Beachwood City Council Seeks Applicants for Vacant Seat

BEACHWOOD, Ohio –December 16, 2021– If you have lived in Beachwood for more than a year and are registered to vote, you can apply to be appointed to Beachwood City Council.

Due to the results of the November 2, 2021 General Election, Councilman Justin Berns will be sworn-in as mayor of the City of Beachwood effective January 1, 2022, thereby vacating his City Council seat.

Mayor-elect Berns's City Council term expires December 31, 2023, allowing the chosen applicant to serve for nearly two years.

Qualified residents interested in public service are encouraged to send a resume to the Clerk of Council at 25325 Fairmount Blvd., Beachwood, OH 44122 by 4:30 PM on January 14, 2022. Once the mailing deadline has passed, Council will review resumes and schedule interviews with applicants.

The Beachwood City Charter states that City Council has 45 days to fill the vacancy.
