TECHNOLOGY

The Beachwood Police Department continues to maintain its current technology and seeking advancements when appropriate.

In 2015, the Beachwood Police & Fire Dispatch center received new 911 equipment upgrades as part of a county-wide 911 system upgrade. This upgrade includes future ability to receive mobile phone text messaging to 911 once the standard is fully functional in our geographic region. Part of this upgrade included incorporating the city's internal phone system into dispatch to provide a single solution, whereas the dispatcher can operate a single system to answer either 911 or common ten digit calls. In addition, should the 911 system fail, dispatchers can continue to answer calls on the internal phone system.

A few years ago the police department began exploring the practicality of body worn cameras for its police officers. The systems at the time were either not purpose built or required a separate system different from the department's patrol car camera system.

In 2015 Panasonic, the maker of the department's current patrol car camera system announced the release of their latest body worn camera system to complement their recently updated patrol car camera system.

After hours of extensive research and some field testing, the department put together a proposal to city council to purchase 15 new patrol car camera systems and 55 body worn camera units by Panasonic.

The new patrol car camera systems will include four (4) high definition cameras around the vehicle to cover all sides, and one (1) camera inside the vehicle to record the backseat / prisoner compartment of the vehicle. The system includes the "hands off" wireless uploads, the ability to stream live video back to dispatch and/or other officers & supervisors.

The new body worn cameras will be purchased for each police officer for his/her use during the performance of their duties.

DISPATCH

In 2015, ongoing discussions continued among city leaders from Beachwood and multiple jurisdictions regarding the proposal of further regionalization of dispatch services. As a result, no major renovations or changes were made to the dispatch center. The most significant proposal for more widespread regional dispatch services never came to fruition and alternative plans are being weighed.

As always, however, needed upgrades and equipment were procured and put into operation in 2015. Some of the most significant ones are highlighted below:

- Two new dispatchers were hired in early 2015 to bring the unit up to full staffing. Both were veteran dispatchers from other agencies and they have become welcome additions.
- A much needed phone system upgrade took place. The new system has the phone call playback system built in as well as TTY (Tele-Type Writer- A telecommunication system for the deaf) capabilities incorporated.
- The state funded MARCS in Schools program was successfully initiated. This program provides radio equipment in all public and private schools within Beachwood and Pepper Pike, enabling school personnel to have direct and immediate contact with police dispatchers during an emergency.
- A partially-equipped fourth dispatch position was created.

Looking toward 2016, alternative scheduling will be implemented within the dispatch center to better maintain adequate manpower and reduce overtime costs. Proposals have been made for significant renovation and upgrades to bring the dispatch center to current industry and technology standards.

TRAFFIC

CRASH ACTIVITY

In 2015 there were 1,013 motor vehicle accidents reported to the Beachwood Police. Of this total, 268 occurred on private property. These accidents usually involve minor damage to the vehicles and were self-reported by the participants. There were 99 accidents that occurred on public roadways where the parties involved went to the police station and filled out the accident report themselves, with no further police involvement. These accidents are usually of a minor nature and the individuals involved did not feel it was a matter worth reporting to the police at the time of occurrence. At a later time, for insurance or other purposes, it was decided that a report should be filed.

Due to the limited enforcement options and the limited input to the design features of private property, statistics from private property are not used in the following comparison statistics. The accidents that occurred on the public roadways and were self-reported are not included in the comparisons as there is no official verification as to the validity of the report.

There were a total of 646 on street accidents investigated by the Beachwood Police Department in 2015. Of the 646 on street accidents 189 or 29 % involved personal injury, with 257 involved persons claiming injury.

FATAL CRASHES

There were two fatal single vehicle crashes in 2015:

On Tuesday 01/06/2015, a 22 year old male was driving alone on Green Road northbound at a high rate of speed on the snow covered roadway. The driver lost control of the vehicle and went off the left side of the roadway. At 3375 Green, the right side of the vehicle struck a utility pole. Driver was pronounced deceased at the scene. Medical Examiner's report showed that the driver had a blood alcohol content of .230.

On Thursday 10/22/2015, a 34 year old female was driving alone on I-271 southbound local lanes at a high rate of speed. Near the 30.8 mile post the driver lost control over her vehicle. The vehicle went off the left side of the roadway overturning and striking the concrete median barrier. Driver was pronounced deceased at the scene. Medical Examiner's report showed that the driver had a blood alcohol content of .216.

PEDESTRIAN INVOLVED CRASHES

There was one accident involving pedestrians within the public right of way:

On Saturday 04/11/15 at 11:22 A.M. a 62 year old female was pushing a stroller with a 3 year old male inside westbound in the crosswalk at Green Road and E. Carroll Boulevard with the pedestrian signal showing walk. A 75 year old female driver traveling eastbound on E. Carroll turned left at Green Road and failed to yield to the pedestrians in the crosswalk, striking the stroller and pedestrian. The 62 and 3 year olds received injuries and were transported to Ahuja Medical Center. The driver was cited for failing to yield to pedestrians within the crosswalk.

CAUSATIVE FACTORS AND ENFORCEMENT

When looking at causative factors, failure to maintain an assured clear distance ahead was listed as the causative factor in 332 crashes. In 2015, 316 drivers were issued citations for Failure to Maintain an Assured Clear Distance Ahead. In many cases, speed can be directly attributed to this type of crash. However, the continuing trend is an increase in cell phone use, i.e. calling, texting, e-mails etc. and it is our opinion that many of these crashes are directly related to driver inattention and or failure to maintain full time and attention to the operation of the motor vehicle.

Failure to Yield was listed as the causative factor on 66 crash reports. The Ohio OH-1 crash report does not differentiate between the various “failure to yield” violations. A review of our enforcement activity revealed the following:

- 41 citations issued for Failure to Yield while turning left
- 33 citations issued for Failure to Yield from a private drive
- 124 citations issued for Failure to Yield when changing lanes
- 10 citations issued for Failure to Yield to an emergency vehicle

Improper lane change was listed as the causative factor on 75 reports.

Failure to control was listed as the causative factor on 57 reports.

Red light violation was listed as the causative factor on 11 reports.

Improper backing was listed as the causative factor on 10 reports.

INTERSTATE I-271

The following crash activity occurred on I-271 northbound, southbound and includes all exit and entrance ramps:

1. On I-271 northbound local lanes, 4 reported crash.
2. On I-271 northbound express lanes, 1 reported crash.
3. On I-271 northbound exit to Chagrin, 6 reported crashes.
4. On I-271 southbound local lanes, 59 reported crashes
5. On I-271 southbound express lanes, 18 reported crashes.
6. On I-271 southbound entrance ramp from Cedar, 5 reported crashes.
7. On I-271 southbound exit ramp to Chagrin, 14 reported crashes.
8. On I-271 southbound exit ramp to Harvard, 4 reported crashes.

Assured clear distance was the most frequently listed causative factor in these crashes (46%) followed by failure to control (27%). Many of these crashes are a direct result of speed that was excessive for the conditions and driver inattention. Overall, 675 traffic stops were made on the interstate and 388 citations were issued for various traffic violations. We should maintain our high profile enforcement in this area.

