

DISPATCH

The dispatch center began operating out of its new location on October 8th, 2018. Upgraded technology and equipment within the new center have enhanced the overall performance and efficiency of dispatch operations. After moving into the new facility, 99.66% of all incoming calls were answered in less than 10 seconds.

In August of 2018, Dispatcher Bruce Eugene retired after 14 years of service to the Beachwood Dispatch Center.

Plans to incorporate additional entities into the dispatch center are underway.

TRAFFIC

CRASH ACTIVITY

In 2018 there were nine hundred ten (910) motor vehicle accidents reported to the Beachwood Police Department. Two hundred thirty-four (234), occurred on private property. These accidents usually involve minor damage to the vehicles and were self-reported by the participants. There were eight-seven (87) accidents that occurred on public roadways where the parties involved went to the police station and filled out the accident report themselves, with no further police involvement. These accidents are usually of a minor nature and the individuals involved did not feel it was a matter worth reporting to the police at the time of occurrence. At a later time, for insurance or other reasons, it was decided that a report should be filed.

Due to the limited enforcement options and the limited input to the design features of private property, statistics from private property are not used in the following comparison statistics. The accidents that occurred on the public roadways and were self-reported are not included in the comparisons as there is no official verification as to the validity of the report.

There were a total of six hundred seventy-six (676) on street accidents investigated by the Beachwood Police Department in 2018. Of the six hundred seventy-six (676) on street accidents one hundred ninety (190) or 28% involved personal injury, with two hundred fifty (250) involved persons claiming injury.

FATAL CRASHES

There were no fatal crashes in 2018.

CAUSATIVE FACTORS AND ENFORCEMENT

When looking at causative factors, failure to maintain an assured clear distance ahead was listed as the causative factor in three hundred forty-five crashes (345). In 2018, two hundred ninety-six (296) drivers were issued citations for Failure to Maintain an Assured Clear Distance Ahead. In many cases, speed can be directly attributed to this type of crash. However, the continuing trend is an increase in cell phone use, i.e. calling, texting, e-mailing etc. and it is our opinion that many crashes are directly related to driver inattention and or failure to maintain full time and attention to the operation of a motor vehicle.

Failure to Yield was listed as the causative factor on sixty-seven (67) crash reports. The State of Ohio (OH-1) crash report does not differentiate between the various "failure to yield" violations.

A review of our enforcement activity revealed the following:

- 32 citations issued for Failure to Yield while turning left
- 28 citations issued for Failure to Yield from a private drive
- 171 citations issued for Failure to Yield when changing lanes
- 3 citations issued for Failure to Yield to an emergency vehicle

Improper lane change was listed as the causative factor on eighty-nine (89) reports.
Failure to control was listed as the causative factor on fifty-three (53) reports.
Red light violation was listed as the causative factor on thirteen (13) reports.
Improper backing was listed as the causative factor on sixteen (16) reports.

INTERSTATE ROUTE 271

The following crash activity occurred on IR-271 northbound & southbound and includes all exit and entrance ramps in the City of Beachwood.

1. On IR-271 northbound local lanes, 5 reported crashes.
2. On IR-271 northbound express lanes, 0 reported crashes.
3. On IR-271 northbound exit to Chagrin Blvd., 9 reported crashes.
4. On IR-271 southbound local lanes, 67 reported crashes.
5. On IR-271 southbound express lanes, 9 reported crashes.
6. On IR-271 southbound entrance ramp from Cedar, 3 reported crashes.
7. On IR-271 southbound exit ramp to Chagrin, 12 reported crashes.
8. On IR-271 southbound exit ramp to Harvard, 5 reported crashes.

Assured clear distance was the most frequently listed causative factor in these crashes (43%) followed by improper lane change (13%). Many of these crashes are a direct result of speed that was excessive for the conditions and driver inattention. A total of two hundred thirty-two (232) traffic stops were made on IR-271 and seventy-three (73) citations were issued for various traffic violations.

TRAFFIC COMPLAINTS

The Beachwood Police Department receives some type of traffic complaint or concern from a motorist almost everyday. The complaints range from suspected intoxicated drivers to a simple complaint of debris in the roadway.

When a traffic complaint is received our response is normally one of a few options. If the complaint is about a missing traffic sign or malfunctioning traffic signal, the traffic bureau will coordinate the adjustment, replacement or repair. Many times the complainant simply has a question that may need to be answered.

If the complaint involves motorists not obeying some type of traffic law, a police unit is dispatched and the complaint is also reviewed by the traffic bureau for further police response. After review, a special attention notice is usually posted and officers direct their discretionary enforcement time to the problem area.

In 2018, the police department received five hundred twelve (512) traffic complaints (as defined above) called into our dispatch center. The number of complaints does not necessarily reflect the true total, as there are times where calls are directed to the traffic bureau, individuals speak directly to officers on the road, or complaints are sometimes relayed by other means such as e-mail.

Applicable complaints were posted in a "traffic special attention" file and via e-mail where all personnel can access, including those in patrol cars. In response, officers either give the area special attention by frequently patrolling the area (the most common response), or they may set up on a traffic detail targeting the violation(s) that are the subject of the complaint for lengthier periods of time. In 2018, officers logged eighty-five (85) traffic details for various violations such as: speed, reckless operation, O.V.I., stop signs, and red light violations.

O.V.I. ARRESTS AND ENFORCEMENT

In 2018 the Beachwood Police Department made one hundred forty-six (146) arrests for persons who were Operating a Vehicle while Under the Influence of Alcohol and /or Drugs (O.V.I.). Ninety (90) of the arrested were male violators and fifty-six (56) were female violators. No juveniles were arrested for O.V.I. violations in 2018.

Eighty (80) of the arrested persons submitted to a breath sample with the average Blood Alcohol Content (B.A.C.) level being .171 which is more than twice the legal limit of .08. The highest reading was .287, which is more than three (3) times the legal limit. Forty-eight (48) persons refused to provide a sample as required by law.

