
- **Deployments in 2024: 0**
- **Maintenance:** All AEDs are annually updated, regularly inspected, and fully operational to ensure readiness in a cardiac emergency.
- **Availability:** AEDs remain immediately accessible in all patrol vehicles to provide rapid intervention when necessary.

The continuous maintenance and deployment of AEDs underscore the department's dedication to public health and emergency response preparedness. While there were no AED activations in 2024, their presence ensures that officers are equipped to respond to life-threatening cardiac events at a moment's notice.

Conclusion

The Beachwood Police Department remains steadfast in its mission to serve, protect, and engage with the community through strategic outreach, safety initiatives, and emergency preparedness. The department's crime prevention efforts, active presence at Beachwood Place Mall, and commitment to AED deployment and maintenance reflect our ongoing dedication to public safety.

Moving into 2025, the department will continue to expand its community engagement efforts, strengthen public safety partnerships, and ensure that our residents and businesses receive the highest level of service and protection.

We thank our officers, community partners, and residents for their continued support in keeping Beachwood a safe and thriving community.



For 2024





Calls Received by Month, Time, and Day of Week