TRAFFIC COMPLAINTS

The Beachwood Police Department receives some type of traffic complaint or concern from a motorist almost every day. The complaints range from suspected intoxicated drivers to a simple complaint of debris on the roadway.

When a traffic complaint is received our response is usually one of a few options. If the complaint is about a missing traffic sign or malfunctioning traffic signal, the traffic bureau will coordinate the adjustment, replacement or repair. Many times the complainant simply has a question that may need to be answered.

If the complaint involves motorists not obeying some type of traffic law, a police unit is dispatched and the complaint is also reviewed by the traffic bureau for further police response. After review, a special attention notice is usually posted and officers direct their discretionary enforcement time to the problem area.

In 2015, the police department received 723 traffic complaints (as defined above) called into dispatch. The number of complaints does not necessarily reflect the true total, as there are times where calls are directed to the traffic bureau, individuals speak directly to officers on the road, or complaints are sometimes relayed by other means such as email.

Applicable complaints were posted in a “traffic special attention” file and via email where all personnel can access, including those in patrol cars. In response, officers either give the area special attention by frequently patrolling the area (the most common), or they may set up on a traffic detail targeting the violation(s) that are the subject of the complaint for lengthier periods of time. In 2015, officers logged over 300 traffic details for various violations such as: speed, reckless operation, OVI, stop signs, and red lights.

SPEED AWARENESS TRAILER / TRAFFIC INFORMATION SIGN

The Speed Awareness Trailer was deployed throughout the city during the summer months. The trailer was placed in various locations based on complaints or officer observations. The unit was moved around the city to numerous locations. The trailer was used between May and October. It is stored during the winter months.

The portable traffic information sign was deployed throughout the city between April and October. The sign, which is trailer mounted, was placed at numerous locations for various reasons: construction, detours, delays, warnings on violations, races, and events. The sign is stored during the winter to prevent damage.

O.V.I. ARRESTS AND ENFORCEMENT

In 2015 the Beachwood Police Department made one hundred two (102) arrests for persons who were Operating a Vehicle while Under the Influence of alcohol and/or drugs (O.V.I.). Seventy-eight (78) were male and twenty-eight (24) were female. No juvenile was arrested for OVI.

Sixty (60) of the arrested persons submitted to a breath sample with the average Blood Alcohol Content (BAC) level being .155 which is almost twice the legal limit of .08. The highest reading was .245, which is more than three (3) times the legal limit. Twenty-five (25) persons refused to provide a sample.

Due to circumstances, eighteen (18) persons were requested to provide blood samples. Two (2) persons refused to submit to the test. Fourteen (14) were found to be over the legal limit or had been using drugs of abuse. Two (2) results are still pending.

Eighteen (18) of the violators had at least one (1) prior conviction. Five (5) had two (2) or more priors. One had six (6).

There were nine (9) traffic crash related O.V.I.'s in 2015.

The bulk of O.V.I. arrests were made between 2400 hours and 0400 hours (61%) The busiest days of the week for O.V.I. activity were again late Saturday night and early Sunday morning which is a regular trend. The month of August had the most number of arrests with 18. The roadways with the highest number arrests were Interstate 271 with 26, Richmond Road with 23, Cedar Road with 15, and Chagrin Boulevard with 13.

All O.V.I. cases are adjudicated in the Shaker Hts. Municipal Court with the exception of juvenile O.V.I. cases which are handled through Cuyahoga County Juvenile Court and felony O.V.I. situations which are handled in Cuyahoga County Courts.

Over the last several years, results from the O.V.I. analysis were distributed to the patrol division for O.V.I. details, specifically targeting areas and times where statistically we've made the most arrests. This allows for more concentrated enforcement as opposed to regular patrol where officers patrol all areas and respond to calls.

OVERALL TRAFFIC ENFORCEMENT

Officers made over 4,500 traffic stops in 2015 that resulted in one of the following: citation issued, written warning, verbal warning, or arrest. There were 964 speeding citations issued, 105 red light citations, 373 vehicle registration violations, 134 stop sign violations, and 253 motorists cited for driving under suspension. Officers issued 416 written warnings and over 1,924 verbal warnings. Eighty (80) tickets were issued for “Use of Electronic Communications Device While Driving” ordinance.

Overall, our traffic enforcement program is on target with our intentions to direct our focus on specific problem areas but not at the expense of other areas. We should maintain our consistent level of enforcement along our major streets and highways. We will continue to direct our discretionary enforcement time to the areas where complaints have been received but not at the expense of ignoring other criminal activity trends.

When reviewing the traffic details that are logged in areas where we get complaints, oftentimes the officer spends 20-30 minutes and logs “no violations observed.” The fact that a marked police cruiser / SUV is in the area is a deterrent to the violations that result in complaints, but yields less enforcement. The use of motorcycles helps that cause.

TRAFFIC SIGNALS

The Beachwood Police Traffic Bureau is assigned the tasks of monitoring and maintaining the four traffic signal systems and forty (40) traffic signals owned by the City of Beachwood. The monitoring of traffic signals is done on a daily basis by a central traffic computer located in the Traffic Bureau. Officers also observe the traffic systems while on patrol to make sure that the signals are working properly.

While officers do not repair the traffic signals, they are usually the first person to realize there is a problem with a traffic signal. When a hardware problem is detected the Beachwood Police call the Signal Service Company in Warrensville Heights. Signal Service responded to 114 repair calls for the City of Beachwood in 2015.

TOWED VEHICLES

In 2015, the Traffic Bureau managed the Beachwood Police Department vehicle towing operation. This operation includes overseeing the towing and impounding of vehicles seized during the routine performance of police duties and the disposal of all unclaimed vehicles in accordance with state law. Complete records of all vehicles towed and their disposition are maintained.

In 2015 the Beachwood Police Department contracted with three tow companies to provide towing services. The companies were Interstate Towing, Mooney's Towing, and Rich's Towing. Police dispatchers used a rotation system to ensure that each company gets an equitable share of the police tows. Exceptions to this rotation are if a tow company either cannot respond at the time requested or cannot respond with specific requested equipment such as a flatbed or dolly. Interstate Towing and Rich's Towing are equipped to handle large tows of semi's and heavy equipment. Tow companies were authorized to charge \$125 for a standard tow (additional fees for extra labor, i.e. use of a dolly, winch-outs, etc.) and \$15 per day for storage.

In 2015 there were 755 vehicles towed, this includes 147 private tows. Private tows are those that the Police may have called for at the request of the driver but no further Police action was taken. Of the vehicles towed, 23 were unclaimed and scrapped.