Due to different reasons or circumstances, eighteen (18) persons were requested to provide blood samples. Two persons refused to submit to a requested blood test. Four (4) were found to be over the legal limit or had been using drugs of abuse. Twelve (12) results are pending or unknown at the time of this report.

Fifty-five (55) of the violators had at least one (1) prior conviction. Thirteen (13) violators had two (2) prior convictions and twelve (12) violators had more than two prior convictions. One violator had six (6) prior convictions for O.V.I. A total of five (5) violators were charged with

felony O.V.I. violations in 2018.

There were twenty (20) traffic crash related O.V.I.'s in 2018.

The bulk of O.V.I. arrests were made between midnight and 4:00 AM (75%). The busiest days of the week for O.V.I. activity were again late Saturday night and early Sunday morning which is a regular trend. The month of September had the most number of arrests with twenty (20). The roadways with the highest number arrests were IR-271 with forty-two (42), Chagrin Blvd with thirty-seven (37), Richmond Road with twenty-six (26), and Cedar Road with seventeen (17).

Over the last several years, results from the O.V.I. analysis were distributed to the patrol division for O.V.I. details, specifically targeting areas and times where statistically we've made the most arrests. This allows for more concentrated enforcement as opposed to regular patrol where officers patrol all areas and respond to calls.

OVERALL TRAFFIC ENFORCEMENT

Officers made approximately 3,016 traffic stops in 2018 that resulted in one of the following dispositions: citation issued, written warning, verbal warning, or arrest. There were nine hundred and fifteen (915) speeding citations issued, one hundred and thirty (130) red light citations, two hundred and eight (208) vehicle registration violations, ninety-eight (98) stop sign violations, and two hundred and seventy-six (276) motorists were cited for driving under suspension. Eleven (11) tickets were issued for violating the "Use of Electronic Communications Device While Driving" ordinance. Officers issued forty-three (43) written warnings and over one thousand eight hundred and seventy-one (1,871) verbal warnings.

Overall, our traffic enforcement program is on target with our intentions to direct our focus on specific problem areas but not at the expense of other areas. We should maintain our consistent level of enforcement along our major streets and highways. We will continue to direct our discretionary enforcement time to the areas where complaints have been received but not at the expense of ignoring other criminal activity trends.

When reviewing the traffic details that are logged in areas where we get complaints, often times the officer spend 20-30 minutes and records that "no violations observed." The fact that a marked police cruiser / S.U.V. is in the area is a deterrent to the violations that result in complaints, but yields less enforcement. The use of police motorcycles can help that cause.

Traffic Signals

At one time the Beachwood Police Traffic Bureau was assigned the task of monitoring and maintaining the four traffic signal systems and forty (40) traffic signals owned by the City of Beachwood.

The monitoring of traffic signals was done on a daily basis by a central traffic computer located in the traffic bureau. That system has been removed from the traffic bureau and is now maintained by GPD Group which is a private company consisting of architects, engineers and planners with expertise in traffic issues. All traffic signals are connected to a central operating software system known as Centracs. Officers also observe the traffic systems while on patrol to make sure that the signals are working properly.

While officers do not repair the traffic signals, they are usually the first to discover there is a problem with a traffic signal. When a hardware problem is detected the Beachwood Police

Department contacts Signal Service Company located in Warrensville Heights, OH. Signal Service Company responded to one hundred-four (104) repair calls for the City of Beachwood in 2018.

TOWED VEHICLES

In 2018, the traffic bureau managed the Beachwood Police Department vehicle towing operation. This operation includes overseeing the towing and impounding of vehicles seized during the routine performance of police duties and the disposal of all unclaimed vehicles in accordance with state law. Complete records of all vehicles towed and their disposition are maintained.

In 2018 the Beachwood Police Department contracted with three tow companies to provide towing services. The companies were Interstate Towing, Mooney’s Towing, and Rich’s Towing. Police dispatchers used a rotation system to ensure that each company received an equitable share of the police tows. Exceptions to this rotation are if a tow company either cannot respond at the time requested or cannot respond with specific requested equipment such as a flatbed or a tow dolly. Interstate Towing and Rich’s Towing are equipped to handle large vehicle tows of semi-trucks and trailers and heavy equipment. Tow companies were authorized to charge \$125 for a standard tow (additional fees for extra labor, i.e. use of a dolly, winch-outs, etc.) and \$15 per day for storage.

In 2018 there were eight hundred and sixteen (816) vehicles towed, this included sixty-six (66) private tows. Private tows are those that the police may have called for at the request of the driver but no further police action was taken.

Twenty (20) vehicles were unclaimed and scrapped in 2018 with numerous other vehicles still being processed to be scrapped in accordance with Ohio law.

SAFETY TOWN

Safety town was conducted between July 30th and August 3rd, 2018. It was held in the Fairmount Early Childhood Education Center/Beachwood Board of Education Building and parking lot.

Shannon Diamond, from the Beachwood Recreation Department, assisted with putting the program together. The main instructor was Jodi Appell. Mrs. Appell is also a kindergarten teacher for the Solon, Ohio School District. Officers Matthew Page and Jamey Appell assisted with Safety Town. Students from the Beachwood Middle School and Beachwood High School signed up as volunteers to help run the program.

There were two sessions for the participants. Session one was from 9:00am to 12:00pm and had 34 students enrolled. Session two was from 13:30pm to 16:30pm and had 25 students enrolled. A total of 59 children participated in the 2018 program.