SAFETY TOWN

Safety Town for 2015 took place from July 28th to August 7th. Shannon Diamond, from the Beachwood Recreation Department, assisted with putting the program together. The main instructor was Debbie Rubenstein, a teacher at Bryden Elementary School. Ptl. Jacqueline Zywiec and Lt. Tom Wetzel assisted Ms. Rubenstein with Safety Town. Students from the Beachwood Middle School and High School sign up as volunteers to help run the program. There were three sessions for the students. Session one was from 9:00 AM to 11:00 AM and had 18 students enrolled. Session two was from 12:30 PM to 2:30 PM and had 15 students enrolled. Session three was from 3:30 PM to 5:00 PM and had 30 students enrolled. Each class started with the students entering into the classroom to meet with the counselors. Once the lesson for the day was discussed, students were split into two groups. One group would begin outside with officers, where they would be able to practice being pedestrians and ride pedal go karts around safety town to practice traffic signals. The other group would stay inside with Ms. Rubenstein and go over a daily activity that relates to the lesson from the day. The groups changed places, allowing all students to participate in both indoor and outdoor activities. For the last ten minutes of class, an instructor would read a story to the children.

The classes for Safety Town consisted of:

- Day 1 – July 28th – Traffic Safety
- Day 2 – July 29th – Role of a Police Officer and Safety Signs
- Day 3 – July 30th – Bus Safety
- Day 4 – July 31st – Bike and Traffic Light Safety
- Day 5 – August 3rd – Home and Poison Safety
- Day 6 – August 4th – Role of a Fireman and Telephone
- Day 7 – August 5th – Field Trip to Police and Fire Station
- Day 8 – August 6th – Strangers
- Day 9 – August 7th – Graduation

DETECTIVE BUREAU

The Beachwood Police Department Detective Bureau consists of three full time detectives as well as a detective supervisor. At times, certain patrol officers were assigned on a temporary basis to assist with special investigations involving sexual assault, prostitution and drug trafficking.

In 2015 the Detective Bureau investigated a total of 209 cases to include 96 juvenile cases handled by the juvenile detective. This overall number is not an increase from the prior year, however, some of the incidents that were investigated over the past year have been very complex and time consuming. The majority of the investigations conducted were for theft related incidents and credit card fraud.

Of the juvenile cases investigated, the majority were for theft related incidents. The juveniles that qualified were enrolled in the juvenile diversion program under the supervision of the juvenile detective.

The detective bureau also conducted background investigations for the new fulltime police officers that were hired as well as the part time officers that were assigned at the Beachwood Schools.

The Patrol Division continued to conduct the preliminary investigation and follow up on most minor cases. This enabled the detective bureau to concentrate on the more complicated cases and gives the patrol officers experience in investigating cases.

INTERNAL AFFAIRS

In 2015, there were two incidents investigated as Internal Affairs complaints and four incidents which were investigated as inquiries.

The Internal Affairs complaints were investigated and determined to be unfounded. The first complaint alleged that the police officers handled a situation in a manner that was based on the race of the parties involved. The second informal complaint was from an arrested male that claimed that the police officers broke his cell phone.

There were four inquiries, all of which were determined to be unfounded and handled according to Beachwood Police Department policy. Three of the inquiries were traffic related and one was an animal complaint.

A review of the 2015 Internal Affairs complaints reveal a decrease in the number of total complaints compared to 2014. There is not any one common complaint that would suggest a need to address a particular issue.

JUVENILE DIVISION

The Beachwood Juvenile Division was under the supervision of Det. McFadden throughout the year 2015. The following is a summary of investigation casework completed by Det. McFadden:

The Juvenile Division investigated 94 cases that resulted in 120 juvenile arrests in 2015. 116 of those arrests were misdemeanor level and 4 were felony level. One of those arrests resulted in transport and incarceration at the Cuyahoga County Juvenile Detention facility. There were 0 Domestic Violence related juvenile arrests. There was 1 Traffic related juvenile arrests. There were 6 Drug and/or Alcohol related juvenile arrests. There were 11 Curfew/Unruly Child arrests. There were 94 Theft related juvenile arrests.

31 of the 120 juvenile arrests were handled as Beachwood Juvenile Diversion Program cases, in lieu of forwarding charges to the Cuyahoga County Juvenile Court. The rest were filed with that court for adjudication, to include County-sponsored diversion programs, Drug Court programs, Traffic Court programs, and Criminal Court proceedings.

The above numbers indicate a 9% increase in juvenile offenses from the last reporting period (120 arrests vs. 111). Theft offenses, and more specifically, shopliftings, are the largest criminal problem involving juveniles in Beachwood. The Beachwood Place Mall stores: Sephora, H & M, Dillard's and Claire's Boutique remain as the most-targeted by such offenders. These stores continue to initiate post-offense civil actions against the juvenile's parents by issuing letters of demand for time and merchandise reimbursement. Though not associated with juvenile criminal procedures, these civil actions create incentive and reimbursement for loss prevention teams.

Det. McFadden remains in close contact with Cuyahoga County Juvenile Court administrators Angela Ortiz (Senior Intake and Diversion Officer) and Judith Headland (Criminal Complaints Administrator). Beachwood submits juvenile case filings by mail, as directed by the most recent operating rules published by the Cuyahoga County Juvenile Court/Cuyahoga County Prosecutor's Office administration team. Det. McFadden regularly utilizes the County's "iCase" Juvenile Records system to access prior case, personal data, and family data information about the juvenile arrestees and determine their eligibility for local diversion.

Det. McFadden maintains membership in the Ohio Police Juvenile Officers Association and attended its recent training conference in Canton, Ohio.

JUVENILE DIVERSION PROGRAM

The Beachwood Police Department Diversion Program is employed as a case closing option whenever possible. 31 juvenile arrestees completed this first-offender program in 2015, a slight increase since last reporting. It is administrated by the juvenile detective, working in concert with the juvenile offender's parent or guardian.

Not all arrestees qualify, and those that do sometimes decline to follow through on the program requirements. Candidates for diversion must have no reported prior criminal history within the Cuyahoga County (or neighboring) juvenile justice system. They must have exhibited full cooperation with loss prevention and police authorities during their apprehension and arrest investigation. Only single, misdemeanor, non-violent, non-traffic criminal actions are considered for diversion.

Offenders and their parents/guardians must affirm their interest and willingness to complete the program in a timely manner and according to the detective's instructions. A five-page essay about their criminal actions must be completed satisfactorily within an allowed time period. Eight hours of community service must then be accomplished to satisfy the program requirements. This community service is now accomplished within the offender's locale at facilities acceptable to the parent/guardian, juvenile offender, and juvenile detective on a case by case basis. In 2015, local churches, nursing homes, hospitals, food centers, and community outreach agencies within the Cleveland area have benefitted from the offenders' time and efforts. The change in venue to the offender's own neighborhood has eased transportation issues uncovered in past diversions and fostered a sense of community pride and involvement within the juvenile offender participants.

The cases are filed within the Beachwood Police Department at the conclusion of the diversion program and charges are not forwarded to the Cuyahoga County Juvenile Court. Since no record of the offense is readily available to other departments after the completion of a Beachwood diversion, candidates are chosen to fit standards of low repeat-offense likelihood.

TRAINING

The police department is committed to developing and maintaining an effective training program for agency members, with purpose to better prepare employees to act decisively and correctly in a broad spectrum of situations. The program will also promote individual growth and development as well as agency goals and values.