Each class started with the students entering into the classroom to meet with the counselors. Games and activities were left at the tables so that the students can become friends with their counselors. We then discussed with the students the lesson for the day. Once the lesson of the day was discussed, we would split the class into two groups. Group one would go outside with officers, where they would be able to practice being pedestrians and ride pedal karts around safety town to practice traffic signals. The other group would stay inside with Mrs. Appell and go over a daily activity that relates to the safety lesson of the day. The groups would then switch, allowing all students to participate in the indoor and outdoor activities. For the last ten minutes of class, an instructor would read a story to the children and/or show a safety related video. During their time in Safety Town, the students had the opportunity to interact with a Parma Police K9 Officer and his partner. The also had interactive time with firemen where they practiced fire safety techniques. The students were instructed on the proper use of 911 and were able to make 911 calls using a 911 simulator which was provided by the Cuyahoga County Emergency Management Agency. The students learned many songs related to safety and practiced singing these songs often. A school bus was made available and the students learned safety guidelines for entering and exiting the bus as well as being safe while riding the bus.

Recommendations for improvements:

The safety town pedal cars, traffic signal, building structures and course are in poor condition. Consideration for much needed updates should be researched. The traffic signal is very old and heavy. It has sharp edges and gloves are-needed to move it around. It takes two officers to move it inside/outside every day. The signal often gives both red and green signals for the same side. Several communities including Solon and Twinsburg have a permanent course set up in city parks. Those courses are beneficial to their communities even when not being used for Safety Town instruction. A permanent course within the city would allow children to practice safety skills in the spring, summer and fall months.

Conclusion:

Safety Town is still a very viable resource for teaching children important and potentially life saving skills. The children really seem to enjoy it. This program should be continued for 2019 and beyond.

INVESTIGATIONS

DETECTIVE BUREAU/ JUVENILE DIVISION

The Beachwood Police Department Detective Bureau consists of four full time detectives as well as a detective supervisor. One detective is assigned to work afternoon shift in order to have more coverage and lend support to the patrol shift during peak demand hours.

A response team named SPEAR (Specialized Patrol Enforcement and Response) was also created which consists of a sergeant supervisor and two patrol officers. This unit worked directly with the detective bureau to identify areas of concern throughout the city. The unit would then take a proactive response to not only deter crime but to quickly respond and react to anyone violating the law. This unit was frequently deployed at Beachwood Place Mall which allowed the officers assigned to the patrol division to be available to respond to other calls for service as well as actively patrol the city.

In 2018, the Detective Bureau investigated a total of 179 cases to include 63 juvenile cases handled by the juvenile detective. The majority of the investigations conducted included theft related incidents and credit card fraud. However, a number of the incidents that were investigated have been very complex and time consuming to include sexual assault cases, shooting incidents and a homicide.

The detective bureau conducted background investigations for numerous full time officers and dispatchers. Dayshift detectives were also assigned on a regular basis to provide security and support during Beachwood Mayor's Court and to assist the prosecutor at Shaker Municipal Court on a weekly basis.

As for the juvenile division, 63 cases were investigated resulting in 77 juveniles arrested in 2018. Most were misdemeanor arrests related to theft. Arrests of juveniles were lower compared to 2017 which appears to be directly related to the Beachwood Place Mall policy preventing juveniles from being at the mall unless accompanied by an adult at certain hours of operation.

All juvenile arrests were forwarded to the Cuyahoga County Juvenile Court prosecutor intake web Portal. These cases were then scrutinized for official Criminal Court proceedings, Drug Court, Traffic Court or County-sponsored diversion programs.

INTERNAL AFFAIRS

In 2018, there was one incident determined to be an Internal Affairs complaint and two incidents which were investigated as inquiries. The Internal Affairs complaint resulted in a police officer resignation prior to the conclusion of the investigation.

There were two inquiries, both of which were determined to be unfounded and handled according to Beachwood Police Department protocol. The first inquiry was from a female who stated that she was detained by police while leaving Dillard's and investigated for suspicion of theft. It was determined that no Beachwood Police officers were present and she was advised to contact Beachwood Mall security or Dillard's management. The second inquiry was regarding an encounter with an off duty police lieutenant. The person making the complaint refused to make a written statement. An independent witness indicated that the officer didn't act "improperly" but that the incident should have

be handled in a better way.

TRAINING

The training department consisted of Patrol Officer Matthew Page as the Training Coordinator. Several other officers are certified in other necessary skills to provide inside training to Beachwood Police Officers.

Sixty-nine officers attended 40 outside training courses throughout 2018. \$11,779 towards tuition-related costs were spent on that effort. In 2018 there were no state mandated hours of continuing professional training (CPT) requirements. Five officers received Advanced Roadside Impaired Driving Enforcement Training (ARIDE) and five attended Basic Crash Training as well. Members of the SPEAR team attended Criminal Interdiction Training. Six officers attended Suspect Tactics Perimeter and Containment training.

The risks from fentanyl continues to be a health epidemic in the northeast Ohio area. Officers received information on this concern in the form of the YouTube video "Fentanyl: The Real Deal". This video was mandatory for all officers.

The police department purchased breaching tools, rifle plate carriers and ballistic helmets for every patrol car in 2018. All Officers were trained in the use of that equipment. Every officer was issued a body camera in 2018 and were trained in the use of it.

The Police Department teamed-up with the Fire Department to train officers and Fireman in the Rescue Task Force Concept. This satisfied the active threat requirement of the training policy. Beachwood Fire Department trained twenty one officers in "Stop the Bleed".

All officers were trained in an Ethics PowerPoint, Understanding Elder Abuse (test given) and Verbal Judo related to gaining voluntary compliance. All officers that are Taser certified were recertified in Taser for 2018.

It should be noted that city hall and service department members were trained in civilian active shooter response (ALICE).

Officer Page created the Beachwood Police Training Newsletters in 2018. Three issues were released containing various training topics including officer safety issues, health and wellness, current events and a large legal update by Prosecutor Naso (Supler).