Training policy 03-16

The Beachwood Police Department provided a variety of training to personnel during 2015. This comprehensive effort included training from department trainers, outside companies, reading material and video instruction to include content from PoliceOne.com. During the year, various police officers received training on Narcan spray, OC spray, Taser, use of force, defensive tactics, firearms and prisoner search techniques. All department personnel received an update on cultural diversity, ethics, integrity and discretion. During the year, one officer completed the police academy and a supervisor completed the Police Executive Leadership College.

Special emphasis was placed on active threats and included a training scenario at the Cleveland Clinic at 26900 Cedar Road on June 18, exercises at the Fuchs Mizrahi school on August 13 and the Beachwood Place Mall on September 28, a table top exercise at the Jewish Federation of Cleveland and training at the Beachwood High School on December 21 and 22. Patrol personnel also practiced training exercises at the station as part of a lesson plan on active threats.

Special attention was also placed on officer driving. This effort included actual driving exercises in our police lot, training videos that address safety issues such as seat belt use and controlling vehicle speeds as well as information on the Below 100 project which includes special emphasis on cruiser operation. Officers also received tire deflation update training.

During the year, officers received regular update training related to officer safety/survival and instructors from University Hospitals provided bleed control training. Numerous officers attended instruction outside of the department to include attendance at courses provided by the Ohio Peace Officer Training Academy, the Ohio Highway Patrol Academy and the Northcoast Polytechnic Institute. Costs for this training stayed within the allotted budget. The Continuing professional training requirements mandated through the state were met by department officers.

PATROL

USE OF FORCE

Members of the police department were involved in three reportable use of force incidents during 2015. The definition of “reportable use of force” in the department policy manual is as follows:

An incident in which an on-duty department employee, or off-duty employee whose occupation is a factor, uses any deadly force, any less-lethal control device, or any physical force:

- To compel a person to comply with the employee’s directions, or efforts to gain control
- To prevent escape or overcome resistance by a suspect during an arrest or detention,
- To defend any person from an aggressive action by a suspect
- That results in the injury, reported injury, or suspected injury of another person

Reportable force exceptions:

- The use of a firm grip or “control holds” to control only, which does not result in injury or the appearance of injury (e.g. the use of a grip to control the suspect’s hands while searching or handcuffing); or
- That force needed to overcome the passive resistance due to physical disability or intoxication that does not result in injury or the appearance of injury (e.g. lifting an intoxicated person to a standing position)

Of the three incidents, a Taser was deployed in two of them and the third consisted of an officer attempting to grab a suspect and pushing them to the ground. One incident involved a single officer, one involved a Beachwood officer with an off-duty officer from another jurisdiction, and the third involved multiple officers.

No injuries were reported by the officers, though one pair of uniform pants was destroyed. Only minor injuries were reported or observed regarding the suspects involved.

The following are brief descriptions of the incidents:

2/28/2015 I-271 Southbound Exit Ramp to Chagrin Blvd. Report #1508972

A significant vehicle crash occurred on I-271 northbound in Pepper Pike. Callers reported that a male suspect at fault in the crash removed the license plates from the vehicle and fled on foot

to the west into Beachwood toward the I-271 southbound exit ramp to Chagrin Blvd. An officer observed the male at that location and ordered the male to stop. The officer gave chase on foot and deployed a Taser as the male began to climb a fence to the west. The Taser probes did not strike the suspect and the officer continued to give chase through heavy snow after climbing the fence and continuing west. The suspect slipped and fell in the parking lot of P.F. Changs, allowing the officer to catch up. The suspect continued to resist and the officer attempted to drive-stun the male with the Taser but that was ineffective due to the suspect's heavy clothing. The officer was able to gain control of the suspect and apply handcuffs. The suspect had minor injuries both from the crash and from scraping his hands on the pavement from his fall. The Taser did not produce any injuries. The suspect was taken into custody by Pepper Pike P.D.

12/5/2015 Ahuja Hospital Emergency Room Report #1553701

Beachwood officers responded to assist hospital police with a naked combative male in an exam room. The male had barricaded himself in the room and damaged medical equipment in the room. Officers trained in crisis intervention techniques attempted to verbally de-escalate the situation unsuccessfully. The male continued to damage property and equipment in the room and officers entered the room. One officer deployed a Taser successfully and the male was brought under control, restrained, and turned over to the hospital staff. The only visible injuries to the subject were the two minor Taser probe entry points and self-inflicted wounds to his knuckles from punching the door, walls and medical equipment.

12/6/2015 Parking Lot of Beachwood Place Mall Report #1553881

An officer responded to assist an off-duty officer from another jurisdiction who was chasing a female shoplifter on foot. Upon arrival, the off-duty officer was struggling with the female in a car. The female was trying to get the car in gear to flee the area. The officer ordered the female out of the car and she complied. As the officer attempted to grab her arm to apply handcuffs, the female ran. The officer gave chase on foot through the parking lot and eventually caught up to the suspect. As officer was again trying to grasp her arm the female continued to try to break away and the officer pushed her to the ground where she was restrained and handcuffed. The suspect sustained minor abrasions to an arm, thigh and face.

All of the above reportable use of force instances were determined to be reasonable for the circumstances and justified. There were no complaints of excessive force by the subjects involved. No single officer was involved in more than one of the incidents.

Considering the number of arrests and contacts Beachwood officers encounter in a year, having only three reportable use of force incidents is quite low. The low number can likely be attributed to consistent ongoing training and the fact that the department usually has adequate manpower to provide back-up officers quickly to help diffuse potential threats before they become actual threats requiring the use of force.

Officers receive regular training on crisis intervention, diversity, and the use of force. All sworn officers receive annual recertification in the use of the Taser, pepper spray, duty pistol and patrol rifle.

HOT PURSUIT

The police department engaged in three vehicle pursuits in 2015. All three were initiated by individual officers and no officer was involved in more than one. Two resulted from attempted traffic stops of stolen vehicles and the third resulted from a stolen vehicle that fled a high-risk traffic stop by Shaker Hts. P.D.

Two of the pursuits ended in crashes and the third was terminated by the officer and supervisor. That suspect vehicle caused minor damage to another vehicle afterwards while still fleeing the area. The average time of the pursuits was less than 56 seconds. No known bodily injuries resulted from any of them.

Below is a brief description of each vehicle pursuit:

8/6/2015 Parking Lot of Beachwood Place Mall Report # 1534658

An officer observed a vehicle on Cedar Rd. that a license plate check revealed was stolen. That officer was unable to safely turn around and engage the vehicle in a traffic stop and the vehicle was unable to be located. A second officer was checking the parking lot of Beachwood Place Mall a short time later and observed the vehicle and occupants driving in the upper level south parking lot. The officer tried to initiate a traffic stop but after a momentary pause, the vehicle fled through the parking lot to the west. The suspect vehicle proceeded at increasingly high rates of speed around the west and north sides of the mall before exiting on the east side of the mall, at which time the officer and supervisor terminated the pursuit and any further attempt to stop the vehicle. The suspect vehicle did end up striking, and causing minor damage to, another vehicle stopped at George Zeiger Dr. and Cedar Rd. while continuing to flee the area. The pursuit lasted approximately 88 seconds.