PATROL

USE OF FORCE

Beachwood Police Department personnel were involved in **eight reportable use-of-force incidents during 2018**. That force was used by personnel for defense of themselves or others, to control subjects, and to affect lawful custodial arrests. This number is quite low considering the size of the agency and the number of encounters agency personnel had with members of the public in various contexts which include the custodial arrest and confinement of nearly one thousand persons for both this agency and others for which jailing services are provided. The definition of "reportable use of force" in the department policy manual is as follows:

An incident in which an on-duty department employee, or off-duty employee whose occupation is a factor, uses any deadly force, any less-lethal control device, or any physical force:

- To compel a person to comply with the employee's directions, or efforts to gain control
- To prevent escape or overcome resistance by a suspect during an arrest or detention
- To defend any person from an aggressive action by a suspect

When that force results in the injury, reported injury, or suspected injury of another person.

Reportable force exceptions:

- The use of a firm grip or "control holds" to control only, which does not result in injury or the appearance of injury (e.g. the use of a grip to control the suspect's hands while searching or handcuffing); or
- That force needed to overcome the passive resistance due to physical disability or intoxication that does not result in injury or the appearance of injury (e.g. lifting an intoxicated person to a standing position)

A **Taser conducted electrical weapon was deployed in four of the eight instances**. At least a portion of three of these incidents occurred within the confines of the City jail, with the others occurring in the field. There was **no use of deadly force by agency personnel in 2018**. There were multiple officers present during each application of force with the exception of two instances in which solo officers engaged subjects without assistance. In both of those cases civilian witnesses, private security, or loss prevention agents witnessed the use of force or assisted officers in the arrest.

Agency personnel injuries were minor when reported, and consisted mainly of scrapes, bruises, and aggravation of existing injuries. Only minor injuries were reported by the subjects involved. All incidents were reviewed and determined to be justified uses of force that adhered substantially with agency policy and procedure while meeting a legal standard of objective reasonableness.

The following are brief descriptions of the incidents where force was applied by agency personnel.

5/02/2018

Report #18017289

Officers responded to GNC at the Pavilion Shopping Mall where a custodial arrest occurred. The male subject was non-compliant with being placed into the prisoner compartment of the police vehicle. After being conveyed to the City jail, the male engaged in an altercation with a fellow inmate and then got into a physical altercation with a corrections officer. The male was ultimately placed into the jail restraint chair and transported to a local emergency room for a mental health evaluation.

5/6/2018

Report #18017893

Officers responded to the Beachwood Place Mall to investigate a report of shoplifting involving two adult females. One of the females being detained for investigation fled on foot and a short foot pursuit ensued. A pursuing officer pushed the female down from behind when she reached a grassy area and took custody of her without further incident. The female was conveyed to a local emergency room to be evaluated as a precautionary measure.

5/18/2018

Report #18019788

Officers responded to Dillard's at the Beachwood Place Mall to investigate a shoplifting complaint. The detained female verbally abused and threatened officers and security staff, purposely damaged mall property, and after being placed in the passenger compartment of a marked police cruiser, proceeded to kick the interior of the police car's door and window damaging it. Once at the jail, the female had to be placed into the jail restraint chair by officers and corrections staff prior to being conveyed to a local emergency room for an emergency psychiatric evaluation.

5/21/2018

Report #18020205

Officers responded to a Green Road residence on reports of a domestic violence offense. While officers were in route to the location, the alleged perpetrator fled in a motor vehicle and was stopped by officers on Chagrin Boulevard. As the perpetrator was being placed under arrest, he purposely lunged forward causing injury to his head. He then proceeded to attempt to flee on foot from officers and resisted arrest. Officers attempted a leg sweep and a controlled strike to the midsection as they grappled with the subject trying to regain control of him and his movements. A Taser conducted electrical weapon was deployed on the subject to bring the incident under control. He was conveyed to a local emergency room for treatment and evaluation.

7/09/2018

Report #18027301

An officer conducted a traffic stop of a motor vehicle on Richmond Road near Shaker Boulevard. As a result of this traffic stop, the officer attempted to make a custodial arrest of the driver who was not licensed to drive. Once removed from the vehicle, the driver attempted to flee on foot from officers. An officer pursued on foot, tackled the subject, and took him into custody without further incident. The subject made no injury complaint.

9/05/2018

Report #18036149

An officer conducted a traffic stop of a motor vehicle in the parking lot of Beachwood Place Mall near the Saks Department Store. The sole occupant was believed to be involved with drug trafficking. The subject fled on foot immediately after his vehicle came to a stop with a sole officer pursuing him through the Saks Department Store. The subject ignored repeated verbal commands and instructions to surrender and was eventually subjected to a Taser conducted electrical weapon which was deployed successfully. The subject was taken into custody without

further incident after being incapacitated by the Taser.

9/08/2018

Report #18036594

A lone officer working an off-duty security detail at Saks Department Store within the Beachwood Place Mall responded to reports of a disturbance. The officer was confronted with two males squaring-up in an attempt to physically fight one another after additional males scattered from the area upon her approach. The subjects refused to heed lawful orders to separate from one another and to cease their disorderly behavior. The officer deployed her Taser conducted electrical weapon to gain compliance and bring the situation under control. No injury was reported and the male subjected to the Taser refused medical treatment and evaluation.

11/06/2018

Report #18044950

An officer responded to Dillard's at the Beachwood Place Mall to follow-up on a theft complaint. Upon arrival, loss prevention staff indicated that a male leaving the store had just committed a shoplifting offense. Officers made contact with the male suspect who immediately refused to comply with verbal commands which quickly escalated into a physical confrontation. Multiple officers grappled with the subject in an attempt to take him into custody and eventually deployed a Taser conducted electrical weapon to gain compliance. Once at the City jail, the subject continued to resist corrections staff and failed to comply with orders. He was placed in the jail restraint chair, but then transported to a local emergency room for presumed PCP exposure.

HOT PURSUIT

There were four incidents in 2018 that met the criteria for a hot pursuit. Hot pursuit is defined by policy as: an active attempt by one or more police units to apprehend a suspect operating a motor vehicle, while the suspect is trying to avoid capture by using high speed driving or other evasive tactics such as driving off a highway, making sudden or unexpected movements, or maintaining legal speed but willfully failing to yield to the officer's signal to stop. All four incidents resulted from attempted traffic stops for which the motorist failed to comply. All agency pursuits are evaluated for policy compliance and training value.

5/15/2018

Report #18019235

An officer attempted to conduct a traffic stop on Richmond Road north of Cedar Road in the City of Lyndhurst. The driver and sole occupant was believed to be a fugitive from justice wanted for narcotics trafficking. The subject vehicle failed to yield to emergency lights and sirens and continued northbound on Richmond Road after rapidly accelerating. The officer appropriately terminated attempts to stop the vehicle, but continued north toward the violator's last known location. The fleeing vehicle was located at the Richmond & Mayfield Road intersection where it had been involved in a motor vehicle accident. The time elapsed from the initial attempt to stop the vehicle and it crashing was approximately 90 seconds. Injuries and property damage resulted.

6/22/2018

Report #18024799

Officers responded to the 3400 block of Belvoir Boulevard where a resident reported an in progress theft from within their parked automobile located in their driveway. Prior to officer arrival, the reporting party indicated the suspects were fleeing the area. A responding officer intercepted a suspect vehicle leaving the area in the early a.m. hours and attempted to conduct a traffic stop on the vehicle in Shaker Heights. The suspect vehicle failed to yield to emergency lights and sirens and fled from officers at a high speed. Attempts to stop the vehicle or get close enough to ascertain identifying information for follow-up were terminated. The suspect vehicle and occupants were never identified.

7/31/2018

Report #18030713

An officer attempted to conduct a traffic stop on IR-271 Southbound near Richmond Road for a speeding violation and suspicion of operating a vehicle under the influence in the early a.m. hours. The vehicle, which was later determined to be bearing stolen license plates, failed to yield to the officer's emergency signals and continued on IR-271 Southbound. The officer terminated his attempt to stop the vehicle shortly after it exited the interstate at the Rockside Road exit ramp. No injury or property damage resulted from the incident.

11/09/2018

Report #18045359

An officer attempted to conduct a traffic stop on Richmond Road in the early a.m. hours. The violator failed to yield to the emergency equipment displayed by the police unit and continued northbound on Richmond Road maintaining its low speed and bearing. The attempt to stop the vehicle were terminated as the vehicle entered the City of Richmond Heights. No injury or property damage resulted from the incident.

ILLEGAL PROFILING REPORT

A fundamental right guaranteed by the Constitution of the United States to all who live in this nation is the equal protection under the law. Along with this right to equal protection is the fundamental right to be free from unreasonable searches and seizures by government agents. Citizens are free to walk and drive our streets, highways, and other public places without police interference so long as they obey the law. They also are entitled to be free from crime, and from the depredations of criminals, and to drive and walk our public ways safe from the actions of reckless and careless drivers.

This law enforcement agency is charged with protecting these rights for all, regardless of race, color, ethnicity, sex, sexual orientation, age, physical handicap, religion or other belief system, and/or other classification or group affiliation.

The purpose of the illegal profiling policy is to unequivocally state that illegal profiling in law enforcement is totally unacceptable, to provide guidelines for officers to prevent such occurrences, and to protect our officers when they act within the dictates of the law and policy from unwarranted accusations. Officers are required to utilize body worn cameras and police cruiser dash cameras to document law enforcement encounters in the performance of their official duties to provide transparency and protect them from baseless allegations.

It is the policy of this department to patrol in a proactive manner, to aggressively investigate suspicious persons and circumstances, and to actively enforce the motor vehicle laws, while insisting that citizens will only be stopped or detained when there exists reasonable suspicion to believe they have committed, are committing, or are about to commit an infraction of the law or when the situation leads an officer to believe that a person may need some type of assistance. To that end, members of the Beachwood Police Department receive training in various topics related to their patrol and enforcement tactics. The need to respect the rights of all citizens to be free from unreasonable government intrusion or police action is paramount. Patrol shift supervisors are required to monitor the enforcement activity of their subordinates to verify that officers are conducting themselves within the guidelines of this policy and applicable law.

The following aspects of officer activity were examined to ensure that the policies of the agency are being adhered to:

1. Motor vehicle stops resulting in citations
2. Motor vehicle stops resulting in written warnings
3. Citizen complaints of illegal profiling

Beachwood officers filed approximately **1,900 traffic citations in 2018** on which over 2500 violations were charged. Those citations resulted from traffic stops, responses to and investigations of traffic crashes, as well as other law enforcement encounters. Of those citations, **44% were issued to motorists identified as being white, 52% as being African-American, 2.5% as being Asian, and 1.5% as being of other races** or their race was unknown. Of those citations issued, **51.6% were issued to males and 48.4% were issued to females.** There were 77 written warning citations issued in 2018 for various traffic, parking, criminal, and building ordinance violations.

There were **no substantiated citizen complaints of illegal profiling made in 2018.**

MAYOR'S COURT REPORT

Beachwood Mayor's Court processes and hears all uncontested non-serious misdemeanor offenses. If a case is contested, the case is then transferred to the Shaker Heights Municipal Court in Shaker Heights, Ohio. All felony or serious offenses are automatically processed by either Cuyahoga County Common Pleas Court, in the case of a felony, or Shaker Heights Municipal Court, in the case of a serious offense.

In 2018, 1425 traffic and 25 criminal cases were filed with the Beachwood Mayor's Court. A total of 362 parking violations were filed with the court.

In 2018, Mayor's Court transferred 83 contested cases to Shaker Heights Municipal Court. There were 1084 cases filed directly with Cuyahoga County Common Pleas Court, Cuyahoga County Prosecutor's Office, Cuyahoga County Juvenile Court, or Shaker Heights Municipal Court.