8/10/2015 Cedar Road Report #1535285

An officer observed a vehicle stopped at a red light on George Zeiger Dr. that had been straddling two lanes. A registration check revealed that the vehicle was stolen. When the suspect vehicle reached Cedar Rd., the driver committed a traffic violation. The officer attempted to stop the vehicle on Cedar Rd. and the driver immediately accelerated to a high rate of speed and tried to negotiate a left turn onto Richmond Road unsuccessfully, striking a utility pole. The female driver (juvenile) and an adult male passenger immediately fled on foot and were arrested minutes later. The suspects were not injured in the crash and the pursuit lasted approximately 20 seconds.

Shaker Hts. P.D. advised that they were about to attempt a traffic stop on a vehicle on Chagrin Blvd. near Warrensville Center Road. The vehicle was reported stolen by a Beachwood resident the day before. An officer responded to the area where Shaker Hts. P.D. had the suspect vehicle stopped on Belvoir near Chagrin Blvd. Shaker Hts. P.D. units began ordering the occupants from the vehicle, at which time the driver fled from the scene toward the Beachwood officer and another Shaker Hts. P.D. officer at Halworth and Belvoir. The Beachwood officer attempted to stop the vehicle and pursued it on Halworth, Cranby and Halburton Roads eastbound. The suspect vehicle attempted to make a left turn onto Letchworth Rd. unsuccessfully, striking a parked car, a tree and a house. Multiple occupants fled from the vehicle on foot. No known bodily injuries resulted from the crash. The pursuit lasted approximately 59 seconds.

Because of the inherent risks and danger of vehicle pursuits, each pursuit is reviewed in its entirety shortly after the occurrence to be critiqued and analyzed for training purposes and policy compliance.

In the incidents that occurred in 2015, two reviews showed no significant variations from policy and the third did indicate minor policy violations. All three incidents had training value and as a result of the reviews, refresher training in the departmental pursuit policy was administered to all patrol officers, to include examination of all three pursuits.

ILLEGAL PROFILING REPORT

A fundamental right guaranteed by the Constitution of the United States to all who live in this nation is the equal protection under the law. Along with this right to equal protection is the fundamental right to be free from unreasonable searches and seizures by government agents. Citizens are free to walk and drive our streets, highways, and other public places without police interference so long as they obey the law. They also are entitled to be free from crime, and from the depredations of criminals, and to drive and walk our public ways safe from the actions of reckless and careless drivers.

This law enforcement agency is charged with protecting these rights, for all, regardless of race, color, ethnicity, sex, sexual orientation, age, physical handicap, religion or other belief system, and/or other classification or group affiliation.

The purpose of the Illegal Profiling policy is to unequivocally state that illegal profiling in law enforcement is totally unacceptable, to provide guidelines for officers to prevent such occurrences, and to protect our officers when they act within the dictates of the law and policy from unwarranted accusations.

It is the policy of this department to patrol in a proactive manner, to aggressively investigate suspicious persons and circumstances, and to actively enforce the motor vehicle laws, while insisting that citizens will only be stopped or detained when there exists reasonable suspicion to believe they have committed, are committing, or are about to commit an infraction of the law or when the situation leads an officer to believe that a person may need some type of assistance.

To that end, members of the Beachwood Police Department receive regular training in:

- Proactive enforcement tactics
- Laws governing search and seizure
- Illegal Profiling – including legal aspects
- Cultural diversity
- Interpersonal communications skills
- Officer safety

The training programs emphasize the need to respect the rights of all citizens to be free from unreasonable government intrusion or police action. In addition to these training programs, patrol shift supervisors are required to monitor the enforcement activity of their subordinates to verify that officers are conducting themselves within the guidelines of this policy.

The following aspects of officer activity were examined to ensure that the policies of the agency are being adhered to:

1. Motor vehicle stops to include citations and written warnings

2. Field contact interviews
3. Citizen complaints of illegal profiling

Beachwood officers issued a total of 2,846 traffic citations and 446 written warnings in 2015. Of those, 55.2% were issued to motorists identified as being white; 35.0% as being African-American; 2.3% as being Asian; 0.2% as being American Indian/Alaskan native; and 7.3% as other/unknown. These totals are representative of the motoring public in the area of Beachwood and are basically unchanged over recent years. Also of the citations and warnings issues, 51% were issued to males and 49% to females.

Officers of the Beachwood Police Department, within the scope of their authority, are required to obtain all pertinent information whenever direct contact is made with a suspicious or questionable person.

The “field inquiry” is based upon the principle that the opportunity to apprehend criminals and to prevent crime increases with the number and frequency of persons interviewed. Field interviews serve the following purposes:

- Source of information
- Means of identifying suspects
- Means of obtaining suspects or witness
- Crime Prevention

Field contacts occur when an officer initiates contact with an individual. Reasonable suspicion is the key element on which an officer bases his/her decision to conduct a field interview. The reasonable suspicion is based on either an officer’s observations or secondhand information. If the field interview does not meet this requirement, the officer may still seek to talk to the individual while realizing that the person is under no obligation to answer the officer’s questions or remain with the officer. The unusual or suspicious actions of people trigger a field interview. Typical examples of a field contact interview would be due to an occupied vehicle in the parking lot of a closed business, or pedestrians seen late at night in an area where recent vehicle break-ins have taken place.

Of the 108 field contacts made by officers in 2015, the overwhelming majority (76%) were made during hours of darkness (9:00pm -6:00am). 69% of the subjects were identified as male and 31% as female. Regarding males, 57% were identified as being white, 38% as African-American, and 5% as other/unknown. For the females, 54% were identified as being white, 44% as African-American, and 2% as other/unknown. These statistics roughly mirror those for the traffic citations and warnings.

There was one citizen complaint made in 2015 in which the complainant alleged that members of the department made work or enforcement decisions based on race. This was not necessarily a complaint of illegal profiling, but is along the same lines. The complaint was regarding an incident that took place in June of 2015 in which officers were summoned to deal

with a disturbance between two utility work crews who were arguing. Upon arrival, the officers separated the involved persons, spoke to work crew supervisors, and settled the situation to the satisfaction of everyone on scene. One of the work crews was predominantly white and the other was predominantly African-American.

Days later, one of the African-American work crew members arrived at the police station to complain that he was threatened at the scene of the incident and that officers did not comply with requests at the time to charge the alleged offender with a crime due to the race of the parties involved. The complaint and incident were investigated to the fullest extent possible, to include numerous follow-up interviews and meetings with the complainant, officers, work crew members and work crew supervisors. Video and audio from the cruisers at the scene were also examined. Upon conclusion of the investigation, it was positively determined that no Beachwood officer acted outside of policies or procedures and no misconduct had occurred on the part of any officer. There were no requests for criminal charges to be filed by any one on the scene of the initial occurrence. The complaint against the officers was classified as unfounded. The portion of the complaint regarding the filing of criminal charges was turned over to and reviewed by the city prosecutor, as is customary in such instances.

After review of the above-mentioned elements of departmental activity in regards to illegal profiling, it is determined that in 2015, the police department and its employees were in compliance with the policies relating to illegal profiling.