JAIL FACILITY

In 2018, 991 people were processed in the Beachwood City Jail, 645 males and 346 females. We housed 67 inmates for cities that have a contract with the City of Beachwood. We also housed 8 people as time servers and an additional 7 people for other cities on a mutual aid basis. Beachwood officers arrested 909 people for crimes in Beachwood. Thefts and related crimes account for the majority of these arrests followed by outstanding warrants. Beachwood officers also arrested 73 juveniles that were processed in juvenile booking. At the request of the Cuyahoga County Juvenile Detention Center, 6 of those juveniles were transported to their facility. Juvenile arrests decreased by 30 from 2017. Adult arrests increased by 59 from 2017.

The Cuyahoga County Sheriff's Department continues to house time servers sentenced under the Ohio Revised Code. As a result of this, the number of time servers being housed in the Beachwood City Jail continues to drop.

The City of Beachwood has continued to house inmates for the City of Pepper Pike. In 2018, 64 inmates were housed for the City of Pepper Pike which resulted in revenue of \$15,415.00. In 2018, 3 inmates were housed for Orange Village which resulted in revenue of \$400.00. Orange Village canceled their contract in the latter half of 2018. The housing of prisoners for other cities, with a contract or by mutual aid, will continue to be monitored to ensure the daily operations of the jail are not affected.

The Bureau of Adult Detention defines a jail as either a "Compliant Jail" or a "Full Compliance Jail". A "Compliant Jail" is defined as a jail that complies with all "Essential Standards" and 90 percent of all "Important Standards". A "Full Compliance Jail" is defined as a jail that complies with all "Essential Standards" and all "Important Standards". The Bureau of Adult Detention inspected the Beachwood City Jail in April 2018, and it was found to be a "Full Compliance Jail".

The primary stated goal for the Beachwood City Jail is to maintain a facility that is safe, secure, in good repair and in compliance with state regulations. As noted above, the jail was inspected in 2018 by the State of Ohio, Bureau of Adult Detention, as well as the fire department and county health officials. The jail was inspected weekly by staff for security concerns and monthly for any health, safety and sanitation concerns. No staff members or inmates sustained serious injuries from incidents within the facility keeping us on track to achieve and maintain our stated goals.

SPECIALTY UNITS

RECRUITMENT

2018 was an exciting year for the recruitment unit, as we conducted our first lateral transfer examination and selection process. The hiring notice was posted on various news and social media outlets beginning on April 16th, 2018. Candidates were able to download the application online and instructed to submit it in person, beginning April 23rd. We accepted the first 50 applications, which were received within 2 hours. All 50 applicants participated in an online testing process which utilized a video based assessment. Applicants had 2 weeks to complete the test. Once the testing was complete, the candidates were ranked by the testing company and background checks began. Subsequently, we hired 5 applicants from the lateral transfer list on October 8th, 2018.

EMERGENCY SERVICES TEAM

The role of law enforcement in all cases, including riotous activity, insurrection, barricaded subjects, execution of narcotics warrants, arrest of dangerous felons and the rescue of hostages or endangered persons, is the protection of lives and property.

Eastside Departments Group Enforcement (EDGE) SWAT is a team of specially trained police officers comprised of members of the Beachwood, Euclid, Shaker Heights, South Euclid, Cleveland Heights and University Heights police departments, which will respond to any incident where special weapons and tactics are needed within the member jurisdictions.

The unit consists of highly trained personnel with specific skills in the areas of marksmanship, tactical response and containment, deployment of chemical munitions and hostage negotiations. EDGE SWAT is under the direct supervision of a unit Commander and Assistant Commander, with governing authority derived through the EDGE Agency Agreement.

The EDGE team currently has 35 members of which 3 are from the Beachwood Police department along with 1 Beachwood officer that is part of the EDGE Crisis Negotiations Team. The EDGE SWAT team trains 16 hours per month (two 8 hour training days) as well as one 40 hour training week per year. Those members trained as snipers train an additional 8 hours per month as per the National Tactical Officer's Association SWAT standard for a part time SWAT team. The focus of this training is the safe resolution of situations such as Barricaded Suspects, Hostage Situations, VIP Security, High Risk Warrants and other specialized assignments through the use of advanced tactics and firearms training. In addition to the regularly scheduled training, members of the team travel to local and national training venues to stay current on the latest trends in tactics and firearms training.

2018 proved to be a busy year for the EDGE SWAT team. The team was activated a total of 76 times with the majority of activations involving the execution of high risk search and/or arrest warrants.

SCHOOLS

2018 Director of Security Year End Report

This report will explain what The City of Beachwood Police Department and associated Officers have accomplished in the Beachwood City School System. The report will address areas and issues that the Officers are currently working to improve, and any recommendations.

Background and beginning of the program

The agreement was made between the City and the School Board for police officers to work in schools. This took effect on August 1, 2015 and was renewed as of August 1, 2018

There have been no changes in officer assignment or duties. All of the officers have worked and rotated through all of the schools. This was done so that all of the officers would be familiar with the layout and daily operation of all of the School District's buildings. Once familiarity was established, it was agreed that officers would be assigned to one building. By assigning an officer to a building this allowed the officer to specifically know the daily operation of a building and its occupants.

While on duty school officers provide safety and protection to students, staff, and school buildings. They are involved in student and staff arrival and dismissal from school, patrol grounds, lock/unlock doors, watch security cameras, and monitor daily school activities such as lunch, recess, hallway activity during class switches. With all due respect and clarity, it would take too much time and space to list everything that officers do, have done, or are willing to do while working at the schools.