MAYOR'S COURT

Beachwood Mayor's Court processes and hears all uncontested non-serious misdemeanor offenses. If a case is contested, the case is then transferred to the Shaker Heights Municipal Court in Shaker Heights, Ohio. All felony or serious offenses are automatically processed by either Cuyahoga County Common Pleas Court, in the case of a felony, or Shaker Heights Municipal Court, in the case of a serious offense.

In 2015, 2846 traffic and 84 criminal cases were filed with the Beachwood Mayor's Court. A total of 374 parking violations were filed with the court.

In 2015, Mayor's Court transferred 171 contested cases to Shaker Heights Municipal Court. There were 691 cases filed directly with Cuyahoga County Common Pleas Court, Cuyahoga County Prosecutor's Office, Cuyahoga County Juvenile Court, or Shaker Heights Municipal Court.

JAIL FACILITY

In 2015, 802 people were processed in the Beachwood City Jail, 507 males and 295 females. We housed 2 people for a short period of time, less than twenty four hours, on a mutual aid basis. We housed 36 people for the City of Pepper Pike and 17 people for Orange Village. We also housed 29 people as time servers. Beachwood officers arrested 718 people for crimes in Beachwood. Thefts and related crimes account for the majority of these arrests followed by outstanding warrants. Beachwood officers also arrested 115 juveniles that were processed in juvenile booking. At the request of the Cuyahoga County Juvenile Detention Center, 3 of those juveniles were transported to their facility. Juvenile arrests increased by 13 from 2014. Adults arrested by Beachwood officers decreased by 13 from 2014.

In the past, the vast majority of time servers were sentenced county prisoners. On March 23rd, 2015, The Cuyahoga County Sheriff's Department started housing all county time servers. As a result of this, the number of time servers being housed in the Beachwood City Jail dropped drastically. The county prisoners that were housed in the Beachwood City Jail were typically for three days or less.

The City of Beachwood continues to house inmates for the City of Pepper Pike. In 2015, 36 prisoners were housed which resulted in revenue for the City of Beachwood in the amount of \$6,545.00. The City of Beachwood started housing prisoners for Orange Village in July of 2015 and 17 prisoners were housed which generated \$2,235.00 in revenue. The additional work load did not present any adverse effects on the jail operations.

The housing of prisoners for other cities will continue to be monitored to ensure the daily operations of the jail are not affected. For the time being, the decrease in county time servers has offset the increase in prisoners being housed from other cities.

The Bureau of Adult Detention inspected the Beachwood City Jail in June 2015, and it was found to be in full compliance with state regulations.

The primary stated goal for the Beachwood City Jail is to maintain a facility that is safe, secure, in good repair and in compliance with state regulations. As noted above, the jail was inspected in 2015 by the state as well as the fire department and county health officials. The jail was inspected weekly by staff for security concerns and monthly for any health, safety and sanitation concerns. Any observed problems were addressed immediately. There were no major substantiated incidents reported in 2015. No staff members or inmates sustained injuries from incidents within the facility keeping us on track to achieve and maintain our stated goals.

SPECIALTY UNITS

COMPUTER CRIMES / FORENSIC UNIT

The Beachwood Police Department has the ability to examine most computers, investigate computer related crimes, and to view and enhance most video within the department. Rather than taking months to have a computer, video tape or file examined by outside agencies, the department has the ability to do it in house.

Ptl. Daniel Grein and Ptl. Aaron Lieb are trained in processing and enhancing video tapes or files, and are also certified by the state of Ohio to process recovered computer data.

In 2015, more than 7 Computer related cases were investigated. The cases are outlined as:

1. *Harassing Communication – Investigation of subject who was sending anonymous text messages using an application to disguise his identity. (15-28607)*
2. *Assault / Abduction – Processed a cellular smart phone for investigation by patrol personnel. (15-49605)*
3. *Fleeing & Eluding – Processed a cellular phone for investigation by detective bureau personnel. (1535721)*
4. *Voyeurism –Processed cellular phone, iPad, iPod, and mini DVR for investigation by detective personnel. (15-33608)*
5. *Patient Abuse - Processed cellular phone for investigation by detective personnel. (Report 15-13512)*
6. *Theft –Processed a cellular phone for investigation by detective personnel. (15-13824)*
7. *Carrying a Concealed Weapon (CCW) –Processed a cellular phone for investigation by detective personnel. (15-02898)*

As computer crimes increase and become more sophisticated, the Beachwood Police Department has continued to improve its officer's technology and training in the field of computer and cellular phone examinations.

RECRUITMENT

2015 was an “inactive” recruitment year for the department, due to an entrance examination in 2014 and an active candidate list. Five Patrol Officers were hired in 2015 and have all been retained. Recruitment Officers continue to keep a database of all parties interested in applying for the position of Police Patrol Officer.

EMERGENCY SERVICES TEAM

The role of law enforcement in all cases, including riotous activity, insurrection, barricaded subjects, execution of narcotics warrants, arrest of dangerous felons and the rescue of hostages or endangered persons, is the protection of lives and property.

Eastside Departments Group Enforcement (EDGE) SWAT is a team of specially trained police officers comprised of members of the Beachwood, Euclid, Shaker Heights, South Euclid and University Heights police departments, which will respond to any incident where special weapons and tactics are needed within the member jurisdictions.

The unit consists of highly trained personnel with specific skills in the areas of marksmanship, tactical response and containment, deployment of chemical munitions and hostage negotiations. EDGE SWAT is under the direct supervision of a unit Commander and Assistant Commander, with governing authority derived through the EDGE Agency Agreement.

The EDGE SWAT team trains 16 hours per month (two 8 hour training days) as well as one 40 hour training week per year. Those members trained as snipers train an additional 8 hours per month as per the National Tactical Officer’s Association SWAT standard for a part time SWAT team. The focus of this training is the safe resolution of situations such as Barricaded Suspects, Hostage Situations, VIP Security, High Risk Warrants and other specialized assignments through the use of advanced tactics and firearms training.

During 2015 the EDGE SWAT team was activated and responded to thirty-nine calls for service.

SCHOOLS

In 2015 a school security unit was formed to provide a uniformed police officer presence at all Beachwood Board of Education facilities and events throughout the school year. Ptl. CJ Piro was assigned as the school security liaison and is responsible for scheduling, training and supervising the school security officers, as well as being present on one of the sites.

Training for the officers who are detailed to the schools began before the start of the school year. The training consisted of: legal updates, school building orientation, basic coverage of O.D.E. rules and laws, CPR/AED and first aid training, ALICE orientation, use of force/defensive tactics/alternative restraint methods training, Taser and duty weapon training, and any needed OPOTA certifications needed for this position.

While on duty at the schools, officers provide safety and protection to students, staff, and school buildings. They are involved in student and staff arrival and dismissal from school, patrol grounds, lock/unlock doors, watch security cameras, monitor daily school activities such as lunch, recess, hallway activity during class switches.

Officers have helped to make the Beachwood City Schools a safer place to learn and work. Every building is more secure. Police officer led safety discussions brought security, drilling, planning, and preparation to the forefront of everyone's mind. Security drills have gone well in all of the schools. Officers have used the schools for training. Training is scheduled with school transportation, so that officers and SWAT members can train on school buses. A visitor management system is slated for early in 2016. Portable radios, for immediate and better communication between officers and staff are being investigated. In service training is scheduled. The MARCS radio system is tested weekly. Eleven schools run weekly tests, on the MARCS system, through Beachwood Police Dispatch. Five of the schools are Beachwood City Schools, four are private schools located in Beachwood, two are private schools located in Pepper Pike, and one is Orange High School. Police officers being detailed to Beachwood Schools have made those seven non Beachwood City Schools a safer place by organizing and mandating radio testing.

COMMUNITY RELATIONS

THE MISSION FOR EVERY MEMBER OF THE BEACHWOOD POLICE DEPARTMENT IS TO CONSISTENTLY SEEK AND FIND WAYS TO AFFIRMATIVELY PROMOTE, PRESERVE AND DELIVER A FEELING OF SECURITY, SAFETY AND QUALITY SERVICES TO MEMBERS OF OUR COMMUNITY.

The Beachwood Police Department's community policing efforts play an important role in delivering "a feeling of security, safety and quality services to members of our community." When personnel provide services which may be oriented towards safety and security matters, educational or related to crime prevention and community relations, they are helping their customers feel more secure as well as more appreciative of the work of their public servants. These kinds of actions lead to increased trust and harmony between police personnel and the public they serve.

Members of this agency were active in community policing throughout the year and had a positive impact upon those who live and work in the city of Beachwood. This work included participating in the Green Road Synagogue child safety fair, presenting a safety talk to a Holocaust Survivors' Group, attending safety meetings with different customers, reading to school children, teaching in the Senior Citizen Academy, bank alarm talks and Safety Town.

Other services included providing ALICE presentations to schools and businesses, visits to daycare centers to discuss safety with children, providing self-defense classes, attending the Honkin Haulin event and meeting and greeting store employees at the Beachwood Place Mall to address crime prevention. Beachwood personnel participated in over 130 different events and reached or had exposure to over approximately 5,000 people.