Fairmount School / B.O.E

Officers assigned to building: Officer Brian Steele, Officer Emory Clark

Police officer's basic daily timeline:

- Begin shift at 0730 hrs.
- From 0730 - 0900 hrs. Officers will primarily focus their attention to the "before care" area. There they will monitor building entry, students and staff.
- 0900 - 0930 hrs. Officers will monitor student arrival to school.
- Patrol school grounds
- Monitor recess, specifically when students are out of the building.
- Be stationed in a visible area to monitor and be seen by visitors, students and staff entering the buildings.
- 1200 - 1230 hrs. Officers will monitor early student dismissal.
- 1500 - 1530 hrs. Officers will monitor afternoon student dismissal.

Summary:

Since officers have been assigned at the Fairmount School Building, the situation has been very positive. All of the parents and students that we interact with have nothing but praise for police officers being at the schools. Officers have done well proactively recognizing areas of concern and addressing those issues. The front office assistant and the preschool staff are very cognizant of building security and are quick to report anything that is out of place. Officers are on schedule and will complete all of the State mandated school safety drills on or before their required completion dates.

Bryden School

Officers assigned to the building: Officer Tom Powers, Officer Tim Gerding

Police officer basic daily timeline:

- Begin shift at 0745 hrs.
- 0830 – 0900 hrs. Officers will monitor student arrival to school.
- Patrol school grounds
- Monitor recess, and classes specifically when students are out of the building.
- Be stationed in a visible area to monitor and be seen by visitors, students and staff entering the buildings.
- 1520 – 1545 hrs. Officers will monitor afternoon student dismissal.

Summary:

Since officers have been assigned at Bryden School many positive changes have been made. Teachers and staff include the police officers in the school email system, and advise the officers when they are exiting the building to teach in the outdoor classroom. Principal Miller and Assistant Principal Ciccone are organized and take great concern over all of the safety drills. Bryden School is in serious need of more, higher definition, security cameras as well as a more workable entry point for visitor/staff interaction. Proposals have been made to consolidate Bryden and Hilltop with Fairmount School making one big elementary school. That would be a tremendous advantage from a safety and security standpoint. In the meantime, officers are aware of the shortcomings and are focusing their attention to them accordingly. After school care is also an area of concern. The hours that staff is in the building was noted and passed onto the police department patrol division. Short term remediation was to have the patrol division routinely patrol the lots as well as use the parking lot as a place to type reports or eat lunches. Officers at Bryden School are on schedule and will complete all of the State mandated school safety drills on or before their required completion dates.

Hilltop School

Officers assigned to the building: Officer John Turner, Officer Pete Messina

Police officer's basic daily timeline:

- Begin shift at 0700 hrs.
- 0725 – 0745 hrs. Officers will monitor student arrival to school.
- Patrol school grounds
- Monitor recess, specifically when students are out of the building.
- Be stationed in a visible area to monitor and be seen by visitors, students and staff entering the buildings.
- 1440 – 1500 hrs. Officers will monitor afternoon student dismissal.

Summary:

Since officers have been assigned to Hilltop School many positive changes have been made. The addition of officers has greatly improved the safety of students, staff, and visitors attending Hilltop. Teachers and staff include the police officers in the school email system, and advise the officers when they are exiting the building for an unscheduled reason. Hilltop School is in need of more, higher definition security cameras. This school year, one new high definition camera and 2 repurposed cameras have been added to camera system at Hilltop to combat the shortage of cameras at this school. Similar to Bryden School, Hilltop is in need of a more workable entry point for visitors/staff interaction, but as mentioned above I am hopeful for a consolidation. Again, officers are aware of the shortcomings and are focusing attention to them. Principal Miller and Assistant Principal Ciccone are on task with the State mandated requirements for safety drills. Hilltop School, because of the baseball fields, and setting of the park like playground, draws a lot of after hour visitors. Although the patrol division actively patrols the school parking lot, additional security cameras would deter unwanted activity.

Middle School

Officers assigned to the building: Officer Jerome Hall, Officer Anthony Thomas.

Police officer's basic daily timeline:

- Begin shift at 0700 hrs.
 - From 0705 - 0735 hrs. Officers will primarily monitor building entry, students, staff, and school bus arrival.
 - Patrol school grounds
 - Monitor times when students would be outside of the building for gym class.
 - Be stationed in a visible area to monitor and be seen by visitors, students and staff entering the buildings.
- 1430 – 1500 hrs. Officers will monitor afternoon student dismissal.

Summary:

Mr. Chase runs a very organized operation and is heavily involved all officer related aspects at the Middle School. Out of all of the buildings in the district, the Middle School has the most security cameras, per building size. There are high definition cameras focused on the parking lot and entry points of the school. Inside cameras are well placed and cover a majority of the school. The Middle School has already completed all of the State mandated school safety drills.

High School

Officer assigned to the building: Officer C.J. Piro

Police officer's basic daily timeline:

- Begin shift at 0700 hrs.
- From 0705 - 0745 hrs. Officer will primarily monitor building entry, students, staff, and school bus arrival.
- Patrol school grounds
- Monitor times when students would be outside of the building for gym class.
- Be stationed in a visible area to monitor and be seen by visitors, students and staff entering the buildings.
- 1430 - 1500 hrs. Officers will monitor afternoon student dismissal.

Summary:

Beachwood High School is an extremely busy building. It hosts 3 different Excel Tecc programs bringing in students from several different school districts. These vocational and learning opportunities, one of them being a school restaurant, add to the need for an officer in the school. The Principal, Mr. Srithai and Assistant Principal, Mr. Patti, have had previous experience working with a Police Officer in the schools. They have a very good understanding for when and how to involve the police. . They consistently inform me of any issues. They handle all of the school matters without police interaction, but will not hesitate to involve the police when needed. The high school has completed all of the school safety drills. Since beginning work at the high school, tighter security procedures were instituted. The staff has responded well to officers in the building, and with the approval of Mr. Patti and Mr. Srithai, I continue to speak to classes about current law enforcement and school related topics. All of the evening sporting events have an officer detailed to provide security. Open campus was ended starting in August of 2018. That has limited the number of students entering and exiting the school at random times. The High School has replaced three standard definition cameras with three high definition cameras on the main parking lot. Several new high definition cameras were added in the gym dramatically improving safety and security. Additional lighting on the visitor side of the stadium, and clear signage for visitors, and transitioning standard definition cameras for high definition cameras are recommended improvements.