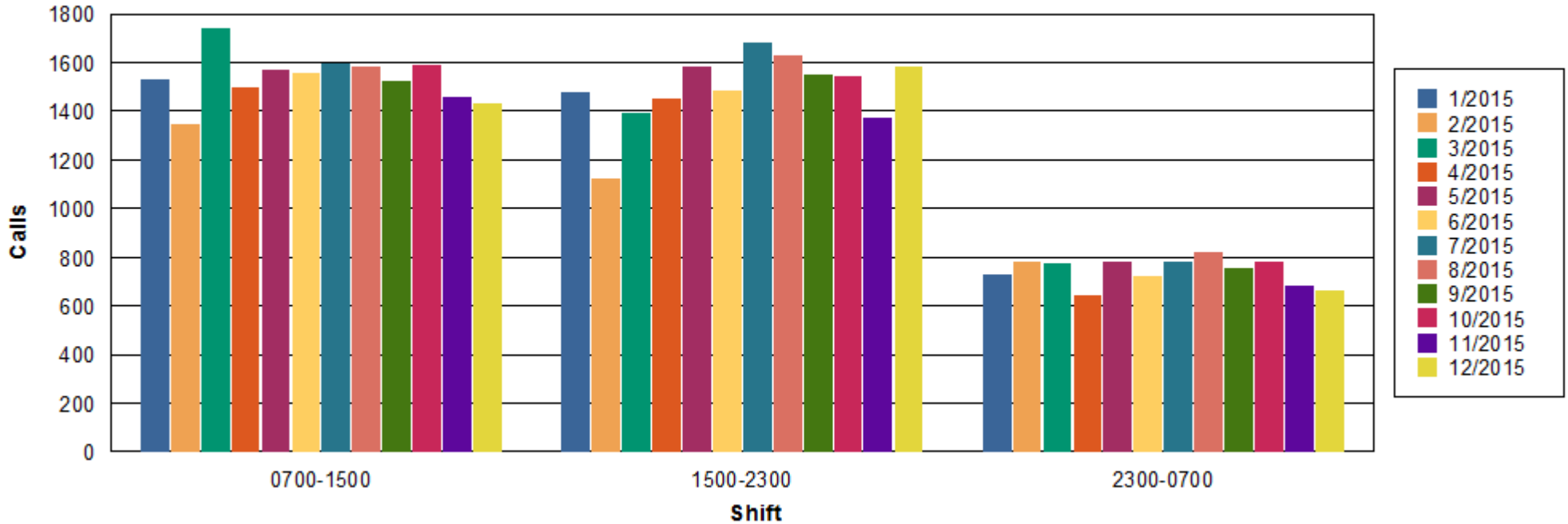

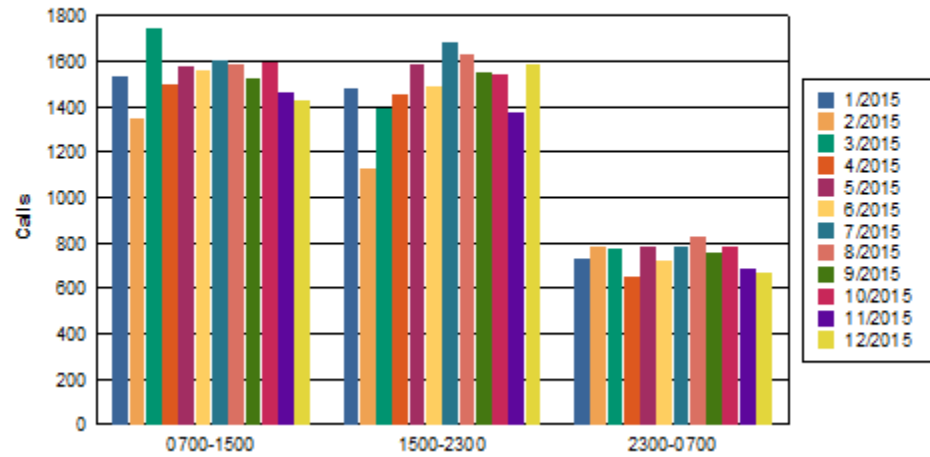

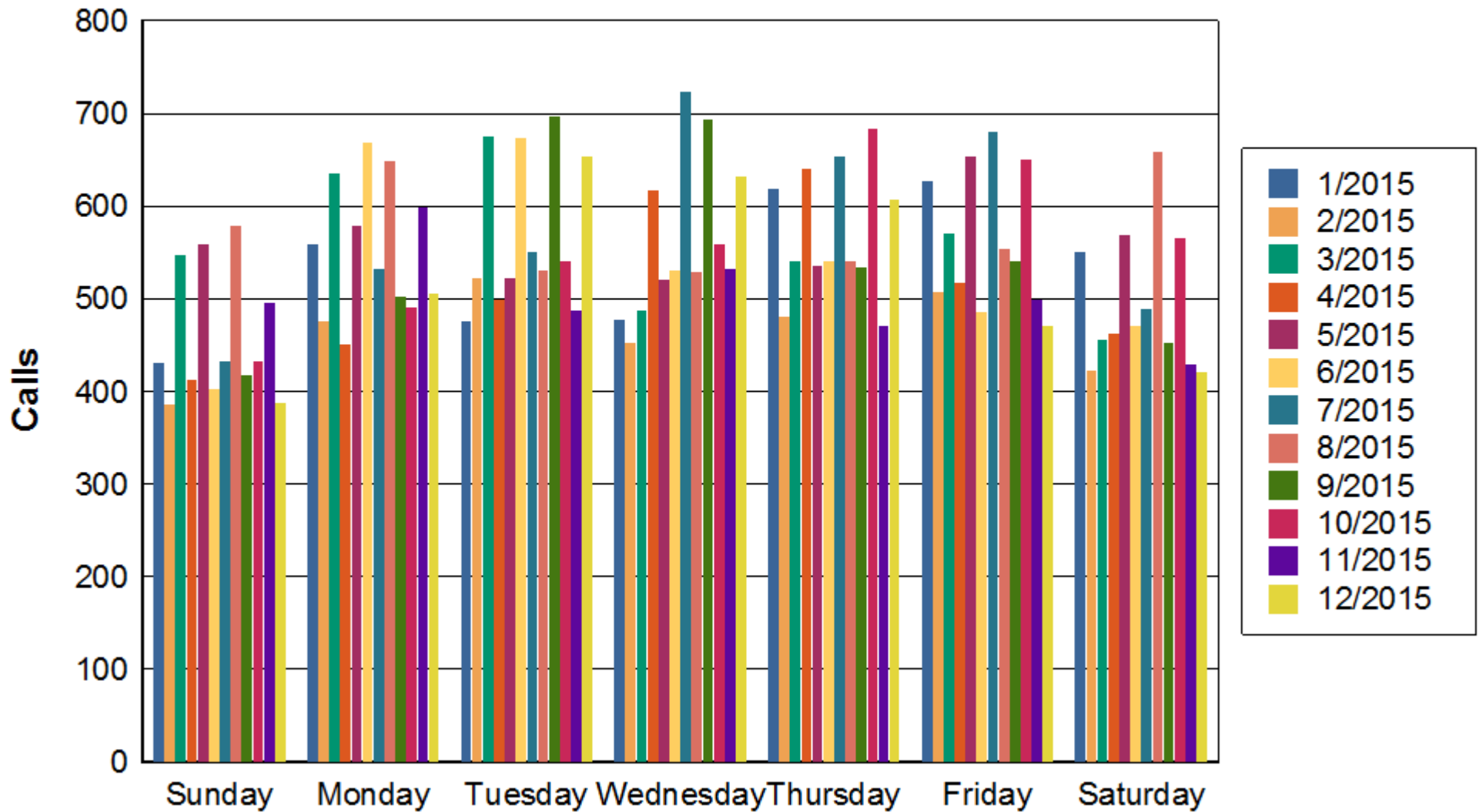

Calls Received by Month, Shift, and Day of Week

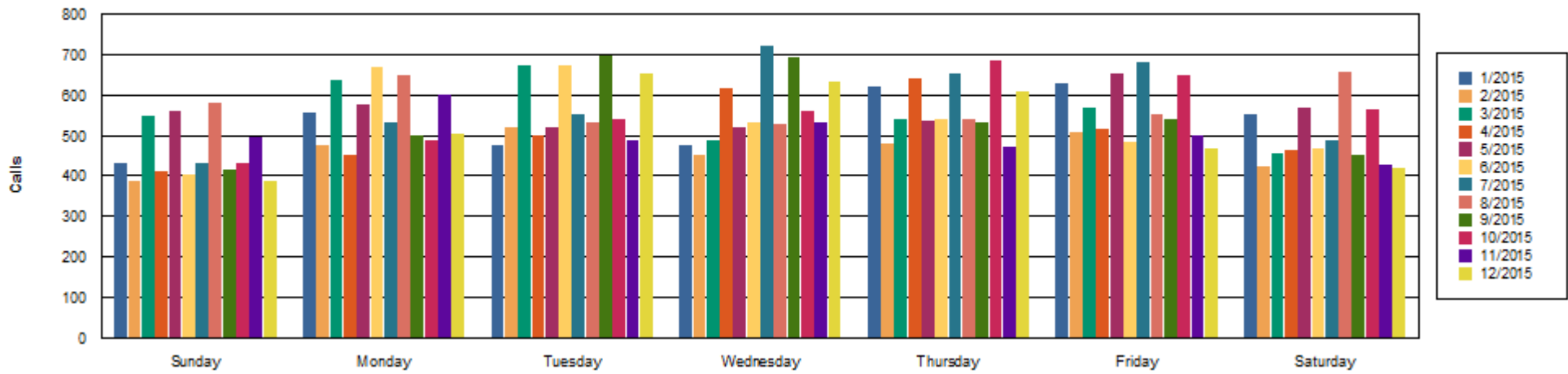

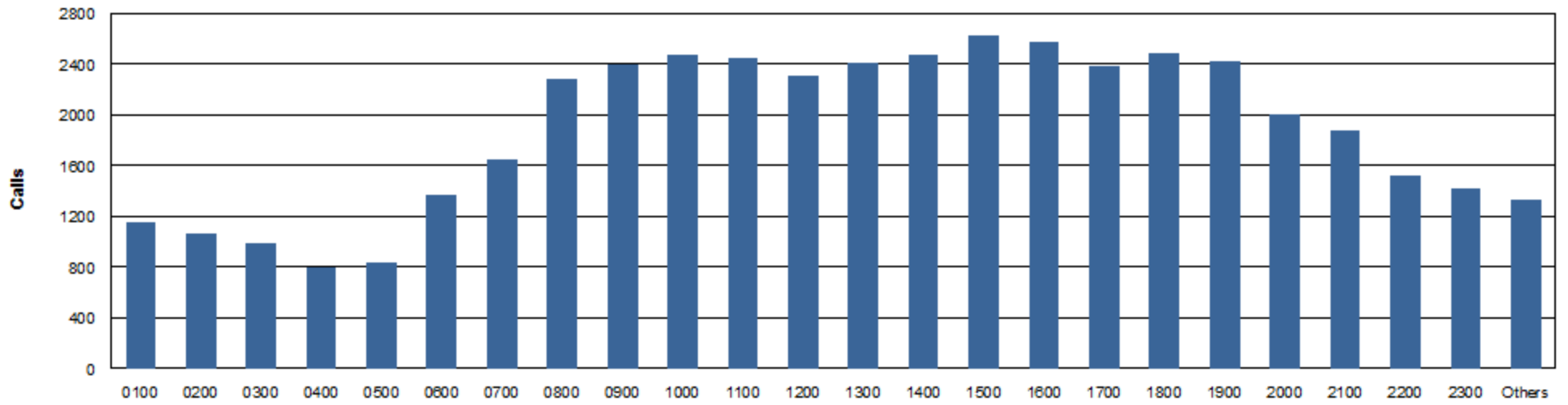