Closing

Officers have helped to make the Beachwood City Schools a safer place. Every building is more secure. Police officer led safety discussions brought security, drilling, planning, and preparation to the forefront of everyone's mind. Security drills have gone well in all of the schools. School Police Officers have trained "active threat drills" in our own buildings. The MARCS radio system is tested monthly. Eleven schools, and the Jewish Federation Building, run weekly tests, on the MARCS system, through Beachwood Police Dispatch. Five of the schools are Beachwood City Schools, four are private schools located in Beachwood, two are private schools located in Pepper Pike, and one is Orange High School. Police officers being detailed to Beachwood Schools has made those seven non Beachwood City Schools a safer place by organizing and mandating radio testing. As an improvement from the previous school year, the district has purchased security cameras. While most of the buildings had some of the same shortcomings relating to CCTV cameras, the purchase of new cameras demonstrates that the District takes safety and security seriously and are taking steps to remediate those issues. K-9 training was also conducted on the High School campus during the school day. That event went well and is planned to continue while officers are detailed to the schools.

All of the principals have mutual goals and are extremely easy to work with. Every building's administration has open lines of communication with the police officers. They provide feedback and ideas when implementing new security measures. I have regular cadence meetings scheduled with each principal to ensure that any concerns are being addressed and remediated.

Beachwood Police Dispatch has recorded over 100 CR (calls responded to) incidents at school district buildings. Those calls were generated from both school police officers and road officers. The 100 recorded calls also included times when officers responded to District's buildings on weekends and when school was not in session. The calls requesting a police officer were primarily service type calls (alarms, vehicle lock-outs, premise checks, rescue squad calls, etc.). Road patrol officers logged several school visits this year. The number of road patrol officers visiting the schools has increased every year since officers have been detailed to the schools. That is a very positive and needed thing. The more that patrol officers visit, the more familiar they will be with the layout and operation of the schools making the schools an overall safer place.

Having officers detailed to the schools has dramatically improved the relationship between the community and the police department. No matter what building you would observe, you would frequently see interaction between the students and the officers assigned to the buildings. At all of the schools, officers will be seen in the cafeteria during a portion of the lunch periods. Students will often ask the officers to join them for lunch. In the lower schools officers will be outside when students are on recess. In the upper schools officers are involved in classroom discussions. All of the officers have done classroom and safety presentations at all of the schools. With the permission of Dr. Hardis, I again presented at The Mandel School providing safety presentations to students and staff. While working sporting events it is not uncommon to see students from all of the schools introducing officers to their parents. Dr. Hardis also supports Beachwood School Officers working with officers from other school districts. This April Beachwood High School is hosting a STEM expo. During that event I will be working with School Police Officers from Orange High School and Mayfield High School, giving an active presentation on the dangers of drunk driving. In my opinion, having officers in the schools has been better for community - police relations than any other community outreach plan the City currently has in action.

The agreement to have officers detailed to the Beachwood City Schools is working well, and Officers look forward to continuing to protect and serve in the district.

COMMUNITY RELATIONS

THE MISSION FOR EVERY MEMBER OF THE BEACHWOOD POLICE DEPARTMENT IS TO CONSISTENTLY SEEK AND FIND WAYS TO AFFIRMATIVELY PROMOTE, PRESERVE AND DELIVER A FEELING OF SECURITY, SAFETY AND QUALITY SERVICES TO MEMBERS OF OUR COMMUNITY.

The Beachwood Police Department's community policing efforts play an important role in delivering "a feeling of security, safety and quality services to members of our community." When personnel provide services that may be oriented towards safety and security matters, educational or related to crime prevention and community relations, they are helping their customers feel more secure as well as more appreciative of the work of their public servants. These kinds of actions can lead to increased trust and harmony between police personnel and the public they serve.

The Community Engagement Officer in 2018 was Officer Matthew Page. There were 77 community-policing events documented in 2018 with thousands in attendance. Due to current events, requests for presentations from the police department concentrated on active threat response training (ALICE). Other details or activities were bank presentations, general, safety talks, tabletop activities and planning, school classroom talks, school tours around the station and several block parties that officers attended and took photographs with residents.

The Beachwood Police Facebook and Twitter accounts were also active in 2018. Social media entries focused on lost dogs, power outages, road closures, general safety concerns and requests from the public to identify suspects.

Officer Page and Chief Haba attended Fall Festival and played games with hundreds of children and gave out prizes that were safety related or fun.

The Beachwood Police Department joined Safe Kids of Greater Cleveland Coalition in 2018. Officer Page went to several meetings and events where community resources are combined to create a safe environment for children. University Hospitals is the leader of this group. In December, the coalition held "Mocktail", an annual fundraiser for University Hospitals Rainbow Babies and Children's. Four Beachwood officers and two community services members volunteered to have a booth at the event. The BPD booth won "best presentation" at the event. Further, two plaques were awarded to the department for its involvement with the group.

The Senior Citizen's Academy and Safety Town were conducted during the summer. Safety Town officers were Ptl. Page and Ptl. Appell. The Senior Academy coordinator was Ptl. Page but there were many presenters from the department.

Coffee With a Cop was conducted October 3rd outside Nordstrom inside Beachwood Place Mall.

Officer Zugay trained Intellicorp on AED/First aid on December 7th.

Officers Page and Calvey became instructors in a national program called Rape Aggression Defense. They conducted a training class for women in October.

Members of the Beachwood Police Department will continue to try and reach out to those they serve through their community policing efforts in 2019. This effort will help our department in its mission of service to the Beachwood community.


This information not only allows the citizens to see what is happening within their community, but it also allows the police department to address areas of concern and better deploy resources as needed.




